JOHN SALMON FORD'S LOT IN SECTION 1, OAKWOOD CEMETERY, AUSTIN (Lucie C. Price)

John S. Ford, who acquired the nickname of "Rip" Ford, wrote his memoirs when he was in his late seventies. The manuscript is at the University of Texas Archives in the Barker Texas History Center. These memoirs have been edited and published in the book, <u>Rip Ford's Texas</u>, by Stephen B. Oates.

I had occasion to look at these papers in answer to a request for any genealogy that mentioned Ford. I noticed that he told that his father, William Ford, was born in South Carolina in Greenville District in 1785, came to Texas after its annexation, and died in Travis County in 1867 at the age of 82.

The 1860 census of Travis County showed William Ford (Gentleman), age 76, born South Carolina, living in the household of Jesse F. Burdett. This household was in Precinct 3 and the post office was Webberville. This was most likely the father of Rip Ford. Then I wondered if he could have been buried in Oakwood Cemetery, but again thought he might have been buried in some country cemetery. There was only one way to find out and that was to go to Oakwood. The record book showed a William Ford buried in Section 1 in the J.S. Ford lot. Section 1 is the oldest part of the cemetery and the lots are not numbered. But the sexton went with me and it was not long before we located this lot and found three stones there.

The stone for William Ford had chiseled on it: "Died Oct. 14, 1866, age 81 yrs. 6 mos. and 20 days." The date was not 1867 and he was not 82, but I felt sure that he was the father of Rip Ford.

There were two other stones, one for Louisa Ford, died August 5, 1846, age 27, and the other for John W. Ford, died February 25, 1880, age 13 yrs. 10 mos. and 22 days.

It was time now to consult the book edited by Mr. Oates, and see what I could find out about Louisa and John W. Ford. Louisa was born Louisa Swisher and was John S. Ford's second wife. Mr. Oates says that they married in Travis County, but I do not find their license recorded here. He does tell that she begame ill and died in Austin about the date on the tombstone. There was no mention of any issue of this marriage. Rip Ford remained a widower for some time but married May 31, 1861, Addie Smith of Brownsville. They were the parents of two girls and one boy. The boy was named John William. So this was the John W. on the tombstone, presumably, but I needed to document it.

I looked at the card index file at the Austin-Travis County Room of the Austin Public Library. A card for John W. Ford showed three accounts in the <u>Daily Democratic Statesman</u>—January 10, February 26 and March 2, all 1880. From the account in the Jan. 10 issue I learned that he was the son of Col. John S. Ford. At that time Colonel Ford was superintendent of the Deaf and Dumb Asylum, as it was then called.

So, when one passes by Section 1, Lot 1 of Oakwood Cemetery and sees these stones—there lie John Salmon "Rip" Ford's second wife, his father, and his young son. The stones can't tell the story so I have written it for you.

Following are the first two articles; the third is a medical account of the boy's condition, containing no genealogical information.

Daily Democratic Statesman (Austin, Texas)

Jan. 10, 1880

On Thursday evening John W. Ford, the son of John S. Ford, was showing a pistol to some pupils of the Deaf and Dumb Asylum. He did not know it was a self-cocker and placed his finger on the trigger and an explosion occurred. The ball struck him on the inner side of the left thigh just above the knee, penetrated to the bone, passed downwards and came out on the right side of the leg, below the knee. Dr. Swearingen thinks the wound has not implicated the knee joint. It may have injured the artery called by the doctors the popliteal. If so, hemorrhage may ensue after the wound begins to slough. Though the indications justify the hope that the ball passed outside the artery. At latest account the wounded youth was doing well though he had some fever. He is not 14 years old and is a pupil at the Military Institute.

IN MEMORIAM

The Statesman deeply regrets to announce the death of little John W. Ford, only son of Col. John S. Ford. He died yesterday evening at 6:30 o'clock from the effects of an accidental wound from a pistol shot. He was nearly fourteen years of age, a bright, intelligent and good boy and was beloved by all who knew him for his gentlemanly and manly qualities. Few boys were more promising and more alive to a sense of duty. The Statesman profoundly sympathizes with Col. Ford and his family in this hour of affliction and grief. The funeral will take place from the Deaf and Dumb Asylum at 4 o'clock this evening. The funeral service will be conducted by Rew. T. B. Lee at the Episcopal Church.

