Meetings are scheduled for the fourth Tuesday of each month or as set by the Board of Directors.

Our May quarterly appears in July because the Editor was ill; we apologize.

Our July meeting is at 7:30 pm, Tues, 23 July 1963 at Howson Branch Library, 2500 Exposition Blvd, Austin (enter south door). Until further notice, AGS will meet at Howson, which has a small parking lot on the west. Austin Public Library had need of their auditorium space for library facilities; they are growing. Board members, Mrs. Wm. T. Barron & Mrs. ^{Claude B. Tate} Roy H. Morris have asked as our speaker, the Director of the Texana Program of the University of Texas System, R. Henderson Shuffler. His topic is SOME OF THE INTERESTING VIRGINIANS WHO HELPED DEVELOP TEXAS. He appeared recently on Cactus Pryor's TV program & is reportedly blessed with the gift of brief & vivid description, to make his stories and characters very real to the audience. We hope some of you out-of-town members will be fortunate enough to be in Austin that week.

The June meeting was 25 June 1963 at Howson Branch Library. Col. Pearson introduced his invited speaker Grover Cleveland Ramsay, Texan from Missouri, who discussed "HISTORY UNLIMITED" IN GENEALOGY. He entertained a full house with tales of his sleuthing on early Texas towns & the value of historical & geographical background in tracking our people. "Memory is treacherous," he cautioned; write it down, take pictures, get reproductions of maps, documents, records and published material. Write more letters; interview more people--& make your questions brief & specific. Get exact dates & exact locations (by mileage from a known place, if possible). Learn the BCD's of genealogy--Birth, Career, Death--character & biography, not just names. Use the journalistic W's (Who, What, Why, When, Where & What Way) as a checklist on anything we write. Ramsay recently compiled a book published last year by W. M. Morrison, 2221 Parrot, Waco, Texas, THE CONFEDERATE POSTMASTERS OF TEXAS, & is presently indexing 7 volumes on Texas ghost towns. AGS fast writers took home a long, long list of material he has found in Austin record centers; there's genealogical gold we've long overlooked!

AGS met 23 May 1963 at Austin Public Library auditorium. 2d Vice-president Mrs. Roy H. Morris presided in the absence of Col. Pearson (temporarily in the hospital). Gen. Dean F. Winn & Col. Joseph R. Darnall had secured as speaker, our Texas Registrar, Mr. Donald Carroll. In discussing his topic, FRAUD ASSOCIATED WITH VITAL RECORDS, Mr. Carroll listed 16 types of fraud, including amendment, adding names, changing sex, fraudulent proof of parenthood, fraudulent baptismal, birth, marriage & death records, counterfeit certified copies & forged entries. Pressure & attempted bribery is so common that repeated checks of employees in records sections are made. Foreigners seek to prove fake citizenship for personal gain or protection or in service of a foreign power (as just reported from Washington this month). It appears we genealogists need to be careful not to seem guilty of fraud. We appreciate Mr. Carroll's telling us the situation, & it should serve as a challenge to us that Texas has no central depository for vital records. We feel that copies of original records, filed in libraries or Texas Archives for reference use, would be a protection to the originals.

8 May 1963, Col. Ralph E. Pearson's genealogy column "Your Family & Mine," began in Austin STATESMAN & is printed most Wed. afternoon's under the auspices of Frankie Peterson. Col. Societies & individuals can send free queries, information, remarks or news of genealogical & historical activities. Material in letters not desired in print should be marked "Not for Publication". Don't forget to write & support this column.

Mr & Mrs John K. Donnan have given Texas State Library 1962 issues of ANCESTRAL NOTES and MISSING LINKS; 1962 OHIO - RECORDS & PIONEER FAMILIES; Vol VII, ENCYCLOPEDIA OF AMERICAN QUAKER GENEALOGY, Abstracts of the Records of the Society of Friends in Indiana, Part I; a book on FULTON-HAYDEN & WARNER ANCESTRY IN AMERICA; and apparently other items. (We welcome notice of any gifts).

Some gifts of Mrs. E. H. Pettibon to TSL are the Genealogy Room bulletin board & material & books such as THE DEMAREST FAMILY; THE BROWN'S OF BROWN'S COVE, ALBEMARLE CO, VA; THE DABNEY'S (D'AUBIGNE) OF VA; THE HARRIS FAMILY; COURT OF EQUITY RECORDS OF BARNWELL DISTRICT, SC; The Reed Family in Central Texas (with chart); VA. REVOLUTIONARY LAND BOUNTY WARRANTS; Louisiana & Ky. census films: Grayson-Hopkins Co, Ky; HISTORY & GENEALOGY OF THE JOHNSON FAMILY FROM CHARLEMAGNE; etc. Mrs. Pettibon has a genealogy room at her home, also.

Mrs. David Jones Pickle has also donated extremely valuable genealogical material. Most material donated through AGS goes into the genealogy room of TSL; otherwise it might appear elsewhere later. Mrs. Raymond Ulmer of Houston Public Library writes that a complete file of the Houston genealogical society quarterlies has been sent to TSL & Archives. AGS had not been receiving them. However, the list of our Exchanges placed at TSL is so long we hope to mimeograph copies for distribution. All except the few newest have been indexed for source material & placed in the TSL genealogy room by AGS Librarian, Mrs. R. P. Woods. Miss Maria Elisa Garcia, Loan & General Reference Librarian at TSL, showed us a notebook listing genealogical references at TSL by states or surnames--this useful tool should be consulted by all searchers (so much material is not on open shelf). Naturally, microfilm & documentary material goes to Texas State Archives for use & protection; and we hope to give Archives AGS quarterlies for Mrs Fischer Osburn to compile into separate booklets of Travis Co. marriages, Travis Co. will abstracts, etc. By the end of this year, we should have a list of materials AGS has bought with our matching fund & donated to TSL, Archives, etc.

RELATIVES OF GEORGE ROGERS CLARK

The ROGERS chart of Col. Joseph R. Darnall & Mrs. John C. Johnson is printed to clarify listings of Apr, 1962-63. This family descends from Rev. John ROGERS (1st martyr burned, 1555, England) & includes George Rogers CLARK of Kaskaskia (b 19 Nov 1752 Albe. Co, Va; d 13 Feb 1818 near Louisville, Ky) & his youngest brother Lt. Wm. CLARK of the Lewis & Clark Expedition (b 1770 Caroline Co, Va; d 1838, superintendent of Indian affairs at St Louis, Mo), both sons of John CLARK & his 1st cousin Ann ROGERS (b 1724), dau. of John ROGERS (b 1680 Va) & wife Rachel EASTHAM, of King & Queen Co, Va. Capt. Meriwether LEWIS (1774-1809), friend & army comrade of Lt. Wm. ROGERS before they led the Expedition, was a grandson of Robt. LEWIS of Belvoir & son of Wm. LEWIS (d 1780) & Lucy MERIWETHER. Wm. CLARK's uncle Giles ROGERS (b 1719) reportedly m. Sarah Iverson LEWIS. How was Meriwether LEWIS a cousin to the CLARK brothers as some records say?
