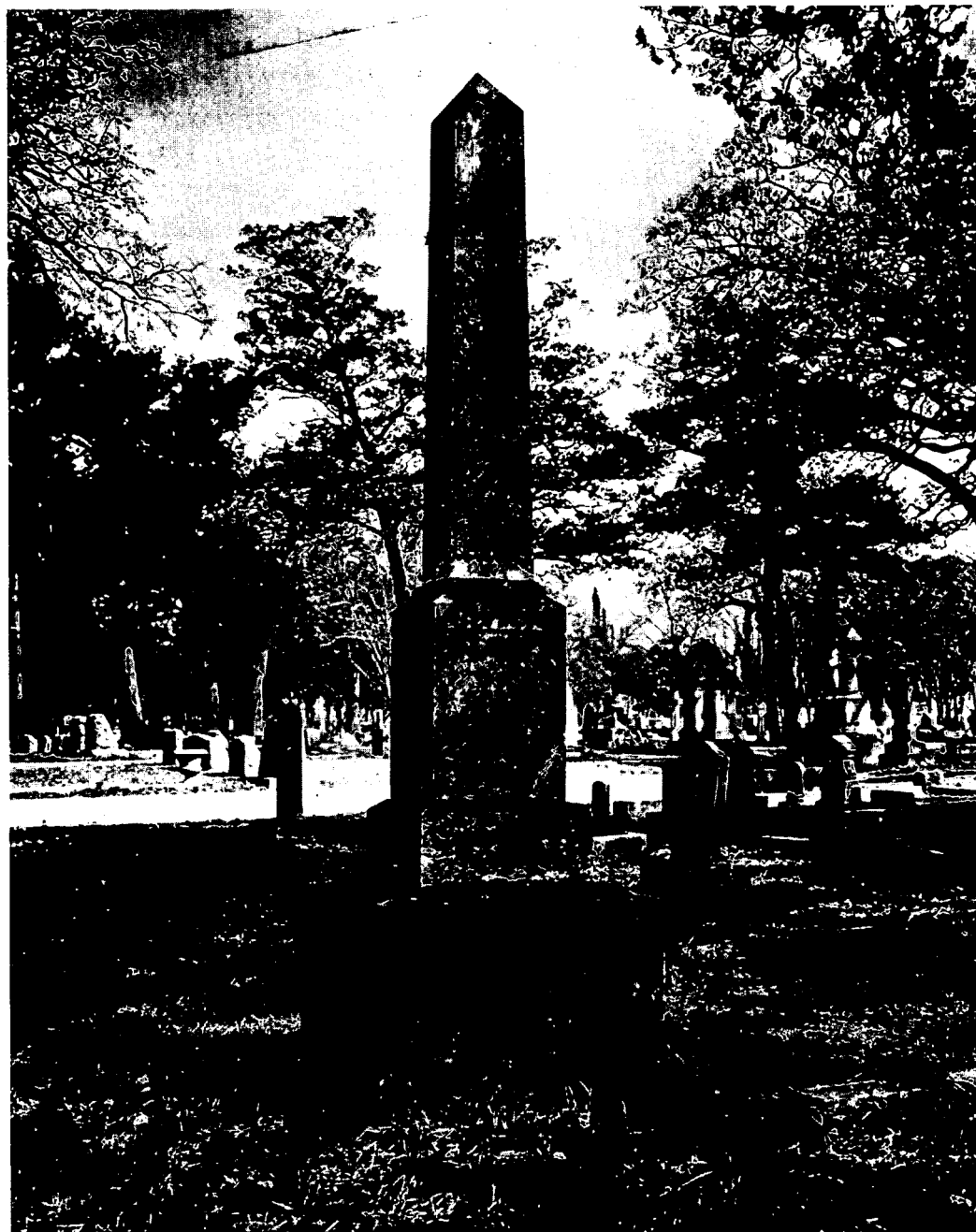

AUSTIN CEMETERY RECORD  
Mr. A. Eanes, Austin, Texas

The above title is written on the front and back of an apparently homemade book, measuring 12 by 7½ inches. The pages are of a heavy gray paper which have survived the 111 years of existence in excellent condition. This record is in the Austin-Travis County Collection at the Austin City Library, Austin, Texas.

The entries begin with October 3, 1859 and continue until May 7, 1866. There is one period when the entries were made by the Undertakers Hopkins and Millican instead of by Eanes. This record embraces the period of the Civil War, and includes some prominent officers and men of that period who were buried here.

Many of Eanes entries are not found in the current Oakwood Cemetery files, although some of the graves have been located. At times Eanes seems to give the death date and at other times, the burial date.

Frank Brown in his "Annals of Travis County" had the following notation: "On this the 16th day of March, 1874 (4 o'clock P. M.) I hereby turn over and deliver into the hands of the Mayor of the City of Austin (Mayor T. B. Wheeler) and council of said city the books containing the account of interments in the cemetery of said city from the time I received the appointment of sexton by Dr. S. G. Haynie, then mayor of the city, up to the present date. And on resigning my place, I would express the hope that I have given general satisfaction while I have held the responsible position of sexton of the City of Austin, Very respectfully,

Alexander Eanes, City Sexton

To Hon. T. B. Wheeler, Mayor and Cemetery Committee"

Evidently there were other books in which Mr. Eanes kept the records. His spelling of names is not always consistent or correct, but is rather interesting. Also his use of terms of possession are sometimes puzzling, but can usually be interpreted.

Major Alexander Eanes and his wife are buried in the southwest section of the old Oakwood Cemetery in Section 1, Lot 358. A modest shaft monument marks their graves with the inscriptions:
