EX-CONFEDERATE MISSOURIANS IN TEXAS IN 1881

One of our members has contributed pages from a pamphlet which we feel is an exciting find for those with Missouri connections, so we have excerpted details that have genealogical value. Not only does the register of attendants at this meeting give the counties in which the men formerly lived, but in most cases the information about the units they served in will enable researchers to locate their military records in the National Archives. Also, a postcard to the Office of the Adjutant General, Jefferson City MO 65101, may get you a copy of the enlistment record of a Civil War soldier from Missouri.

For interesting details of the Battle of Oak Hills and other Missouri campaigns, see The Life and Services of Gen. Ben McCulloch by Victor M. Rose (Philadelphia, 1888). Many of the men who attended this reunion are mentioned. There are, of course, many other pertinent books.

"Report of the Meeting and Organization of the Ex-Confederate Missourians, at Dallas, August 10 and 11, 1881.

"Pursuant to a previous call, a large number of ex-Confederate Missourians, and a number of ex-Confederate soldiers from Texas, Louisiana and Arkansas, who participated in the battle of Oak Hills, Mo., on the 10th day of August, A. D. 1861, met at Dallas, as above, for the purpose of re-union, the day first named being the 20th anniversary of the first great battle fought on Missouri soil, between the contending forces.

"A number of ex-Confederates arrived in the city on the 8th and 9th of August. Craddock's Opera House had been procured for headquarters, where was to be found, on the morning of the 9th of August, the affable Col. E. G. Bower, of Dallas, with a register prepared for the entry of the names, postoffice address, company, regiment, brigade and county in Missouri from which the ex-Confederate Missourians came at the beginning and during the war. Also a register for all parties present from Texas, Louisiana and Arkansas who participated in the sanguinary struggle of the 10th of August, 1861, at Oak Hills, and last, but not least to wearied visitors, was a flowing bowl of Craddock's best, prepared in princely style, to welcome and to gladden the hearts of all who would indulge."

Activities of the convention included a parade, speeches (one very controversial!), dinners, and a ball. At the organizational meeting, the following officers were elected: President--Gen. S.D. Jackman, San Marcos; Vice-presidents--Col. Thos. H. Murray, McKinney; Col. John T. Coffee, Georgetown; Col. J.H. Caldwell, Waco; Maj. A.J. Dorn, Austin; Maj. J. Waldo, Houston; Dr. W.H. Trollinger, Whitesboro; Secretary and Treasurer--Col. D.A. Williams, Dallas; Sergeants-at-Arms--Maj. J.T. Harrell, Savoy; and Capt. Wm. Marchbanks, Paris.

Many committees were named, and letters were read from former Missouri Confederates who were unable to attend (some state why), including Col. T.F. Bell, attorney-at-law from Shreveport LA; Gen. F.M. Cockrill of Warrensburg MO; John T. Crisp (no residential or military identification) who sent Missouri-grown products--cigars, whiskey and apple brandy--to the delegates; Col. J.B. Gilmore of Shreveport, 3rd LA Regi-

ment; Gen. John S. Marmaduke from St. Louis MO; Col. Richard H. Musser from Brunswick MO who commanded a regiment in Parsons' Brigade, MO Infantry; Col. N.L. Norton of Austin; Col. A.W. Slayback of St. Louis, who commanded a regiment in Shelby's Brigade; Col. Thomas L. Snead from New York, who was adjutant general of Gen. Sterling Price's Army; Maj. W.H. Tunnard from Natchitoches LA, of Co. Km Pelican Rifles of Baton Rouge, 3rd LA Infantry (who wrote a history of that regiment); and Hon. G.G. Vest, U.S. Senator from Missouri.

This convention was held in the era of flattery (as numerous genealogies written then bear evidence--most of us have a "Kentucky-fied" colonel in our backgrounds), so we find that many titles mentioned in the report are higher than those entered on the register (except for A.J. Dorn and E.W. Shands, who were "demoted" from colonel to major in the body of the report). Perhaps some of the men modestly listed their rank when they first enlisted instead of the highest that they attained. Among the rank changes noted were:

Maj. J.E. Barkley (from 1st Lt.), Col. E.G. Bower (from Pvt.), Col. J.H. Caldwell (from Lt.), Col. S.P. Cunningham (from Capt.), Capt. W.H. Grigsby (from Pvt.), Col. J.S. Mellon (from Maj.), Capt. W.H. Ogden (from Lt. Harry W. Ogden), Capt. J.W. Pryor (from Pvt.), Capt. H. N. Tuck (from Sgt.), and Col. M.J.D. Young (from Maj. M.J.B.).