SAN ANTONIO PRISONERS IN MEXICO, 1842-1844

Some rather incongruous papers have been found in the archives of the General Land Office, and, through the kindness of Mrs. Virginia H. Taylor, are here brought to light

The first is a hand-written list headed "San Antonio Prisoners, Sept., 1842," which is printed verbatim below. Very similar data is found in John Henry Brown's <u>History of Texas</u>, Vol. II pp. 222-253; where his version differs, it follows the manuscript listing between slashes.

To synopsize the event that this list pertains to: On 11 Sep 1842, General Adrian Woll took possession of San Antonio with 1400 Mexican troops. The District Court being session, General Woll captured the judge, lawyers, litigants, witnesses, and many other American citizens and officers crowding the small city.

A few men escaped and gave the alarm over the surrounding country-side, which was responded to by most of the military leaders of Texas; Matthew Caldwell, John C. Hays, Henry E. McCulloch, Ewen Cameron, et al. While trying to join the main Texan force, three-fifths of Nicholas Dawson's men from Fayette County were massacred near Salado Creek in Bexar County, and the remainder were taken prisoner.

The next morning, Colonel Caldwell sent John Henry Brown (among others) to investigate, so the budding historian had opportunity to gather names on the spot, which lends credence to his list.

In spite of the addition of Col. John H. Moore and Ben McCulloch to the Texan forces, they were unable to prevent Woll from crossing into Mexico with his prisoners. A few months later, a retaliatory or rescue mission was attempted (known as the Somervell expedition) which culminated in the disastrous Battle of Mier, 25-26 Dec 1842.

Prisoners from this fiasco were tortuously marched to Perote Prison in Vera Cruz (as it was spelled then) to join their fellow Texans. The Handbook of Texas states that there is no accurate list of those who died of disease, who were killed by guards, who escaped, and who were released through influence, but the Bexar prisoners were set free 23 March 1844, and the others (about 105) on September 16th of the same year.

Before historians jump on me for the inadequacy of the above account, let me hasten to state that it does not purport to be a history of the event. That can be found in numerous books; all I meant to do is touch on the reasons why these men were prisoners.

ABOUT THAT SPELLING . . .

As you have encountered variant spellings of certain surnames, have you ever wondered which was the original and which the corruptions? Of course, the earliest records show names spelled with wide variations, but by the 18th century many families had settled on the one they preferred and, for the most part, have retained that spelling in "the Old Country." It was the migration over the ocean that brought about many of the "seachanges," it seems.

My opinion is that the more complicated spelling came first, and others came about as the result of clerks' phonetic renditions, reinforced by the indifference of the bearer.

It is amazing that Pinckney has retained the superfluous c; apparently the bearers of the name, as a matter of family pride, insisted that it remain.

In England and in the South of the United States there has been a pattern of indolent slurring of pronunciation, with the result that silent letters gradually were dropped. For example, Cholmondeley came to be pronounced (and spelled) Chumley; Taliaferro, Tolliver; Quarles, Qualls; Leicester, Lester; Worcester, Wooster; Threlkeld, Thirkell; Bolleygne, Bolen; Postlethwaite, Postalwait; and, I suspect, Wriothesley evolved into Risley.

There is such a thing as being too inflexible about the spelling of a name. Recently a lady in the library looked up from a book and remarked to her companion, "There are a lot of L-O-U-I-S Oxnalls in the same county, but of course it couldn't be our ancestor because he spelled it L-E-W-I-S." That lady may be missing a great deal of information about her ancestor because the recorders happened not to spell the man's name the way he preferred. It's better to copy data pertaining to all possible phonetic renditions of a name and later discard it than to pass over records that may prove important.

A recent project has proved successful in awakening an interest in genealogy among indifferent family members. From the General Land Office I got some 8½ by 11" maps of Texas with only the counties outlined and named. Then I red-penciled all those counties with which close relatives have been associated: residence, birth, death, marriage, school attendance, camps, vacations, business ventures, etc.

Then I made an alphabetical list of those counties with a brief resume of what our people did in each one. Even my youngest grandchild found these maps of interest.

A more ambitious (and, no doubt, more interesting) project would be to do the same thing on a map of the United States, and ultimately for the whole world. If you give these as birthday gifts, they are more likely to receive careful attention!

