ORIGINAL MARRIAGE LICENSES, 1840-1850.

Travis County Clerk's Office Austin, Texas

The following marriage licenses, copied in June of 1970, are still in the files of the Travis County Clerk's Office in Austin, Texas. If proper and substantial proof of kinship is shown, the Travis County Clerk will relinquish the license. It is possible that there are no descendants for some of these people.

Travis County was formed in 1840 from Bastrop County. It then encompassed territory which later was used to form part or all of Burnet (1852), Blanco (1858), Brown (1856), Callahan (1858), Coleman (1858), Comal (1846), Eastland (1858), Gillespie (1848), Hays (1894), Lampasas (1856), Mills (1858), Runnels (1858), and Taylor (1858) Counties.

Many of these licensees took a prominent part in the history of Texas and Travis County. A few were: Abner H. Cook, who helped design and build the Governor's mansion and other beautiful homes in Austin; Samuel G. Haynie, physician, Congressman in the Republic, postmaster and mayor of Austin; Joseph W. Robertson, a Texas Ranger in 1838, member of Fourth Congress, physician, surgeon in Texas Army, mayor of Austin in 1843 and 1844, bought old French Embassy about 1850 which was later called Robertson Hill; Thomas William Ward, member New Orleans Greys in siege of Bexar, postmaster of the Republic, 2nd Commissioner of the General Land Office, involved in the Archives War, mayor of Austin, etc.; Joel Miner, in Texas Army 1837, publisher of "New Era", probate Judge of Travis County, County Clerk,

Corn. - We have seen a roasting ear grown on the grounds of the Lunatic Asylum, which is just about as large as the article ever grown. It measures 9 inches in circumference and is 10 inches long, and well filled with grains. Dr. Graham, the Superintendent, informs us that he has 18 acres of corn, of which the above ear is a fair specimen.

Implicated - We understand that several parties, whites and blacks, have been arrested as being implicated in the plundering which took place during the fire on Monday night last. We are unable to get particulars, but understand some of the plunder was found in the possession of some of these individuals, and when arrested, others were implicated by them which led to their arrest also.

Recreation - We understand that Mr. Cawlfield has fitted up the favorite resort of many of the old settlers of Austin, known as Barton Spring, some 4 miles west of the city, providing bath houses, improving the roads leading to the spring, etc. No better recreation can be sought from the cares of business than an evening visit to this resort. Persons who have never visited the spring will be forcibly impressed by the ragged and rugged wildness of the scenery. The water is the coldest we have ever tasted or felt in Texas. An evening trip there will give a pleasant recreation, and a bath - oh, how invigorating!

For the benefit of strangers we will say that the spring is on the opposite side of the River from Austin and due west of the city. There is good food nearly opposite the spring. We hear that Mr. Cawlfield has made a good road for buggies and carriages from the river to the spring.

default of bail required in the sum of two thousand dollars. The 2 negroes who were arrested at the same time have been discharged. Two negroes and one white man were arrested on Sunday as being implicated in the late thieving that has been going on in the city. The white man has been released - the negroes have not yet been tried. No goods have been found which have been identified as those taken at the fire on Monday night of last week. Those that have been found belong to Messrs. Booth & Co., Mr. Brush, and Messrs. Blum & Walker. There are several articles yet on hand at the Mayor's Office, among them a very nice & tasty lady's bonnet of the postage stamp order. Mayor Brown has had a sort of detective service ever since the robbing of Booth & Co's. Auction room, about the last of May. It is still in operation, and, we are informed, will be kept up until this petty thieving and house breaking, with which our citizens have lately been annoyed, is sifted thoroughly.

PUBLIC MEETING

At a meeting of the citizens of Austin, in relation to the purchase of a fire engine, etc.

G.W. Sampson was called to the chair, and D.W.C. Baker was appointed secretary. The mayor of the city read the following action of the City Council:

Resolved, that His Honor, the Mayor, be authorized and requested to attend the meeting of citizens, called to meet on Monday, 15th inst., and to state to the said meeting, that, if the citizens of Austin will purchase for the city a fire engine, hose, etc., the City Council will provide for the immediate construction of 1 or 2 water tanks in the city, at such points as the City Council may think proper; and also for the erection of a suitable house for the said engine, when it shall be received; and that the amounts subscribed for this purpose by the citizens shall be due them from the city, and returned to them as a credit on the total amount of their taxes, at the rate of 20 per cent per annum of their taxes.

The following resolutions were then offered and unanimously adopted:

1. Resolved, That a committee of three be appointed by the Chairman of this meeting whose duty it shall be to solicit and receive loans from the citizens of Austin for the purpose, & on the terms, proposed in the resolution of the City Council; and to pay over all the money thus collected to the Treasurer of the City of Austin, taking his receipt therefor.

2. Resolved, That when a sufficient amount shall be guaranteed or raised, the Mayor of the city be requested to order through some responsible firm, or person, a fire engine, with the necessary appurtenances; the same to be procured and delivered in Austin with all possible dispatch; and to draw upon the fund, in the Treasurer's hands, raised by the committee in accordance with the first resolution, for the payment of the same.

D.W.C. Baker, E. Saunders, and Eugene Bremond were appointed a committee in accordance with the first resolution. On motion the Chairman of the meeting was added.

Alfred Smith stated that he would furnish to the city, rent free, a lot sufficiently large upon which to build an engine house.

On request the city papers were requested to publish the proceedings of this meeting. $\hbox{G.W. Sampson, Chairman}$

In view of the fact that our city is unable to pay a sufficient city police, and the recent robberies and fire prove that there is a regular band of thieves and house breakers in our midst, and to guard against a recurrence of the recent evils, we suggest that the Mayor of the city call upon the young men of the town

to organize themselves into a "Volunteer City Police". We know there is generosity and interest felt in the welfare of the town by these young men and that a company of 60 or 75 could be readily formed, allowing say ten to serve one night in each week; the duty would be light, and acting under the order and authority of the city officers, property would be rendered more secure. The Mayor could appoint, say seven of the members as Chiefs, one for each night in the week, to take charge of the nightly divisions of the Police, and receive instructions from the Mayor and make reports, etc.

Call the attention of the city fathers to this, and see what can be done.

This Cemetery has an unique history inasmuch as the land was purchased to create a Cemetery to take care of the re-burials resulting from the building of the chain of Lakes know as the "Highland Lakes" which were created to give flood control and electricity to this part of Texas. After such re-burials were made, the Cemetery land was donated to the community. Hence, many burials have been made and will continue into the future.

This Cemetery is located west of Austin, one mile past the intersection of highways 620 and 71 and in the community of Bee Caves.

There are a total of 101 unidentified graves in the Cemetery as of this date, counting the ones with the wooden, rock or unreadable tombstones or showing evidence of burials but lacking any kind of marker. In checking with local citizens we found that they had no idea who was buried next to their kin if there were not markers identifying graves. As far as they knew, there was no Plat available showing names of the ones buried with unmarked graves.
