TUCKER & LLOYD'S LISTS OF 1812 AND 1836
VETERANS FROM ALABAMA AND GEORGIA

Found in the General Land Office of Texas are both manuscript and printed lists of men from Alabama and Georgia who had served in the War of 1812 or the Texas Revolution of 1836. The lists were made by "Tucker and Lloyd of Washington City, D.C.," apparently a firm which offered to obtain land grants for the families of veterans who had seen service in one of those wars.

The manuscript list bears (in the filing area) the notation: "Originals sent to H.B. Granberry." Hiram Bronson Granberry in 1861 was captain of Company A in the 7th Regiment of Texas Infantry in the Confederate Army, and rose rapidly to the rank of brigadier general. He was killed at Franklin TN on 30 Nov 1864 and was buried in Hood Co, TX, at the town of Granbury which was named for him. This MS. list is divided into an Alabama List, a Georgia List, an 1812 List, and "Additional," which format is followed below. There are slight variations in spelling on the two lists.

The printed list shows the names which are classified as "Additional" as soldiers of the Regular Army in the War of 1812. The introductory paragraph reads:

"The heirs or legal representatives of the following named soldiers of the Texas Revolution of 1836, who are supposed to reside in the State of Alabama, the soldiers named having entered the service from that State, are requested to inform us of their post office address, and information respecting Land Claims will be given them. Others having a knowledge of their places of residence are solicited to inform us."

At the bottom of the sheet, a "fist" points to: "Please post this in your place of business," so it seems to have been a poster.

Another sheet, in a less legible hand, seems to explain why the Shackelfords were not included in the handwritten list. Dr. John Shackelford raised and personally financed a company of volunteers for the Texas Army at the outbreak of the Texas Revolution. Their name, Red Rovers, was derived from the fact that their uniforms were made of red jean cloth.

Captain Shackelford's oldest son, Fortunatus, and two nephews were in the company, most of whom were massacred at Goliad 27 Mch 1836. Spared because of his medical ability, Captain Shackelford escaped

from his Mexican captors in June, and wrote an excellent account of the destruction of Fannin's forces. He died 22 Jan 1857 in Courtland AL, still an outspoken friend of Texas. Shackelford County in Texas was named in his honor.

FORMATION OF AUSTIN LODGE NO. 12, A.F. & A.M. IN 1839

Fourteen Master Masons met at the home of Edwin Waller in Austin on the evening of 11 Oct 1839, for the purpose of forming a Lodge. They were: Alexander Russell, J.Y. Burney, James Izod, Thomas Bryson, Charles Mason, Joseph Waples, Heman Ward, Asa Brigham, Augustus Seeger, J.C.P. Kennemore, Geo. W. Sinks, W.H.H. Johnson, J.W. Garraty, and the host.

The balloting for officers resulted in the election of Bro. Russell as Worshipful Master; Bro. Izod, Senior Warden; and Bro. Mason, Junior Warden. These officers were appointed to procure signatures to the petition to the Grand Lodge (as reported in the minutes by Bro. Seeger, Secretary), worded as follows:

"To the Most Worshipful the Grand Master of Free and Accepted Ancient York Masons, within the Republic of Texas, Greeting:

"The petition of the subscribers, Master Masons residing within and in the vicinity of Austin, in the County of Bastrop, in the Republic of Texas, humbly sheweth:

"That they are Free and Accepted Master Masons of the ancient rite of York; that they are present members of regular lodges; that having the prosperity of the fraternity at heart, they are willing to exert their best endeavors to promote and diffuse the genuine principles of Masonry; that for the convenience of their respective dwellings, and for other good reasons, they are desirous of forming a new lodge in the town of Austin, to be named Austin No. 12; that in consequence of this desire they pray for a Warrant of Dispensation, to empower them to assemble as a legal Lodge, to discharge the duties of Masonry in a regular and constitutional manner, according to the original forms of the Order and the Regulations of the Grand Lodge; . . .

"Dated at Austin, this eleventh day of October, Anno Domini 1839, Anno Lucis 5839.

On the 7th of November, Grand Master Branch T. Archer at Houston signed the Dispensation, and recommended Anson Jones as his proxy to instruct the officers and constitute the Lodge. But Dr. Jones "declined accepting the authority within this brief," so Bro. George Fisher, Grand Secretary, installed the Lodge between 18 Feb and 9 Nov 1840, when a list of the original members was sent to the Grand Lodge. They were the same as the petitioners, except that A.S. Hammack and Geo. D. Biggar had been demitted, and Geo. W. Sinks had been added.

On 4 Feb 1866, the Lodge room, furniture, and records were destroyed by fire. A new charter was granted 16 June 1866, naming Henry Thomas Worshipful Master, DeWitt Clinton Baker Senior Warden, and A.R. Morris Junior Warden.

A MUSTER ROLL OF TEXAS RANGERS, 1877-1881

Among the "treasures" Mrs. J.B. Golden has unearthed in Texas State Archives is a typewritten muster roll of D Company of the Texas Rangers. Handwritten on the cover sheet appears: "Texas Rangers Data from the files of Adj. General commencing with the formation of the Frontier Battalion By Jas. A. King & Major Coffee Very Valuable."