THE CHARLES AUSTIN FAMILY CEMETERY

Copied 3 June 1974 by Mrs. David C. Gracy & Mrs. Herbert R. Gentry. Located just east of Highway 183, south of Onion Creek. To get there, go 3½ miles south on 183 from Ben White Boulevard (in the south part of Austin, Texas). This cemetery is fenced, and is divided into north and south portions by another fence. We copied only the north portion as it had been recently cleared of weeds, while the south portion appeared to be unkept.

BOGUS BRANDS

As soon as John Brooks retired from his job as a metalworker in a small Texas plant, he took a long-dreamed-of trip through the ranching areas of the Northwest. He was deeply impressed with a tremendous spread in Montana--even more so when he learned that the Lazy B brand on the fine cattle belonged to one Thomas Brooks.

Hurrying home, John Brooks invested in a few acres, bought ten head of stock, and innocently made himself a Lazy B branding iron.

He was righteously indignant when representatives of the Cattlemen's Association informed him that he could not use that brand because Joe Brown, in the same county, had already registered it.

Meanwhile, Mrs. Brooks had been bitten by the genealogy bug and had (Continued on page 120)

BOOK REVIEWS

THE PICTORIAL FIELD-BOOK OF THE REVOLUTION--Benson John Lossing. New York: Harper & Brothers, 1859. Reproduced by Charles E. Tuttle Co., 1972. Two volumes, slipcase. 1,555 pages. 1,100 illustrations. Supplement. 85-page index contains 10,000 entries. \$25.

Bound in brave red cloth that reminds us of the blood our patriot ancestors shed for our country, these volumes spread before us a panorama of Revolutionary battlefields, The entire story of the American Revolution is set forth in factual accounts, anecdotes, and pictures on these fifteen hundred pages.

In 1848, Benson John Lossing conceived the idea of visiting each of the battlefields of the Revolution to interview local people who could relate anecdotes pertaining to the site, of their own knowledge or as it had been told them by participants.

Harper and Brothers of New York advanced funds for a five-year plan of research and travel that ranged 8,000 miles over the "Thirteen Old States" and Canada, Mr. Lossing's findings were published piecemeal, and the complete first edition was released in 1859.

The subtitle of <u>The Pictorial Field-Book of the Revolution</u> is revealing: "or illustrations, by pen and pencil, of the history, biography, scenery, relics, and traditions of the war for independence." Amazingly enough, the author not only made most of the sketches but carved the 1100 woodblocks for their engraving.

Benson J. Lossing was orphaned in 1825 at the age of 12 and he worked as a farm boy and as apprentice to a watchmaker-jeweler, so he probably had little formal education. Yet his vocabulary is excellent and his style lucid, vigorous, and almost devoid of the florid excesses so often found in nineteenth-century writing. The University of Michigan conferred on him the degree of doctor of laws as a well-deserved award for producing this great book.

The order of the <u>Field-Book</u> follows the route the author traveled rather than the chronological sequence of the war, but the 10,000 entries in the index enable the reader to find the event or place he seeks. Ideally, the book should be read straight through, but not many readers nowadays have that much time, so additional praise is due Mr. Lossing for his patience in meticulous indexing.

Further aid is given the reader by the "tell-tales" at the tops of pages. Three or four phrases there summarize the contents of each page. A hairline rule sets off the footnotes (which sometimes have their footnotes in almost microscopic type!). These footnotes contain the most delightful information—just what one would interrupt the speaker to ask.

Another laudable device employed in this book is frequent and precise dating. If a sentence reads "On the next day" or "in the autumn of 1776," set into the text in smaller type will be "August 2, 1848," or "November," flush with a margin and set off by space.

I must criticize one feature of the type arrangement, however. When a small picture is centered on the page, the type goes down the left side to the bottom of the engraving. There is no extra space to warn the reader that he must go to the top of the picture and read down the right side before resuming full-width lines. One tends to read on to the bottom of the page, puzzled at the lack of sense!

Of course, the <u>Field-Book</u> is more historical than genealogical. In a book of this scope, it is understandable that only high officers could be named. But if the reader knows the commander his ancestor fought under, or the names of battles or skirmishes he participated in, he can find herein much information to help him picture what that ancestor experienced.

