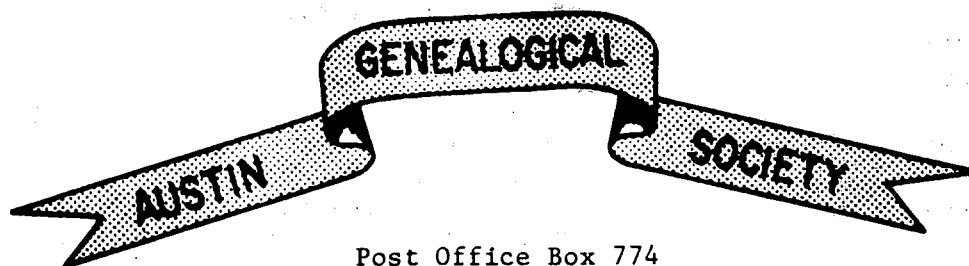

REPUBLIC OF TEXAS TRAVIS COUNTY DEED BOOK A

Maps showing "Government Tract" adjoining City of Austin (known as "outlots") and the original City of Austin can be obtained from the General Land Office, Records Division, for \$3 each. They give Division and Outlot number on the Government Tract, and in City of Austin the number of the lot and names of original owners in many cases. Maps of Travis County outlining the leagues are available at same place and price. These interesting maps are helpful for locating the tracts mentioned in the following instruments.

pp. 35-37--Mortgage--Filed 27 Apr 1840. David G. Terms of payment: 10 % interest--no payments made--\$2,062.50 interest accrued. Indenture made 20 Apr 1840 to Jacob Burnett for parcel of land on San Bernard R., part of Imla Keep headright conveyed to David G. Burnett. Also 1500 a. land on San Antonio road 8 miles west of Bastrop, conveyed to said Burnett by Dr. X X Birdsall. Also one league & one labor unlocated headright of David G. Burnett.

Also $\frac{1}{2}$ league land on Brushy Cr. conveyed by Niles F. Smith to Mrs. Hannah Burnett, wife of David G. Burnett. p. 43--Agreement between Robert G. Green of Bastrop and Francis W. White of City of Austin: Whereas, William E. Dundas & said White agreed--all benefits of property & land etc. coming to them for their service in the Army of the Republic of Texas, of the other of them who should first die; and said Dundas having died, White is entitled to 1/3 league land & 1280 a. & various emoluments --land aforesaid was surveyed for said Dundas in San Patricio Co. NOTE: The following agreement pertaining to the building of a house for Mirabeau Buonaparte Lamar (second president of the Republic of Texas and instigator of the location of the capitol at Austin) seems interesting enough to publish in full.

Articles of agreement made and entered into
this fourth day of May in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty

between John R. Slocomb of the one part and Mirabeau B. Lamar of the other part, both of the Republic and County aforesaid, Witnesseth: That the said John R. Slocomb for and in consideration of the matters and things hereinafter set forth, hath agreed to furnish all the materials of every description necessary for the purpose, and to build and erect for the said Mirabeau B. Lamar the following buildings and other improvements upon such part of the lots lately purchased by said Lamar at the sale of outlots of the City of Austin as he the said Lamar may designate and point out: that is to say: he the said John R. Slocomb agrees to erect and complete a framed dwelling on said lots for said Lamar to be of one story: thirty two feel long and 36 feet wide and ten feet high between the floors and ceilings of the rooms; the whole to be under one roof, well covered with good pine or cypress shingles; and the body and gable ends to be enclosed with good planed and jointed weather boarding of the ordinary with /sic/. The said building to be divided into four rooms: two in front and two in the rear with an entry or passage between the rooms in the rear, to be six feet wide; and one of the front rooms to be eighteen feet wide and nineteen feet long; and the other to be 18 ft. wide & 13 ft. long and each of the back rooms to be 13 ft. long and 12 ft. wide. All the rooms and the entry to be well lathed and plastered with a sufficient quantity of hair in the plaster, well mixed. There are to be two sets of folding doors, opening into the large room, five feet wide: one from the front of the building, the other from the entry in the rear; and one folding door opening eight feet wide in the partition between the front rooms; the folding doors to be eight feet high. Also two doors opening from the entry into the rooms in the rear: that is one door to each, of the ordinary width and height: all of the doors to be pannelled. There are to be two windows in the front of the building, one in each room and one in the end of the large room on the side of the chimney. Also, one window in each of the back rooms; the windows in the front rooms to be well glazed and of good glass; and to be one light larger than those in the lower story of the President's house now occupied by said Lamar containing 24 lights 10 x 12; the back room windows also to be well glazed and of good glass and to contain fifteen lights 10 x 12. All the floors in said building to be laid with plank one and a quarter inches thick and of the ordinary flooring width, and to be well planed and tongued and grooved.

