President's Message

When do we finish a genealogy?

I began considering this after bumping into a friend who glowingly announced that she had finished her genealogy. She certainly must have a very different conception of a genealogy than I have. Or, else she had a far different goal.

I believe that to complete my genealogy I must trace every line back to its beginning. Each generation back I pick up the colateral lines. Thus for each generation back I have doubled my number of lines. After some study I found that many genealogists estimate that there are twenty-five to thirty years to a generation - this varies greatly in some of my lines. Now to have something definite to work with I decided to use thirty years to a generation so as to arrive at some idea of the work I might get involved in.

By reviewing twenty of my American lines I found that each immigrant ancestor arrived here between 1611 and 1670. Just to get a round number I decided to use 1650 or about three hundred years in America. This figured ten generations which would give me five hundred twelve ancestors to trace to. That father, his wife, their daughter and her husband who as "ancient planters" arrived prior to 1616 figured thirteen and fourteen generations but another line is only nine generations. Thus I can never expect to complete that many. To make a long story short I decided to quit figuring and just keep working.

A TEXAN by ADOPTION - and a VERY BUSY MAN

George W. Glasscock arrived at Zavala in the municipality of Jasper during September 1835. He fought at the <u>Siege of Bexar</u> in December 1835. For this service he received a "Donation" grant of 640 acres for "having entered Bexar December 5, 1835." He, also, received another or "Bounty" grant of 320 acres for "military service rendered Texas November 16, 1835 to January 3, 1836."

News from Bastrop and from the San Gabriels in 1838

The following letter was written at Bastrop, Texas June 30, 1838, by George Washington Glasscock to his brother Joseph Milligan Glasscock at Zavala, Jasper County Texas. This "Zavala" is not the "Zavalla" in Angelina County but was the original Zavala on the east side of the Angelina River. Address on the letter shows it was carried from Bastrop to Zavala by Mr. Baird.

Bastrop 30 June 1838

Dear brother

I send you a few lines to inform you that the Indians has not killed me yet I Just Returned from the woods a trip of four weeks I was very mutch pleased with my trip I was on the head of the sant gabrels up about the head of it at the foot of the mountains there is the finest waterd part of Texas that I have seen fine springs Limestone water and rock and soil as good as any in Texas and tolerable timber I have 4 Leagues on that stream I am holding a peace for your headwrigh by a third of my own till the 6 months is out it is asplendid piece of land as I ever saw if I can succeed in getting it for you it is worth 5 Dollars pr acre to you I have maid arrangement for you for a hous to keep Tavern in here board is \$30 pr month here now \$3 pr day for man & hors I have bot 3 lots here property is very high and rising there was some small lots on main street sold for 10\$ pr foot mine are back lot one lot to live on my self 3 acres other smaller I shall live in this place till the Sant Gabrels is settled then I shall go out there tell Sanders that this is the place for him he can get 4 dollars for shoeing a hors tell Jack he can get 6 dollars pr day to hall with his teem here this place is improveing very fast business is brisk of all kinds money is tolerable plenty Star mony is plenty I think I shall be home about the Last of July if I have no bad luck if Britton had of come on as expected I should of been reddy to of went home with Baird my Respect to all Your Brother till death

GW Glasscock

Mr. J. M. Glasscock Zavala Jasper Co Texas By Mr. Baird

According to the above letter plans were for Joseph M. Glasscock to move to Bastrop and operate a tavern. Apparently Joseph never got

to Bastrop as he died July 22, 1839 in Liberty County, now a part of Polk County. However, his brother George did move to Bastrop in 1840.

George moved to a tract of land 1 1/2 miles west of Webberville, Travis County, in 1844; he moved to Williamson County in 1848 where he donated 172 acres of land for the site of Georgetown; he moved to Austin in 1853 where he lived at 1400 West Avenue until his death Feb. 28, 1868. George died as a result of injuries received when he was thrown from his riding mule at his farm near Webberville. His wife Cynthia had died at Austin November 7, 1866.

George W. Glasscock was a very active man in the 32 years he lived in Texas. He was interested in many enterprises and owned much property. He located and surveyed a great deal of land. Travis County 1860 census shows Glasscock owning 5 slaves and \$150,000 in real property.

Among many business activities Glasscock was president of Air-line Railroad Company. Travis County 1860 census shows George W. Glasscock as a contractor and as an operator of a flour mill, a grist mill and a saw mill, and as a farmer.

George W. Glasscock was a County Commissioner in Williamson County at one time. He represented Travis and Williamson Counties in the 10th and 11th State Legislatures. He was a Mason, being a member of Austin Lodge No. 12. The Lodge published a memorial at his death. He was a very early member of the First Baptist Church at Austin. In 1858 he bought a \$500.00 bell for the church which is still in use. In 1887 Glasscock County was created and named in his honor.