The Supplement includes Naval Operations, Diplomacy, The Confederation, Federal Constitution, British Prisons and Prison Ships, Signers of the Declaration of Independence, The Loyalists, Continental Lottery, English Stamps, 15 verses of "Yankee Doodle," and much more.

Scattered through the volumes are hundreds of autographs. In the Index these names appear in alphabetical order <u>and</u> alphabetized under Autographs. The same is done for Battles, Biographical Sketches, Cemeteries, Churches, Expeditions, Fortifications, Graves, Headquarters, Houses, Indians, Letters, Newspapers, Relics, Vessels, Visits of Author to, and so on.

To epitomize my enthusiasm for this book, suffice it to say that I wish I'd break a leg so I would have time to read every word of it!

REESE KELSO WATKINS: HIS ANCESTRY AND HIS DESCENDANTS AND COLLAT-ERAL LINES--Smith, Kelso, Cleveland, Bryan, Allison, Outlaw. Compiled by Frank B. Russell, Box 67, Moorestown NJ 08057. Copyright 1973. 200 pages plus 6 blank pages for family records.

This hard-bound book has an excellent full-name index, and a good bibliography. It contains a number of family pictures, maps of areas involved, and twenty-odd pages of reproductions of original documents.

Comprehensive lineage charts and family group sheets provide good reference, points, although the arrangement of the former is rather intricate, and on page 54 it appears that "sup. IIA" should be IIIA for Elizabeth and Benjamin.

There is a wealth of excellent material in Reese Kelso Watkins, beautifully typed. One could wish that the typist, when pressed for space, had used a period after c instead of cal765, which might be interpreted "calculated as 765." And it does seem to be carrying caution too far to employ such redundant phrases as "along about circa" and "in the time circle of circa 1750." The expression or euphemism "passed along" implies to me that the person migrated, not died, but such usage may be familiar in the compiler's home area.

These, of course, are minor criticisms; more reprehensible is the use of such statements as "There are no records" and "Records do not exist" when he means that he found none. There is always a possibility that missing records will turn up-let's be optimistic! The same reasoning applies to charts where Mr. Russell has typed "Not Determined"-if he had merely left blank spaces, data could be filled in as found.

One wonders why the compiler spelled his Watkins ancestor's name Cadawalader throughout when the written records and typed letter from Wales show it time and again (pp. 136-9, 163) without "a" after "Cad".

This handsome book will be a godsend for those seeking records on the families involved, and the compiler is to be commended for his work.

sent off to a heraldry mill for "the" Brooks coat of arms. She applied it to every available surface: She painted it, she needle-pointed it, she stenciled it on her car door, she had it engraved on stationery.

Now Mrs. Brooks wouldn't dream of crashing a DAR meeting if she did not belong, but it didn't occur to her that she was laying claim to an honor she had no right to. Since she lived in the United States, no officials came to tell her that she was not entitled to display that coat of arms unless she could prove (document each generation) that her husband was the eldest son of the eldest son...back to the man to whom that coat of arms was first confirmed by the College of Arms in England.

Getting acceptable proof of that is quite a task. During the eleventh and twelfth centuries, surnames gradually came into use in order to distinguish one Thomas or John from others in the same vicinity. Often these surnames identified a man by where he lived, such as near a brook. Who can say how many brooks there are in England, and how many utterly unrelated men thus came to be called Brooks? Some were knights and some were churls; some of the latter assumed the surname because they were attached to the manor of, say, Sir Roger Brooke (Brooke /hi/s man). So, even though they lived in the same place, two Brookses might not be of the same blood.

Thus in widely scattered shires of the British Isles, different coats of arms were registered to men named Brook/e/s. If they were related, the armorial bearings might be similar, but younger sons arms were "differenced" slightly from those of their fathers, etc.

The point is that just being named Brooks does not entitle John Brooks to use the brand of Thomas Brooks—or a Brooks coat of arms that he saw emblazoned (described) in a book such as General Armory.

If you merely want to collect pictures of coats of arms that have been borne by men of a name you are interested in-go ahead! It's fun to study the art of heraldry, to learn the terminology and meaning, and to visit old castles and manors. Just don't take it seriously unless you are prepared to spend a fortune and a lifetime proving your descent.

This is an over-simplified exposition of a widely misunderstood subject. Many authoritative articles which cover it in depth have been printed; e.g., "Coats of Arms" on pp. 346-7, The Augustan, Book 3, 1973.