There are to be two good chimneys of brick or stone, one at each end of said building and affording fire places to the front rooms. The chimney of the largest room to be six feet wide and the other five feet wide, and a neat mantel piece to be placed over each fireplace. The rooms to have washboards and chairboards and the house to be painted inside and out, except the roof. The body on the outside to be painted white and a sett of steps at each of the outer doors.

The said John R. Slocomb agrees to build for said Lamar a framed kitchen to be 18 feet long, 16 ft. wide & 8 ft. high between joists in the body--To have a shingle roof and weatherboarded with unplanned boards, the floor laid rough with square joints, and door in front with battened shutters, planed, and window in the back, without sash but with a planed batten shutter; and to have a large deep stone chimney with a large fireplace.

The said John R. Slocomb also agrees to build for said Lamar a framed smokehouse to be ten feet wide, twelve feet long and twelve feet high exclusive of the roof: to be shingled and weatherboarded rough: one door with planed batten shutter and no floor. The said Slocomb also agrees to enclose for the said Lamar five acres of ground in a square form around said building: the enclosure to be made of good cedar posts (to be planted not less than twenty inches in the ground), cedar rails and rived pailings, with two gates--the whole to be five feet high. The said Slocomb hereby binds himself to furnish all the materials necessary for the erection and completion of the above mentioned buildings and improvements; the same to be of good and sound quality and to do all of said work in a substantial and workmanlike manner; and to have the whole completed and ready for delivery to said Lamar at the expiration of three months from the 1st of May; and if the said

Slocomb shall fail to comply with said work by the expiration of said three months he hereby agrees to forfeit to said Lamar \$25 for each and every day that he shall be kept out of the use of said buildings from and after the expiration of said three months.

And the said Mirabeau B. Lamar on his part agrees and binds himself to convey and deliver to the said John R. Slocomb as soon as the said work shall be completed and delivered up to him as aforesaid one mulatto negro woman named Caroline now in the City of Austin and the property of said Lamar; and to make and execute to said John R. Slocomb a good and bona fide warranty title to said Negro; and the said Lamar further binds himself when said work shall have been completed and delivered as aforesaid to execute to said John R. Slocomb his bond for title to lots No. 5 & 6 in square No. 159 in the City of Austin, unencumbered, the said titles to be made and executed to said John R. Slocomb or his assigns, on or before the 10th day of January 1841.

It is further agreed and understood by the parties aforesaid that the said Lamar shall be at liberty to pay the said Slocomb twelve hundred dollars in good and lawful money instead of conveying to him the said negro woman Caroline: provided he should elect to do so: and in the event of his making said payment the said negro is to remain the property of said Lamar as fully as though he had not hereby engaged to convey and sell her to the said John R. Slocomb.

WHITE VOTERS LISTED ON 1867 REGISTRY OF TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS

Copied from records at Texas State Archives by Mrs. Clarence W. Balch

Qualified voters registering at this time included the newly franchised slaves, fortune seekers and adventurers of the North, and the Unionists of Texas.

Defranchised under the Reconstruction regime by the institution of the "ironclad oath" was practically all the citizenry who had previously controlled state policies before and during the war.

The list at the State Archives, from which these names were taken, is not the original county list but a copy prepared by the Office of Civilian Affairs, Headquarters Fifth Military District, Austin, certified April 16, 1870. There is also the 1869 voters list.

Since our list was prepared for genealogical purposes, names of colored voters were omitted. However, because of the method used by the copy clerk to designate the race of the voters, it is probable some of the white voters are listed as colored. The total vote, broken down to whites and coloreds, which is noted by the copy clerk at the end of the list at the Archives, cannot be reconciled to a separate audit of each race as listed.

The list at the Archives includes for each voter a column designated "name" and another designated "signature". When the voter's name in these two columns varied only in completeness, as for instance, Alfred Major and A.M. Major, the complete name is simply shown in this list in the "Name" column as Alfred M. Major. Where there were more important differences, such as in the spelling, it has been indicated.

Since the county residence is so often shown as "twelve months" the inference is that it means twelve months or more.