An interesting resume of the history of the Rangers precedes the roster. To identify the captain of the company whose roster is set out below, the following facts were extracted from Handbook of Texas:

Dan W. Roberts, son of Alexander, was born in Winston Co, MS, on 10 Oct 1841. The family came to Texas in 1843; at 33 Dan joined the Texas Rangers, serving as lieutenant and captain. In 1875 he married Lucvenia Conway, whose failing health prompted their leaving Texas in 1882. In 1914 Roberts returned to the state and published Rangers and Sovereignty about his experiences with the force. Captain Roberts died in Austin 6 Feb 1935 and was buried in the State Cemetery.

SPICEWOOD SCHOOL COMMUNITY 1884

By combining a census of children (including those six and seven years of age, below the scholastic level then) with names on a petition we get a composite picture of Spicewood Community families in 1884.

Filed in Texas State Archives (Walling Papers 2-23/1008) is a petition addressed to the Travis County judge before 1 Aug 1884, asking for the organization of a school to be known as Spicewood School Community. It was recited that residents of the area in 1883 had built a schoolhouse 20 x 32 feet on Burnet road seven miles from Austin. The building was "Central in the community near an excellent spring and sheltered from cold northers and also open to summer breezes."

BOOK REVIEWS

THE STORY OF SURNAMES--L.G. Pine, B.A. London, F.S.A. Scotland, F.J.I., F.A.M.S., Barrister-at-Law, Inner Temple. Published by David and Charles, Limited, Newton Abbot, Devon. Distributed by Charles E. Tuttle Co., Inc., Rutland VT. 152 pp. Indexed by subjects and by surnames mentioned in the text.

L.G. Pine has worked with names for a long time and has developed his own logical grouping. He states that there are some 100,000 surnames known in the British Isles, of which perhaps some 25,000 have a genuinely proven meaning. The author analyzes a few names as illustrations under the groupings which he discusses. Pine's earlier book, They Came with the Conqueror, covers the category of Norman surnames in great detail, but only a few intellectual teasers are discussed in The Story of Surnames. The place names, patronymics, occupation names, and nicknames are treated in a factual yet light manner, compelling the reader to resolve to further study and classify his own surname.

The Welsh, Scottis, and Irish surnames are handled in a way that increases our respect for the incorporation of tribal names and history into the genealogy of these races.

If one is interested in the meaning buried in family names, this book offers material from which the reader may work out the meaning and origin of most British surnames. Mr. Pine has given us a very readable and useful book.--Mrs. Sam G. Cook

MARYLAND CATHOLICS ON THE FRONTIER: THE MISSOURI AND TEXAS SETTLEMENTS--Timothy J. O'Rourke. Brefney Press, 1974. x + 950 pp. \$30

From the Chesapeake to the Kentucky wilderness, from the "Barrens" in Missouri to the new frontier pioneered by Moses and Stephen F. Austin, thus the ancestors of many of today's Texans made their way and left their marks in the building of our country.

In ten years of research, the young author has compiled 950 pages of comprehensive genealogy and historical events of almost 350 years in the migration to the West of these interrelated family groups. A number of the surnames are prominent in Texas today--Moore, Tucker, Layton, Manning, and many others.

Copies of Maryland Catholics on the Frontier may be found in Texas at the Texas State Archives in Austin, University of Texas at Austin Library, Houston Public Library, Fort Worth Public Library, El Paso Public Library, Victoria Public Library, and St. Mary's Seminary at Houston.

ENGLISH SURNAMES--Charles Wareing Bradsley, M.A. Rutland VT: Charles E. Tuttle Co., Inc., 1968. 514 pp. +xxix prefaces, two-page list of documents cited, and 95 pp. index. \$6

Written in England in 1873 by an Anglican cleric, English Surnames proved so popular that three editions were brought out in ten years. The subtitle, "Their Sources and Significations," is a clue to the scope of this eminently readable book, which makes even quotations from Chaucer fairly understandable to a layman.

One may plan merely to look up a few surnames of interest via the index, but will soon find himself reading straight along. The author obviously was a scholarly man, his reasoning is convincing, and he had a sense of humor withal. A reader of historical novels will find here--in an explanation of the ancient expletives and oaths so often encountered in such books.

A chapter is devoted to each of several categories of surnames: patronymic, local, occupational (divided into town and country), surnames of office, and nicknames (an ekename, i.e., added).

The "Index of Instances" has three-letter telltales at the top of each page, facilitating the search for a surname. Each listing has the number of the page where the name is discussed,* and most have several full-name examples, keyed to the list of documents where those persons were mentioned--such official records as the Hundred Rolls, Rolls of Parliament, Calendarium Genealogicum, Calendar of Proceedings in Chancery (Elizabeth I), and county histories.

English Surnames is an excellent reference book, a word museum of the lifestyles of bygone days, and a delightful reading experience.

*Here's a little tip that applies to many books, especially if they are revised editions, as this one is: If you don't find what you are looking for on the page indicated by the index, examine a couple of pages before and after it. When paragraphs are deleted or added to a book, the original material is moved back or forward accordingly to other pages. Sometimes the editor forgets to change the page numbers that have already been printed in the index. I had no trouble finding the right page when that occurred in this book.--The Editor
