TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS, SCHOOL CENSUS OF 1854

Efforts were made in Texas during the Colonial period and the Republic period for the establishment of free or common schools. One of the grievances listed by the Texans in their Declaration of Independence was that Mexico had "failed to establish any public system of education." The Constitution of the Republic made it the duty of Congress to provide such a system. Some little progress was made, but not of a substantial nature. There were a number of private schools but the actual foundation for the present Texas school system was not laid until 1854.

During the administration of Governor E. M. Pease the first state school law was passed and approved by the Legislature on January 31, 1854. This law titled "An Act to Establish a System of Common Schools" set up a school fund and created the machinery for setting up a system of "common schools." Two million dollars was set aside as a "Special School Fund." The interest on this fund was to be distributed to the counties each year according to the scholastic population between the ages of six and sixteen years. The Treasurer of the State was made ex-officio Superintendent of Common Schools in the State. The Chief Justice and the County Commissioners were appointed a board of school Commissioners for each county. Their duty was to divide the County into school districts and arrange for an election of three school trustees in each district. The trustees were to arrange for an election to determine the location of the school house.

Section 5 of the new law of 1854 provided that it should be the duty of the Assessor and Collector of each county during the year eighteen hundred and fifty-four, and every year thereafter, to make out a list of all the free white population in his county between the ages of six and sixteen years, particularly designating the number of persons between such ages in each school district and transmit the same ... to the County Clerk and a certified copy thereof to the Treasurer of the State

In compliance with the requirements of the law, a Special Term of the County Court for Travis County was held May 1, 1854, with the following members present: John B. Costa, Chief Justice, Thomas F. McKinney, Nelson Merrell and S. W. Swenson, Commissioners and Ashford B. McGill, Clerk of said Court, for the purpose of forming said County into School districts. They divided Travis County into nineteen districts and set forth the boundaries.

A Certificate by Thomas Glascock, Assessor and Collector of Travis County accompanies the school census.

The value of this census and the school district boundaries is self-evident. Frequently a Federal census shows only initials for parents and children. Some of these families may have moved into Travis County after the 1850 census and left before the 1860 census. Some of these children, as well as their parents, may have died or married before 1860. Establishing these families in a certain school district enables one to locate the area of Travis County in which they resided.

It is possible that some families with children ages 6 and 16 were missed or perhaps did not want to be enumerated. Nevertheless this first known extant school census of 1854 is of inestimable value.

The census was arranged in columns headed by "Names of Parent," "Names of Children," "Males," "Females," and "Total." Due to lack of space herewith, only the names of parent and children will be given. In a few cases only the parent's name

is shown with the number of children belonging to that family and the total. The district boundaries will precede each census for that district.

First Texas School Built With Public Funds compiled by Mrs. Donna McBride

The first school in Texas to be built entirely with public funds was located in Austin, where Pease School now stands. It was called the Austin Graded School and opened on October 2, 1876¹, with about 500 pupils.²

There was a delightful description of the building in the Weekly Statesman, dated October 12, 1876. It is too lengthy to reprint here but a few samples show how grand this school was. "The building is admirably constructed...sixty feet front with a depth of eighty-six feet..." It was well ventilated, with a "large and airy hall." "Two tasteful flights of stairs ascend to the second story..." The rooms were "of uniform size, twenty by thirty-six feet. These figures show that space and comfort have been taken properly into consideration."

The first Board of Directors were C. R. Johns, pres.; Walter Tips, vice pres.; D. W. C. Baker, sec.; S. G. Sneed, treas.; Jos. Harrell, N. G. Shelley, T. D. Wooten, B. Melasky, E. Christian, C. S. West, J. H. Robinson, Sr., and R. H. Lowry.

D. W. C. Baker was elected the first superintendent. The teachers were as follows: first grade, Miss Clara Burnham & Mrs. Georgia Donnan; second grade, Mrs. M. F. Smith & Mrs. Anna M. Stewart; third grade, Miss Fannie Campbell & Miss Gertrude Bacon; fourth grade, Mr. W. H. Russell & Mr. R. W. Lowry. Additional lectures were to be given by Gen. N. G. Shelley, Prof. A. Goldmann, Dr. J. W. McLaughlin, and Prof. S. G. Sneed.¹

Boys and girls were instructed separately and one teacher taught all subjects to one grade. "It is acknowledged, however, that a wholesome admixture of the sexes conduces good manners and neatness, and they will be occasionally brought together at recitations and lectures with this object in view."¹

The school building burned in May of 1896. It was rebuilt, using whatever remained of the previous structure, two rooms were added, and the name was changed to the West Austin School. When Austin schools were being named for prominent people in 1902, the school was renamed Pease School, in honor of Gov. E. M. Pease.²