Other discrepancies were Col. F.T. Mitchell of Brenham (registered Bonham), Maj. J.P. Herrald (from Maj. J.T. Harrell), and Gen. Pierson of the 3rd Louisiana Regiment (same as Lt. Col. D. Puison in the supplemental list? No doubt the printer had trouble deciphering some names).

Several persons whose names were not found on the registers participated in the convention or were mentioned: Rev. J.R. Graves of Brenham gave the invocation; George Hamer ("a splendid cook") who was killed at Prairie Grove; Gen. R.M. Gano of Texas made a speech, as did Gen. W.L. ("Old Fige") Cabell, ex-mayor of Dallas; Capt. George E. Felton of Dallas, commander of the Queen City Guards; Captain Marony of Dallas, commander of the Lamar Rifles. "The accomplished and beautiful" Miss Mittie McCulloch, escorted by the grand marshal, Col. D.A. Williams, opened the ball. She was the daughter of Col. Bob McCulloch, General Commissioner of Lands for Missouri.

A resolution of thanks was offered to the managers of the ball: Sam Morgan, Jeff House, Frank Cockrell, Charles Dexter, George Potter, Green Williams, James Pfouts, and Charles Smith.

Thanks to railroads for extending reduced rates to the veterans who attended the convention were addressed to: Col. Jed Waldo of Houston & Texas Central; Col. H.M. Hoxie, general manager of International & Great Northern and Texas & Pacific; E.E. Fosdick of Dallas & Wichita; Gen. W.I. Cabell of Texas Trunk; and Col. F. Chandler, general passenger agent of Missouri Pacific and its branches.

Mr. L. Craddock was thanked for allowing the Confederates free use of "his splendid Opera House" for the convention.

Maj. A.J. Dorn, ex-paymaster on the staff of ex-Gov. C.F. Jackson of Missouri, stated that he (Dorn) was perhaps the oldest soldier or officer present (too bad he didn't give his age!).

Capt. W.G. Veal, president of the Re-union Association of Parsons' Texas Brigade, issued an invitation for the Missouri veterans to meet with his association in Dallas in 1882.

Capt. W.H. Ogden of Louisiana proposed that all ex-Confederate Missourians residing outside Missouri be admitted to full membership in the

association. The motion failed to pass: all but Texas residents formerly from Missouri were declared to be honorary members. In accordance with this original concept, a separate register had been provided for men who had lived in Texas, Louisiana, and Arkansas before fighting in Missouri. Later, Col. E.G. Bower of Dallas introduced an eloquent resolution that reversed the decision unanimously, on the grounds that "Upon the bloody battle fields all over the South, they participated with us, and were not honorary members on those occasions...".

Elected to the Mortuary Committee to report deaths of members in Texas were Dr. W.H. Trollinger of Whitesboro, Col. John T. Coffee of Georgetown, Capt. J.W. Pryor of Fort Worth; for Louisiana were Hon. H.W. Ogden of Benton, Capt. Thornton F. Bell of Shreveport, Capt. P.H.M. Cumming of Bayou La Chute; for Arkansas were Col. L.A. Pindall of Watson, Maj. --- Jett of Washington, Dr. J.M. Dunn of Richmond; for Missouri were Maj. J.N. Edwards of Sedalia, Col. R.H. Musser of Brunswick, and Col. J.S. Mellon of St. Louis.

Space limitations prevent naming each man's company and brigade in the main chart to follow (but the brigade is typed in parentheses when a man failed to write in his regiment). In an attempt to make up for the omission, the component units of each brigade were compiled from the register, just as the delegates entered them in the Regiment column. Discrepancies in this list will be noted, possibly attributable to changes in command or failure of memory.

It is uncertain whether Batt stood for battalion or battery, which were usually abbreviated "Bat'lion" and "Bat'ry." MSG of course means Missouri State Guard, but SS leaves me in the dark. When initials in the register were expanded into names in the report, the amplified form has been used in the chart.

METHODIST MINISTERS IN TEXAS IN 19th CENTURY

This material was sent anonymously to the editor, with no source given. I hope we are not infringing on the copyright, but believe that alphabetizing the names is sufficient justification for reprinting.

Although not so identified, the list (compiled in 1888) seems to be composed of Methodist ministers, judging from those whose names are known to the editor, the term "itinerant," and the frequency of the given names "Asbury" and "John W/esley/."

NOTE: In Texas, many towns are not in the county of the same name. Better check in U.S. Postal Guide, a gazette, a Texas almanac, or a map to identify burial places.

A HELPFUL HINT FOR THE HOSTESS

Before discarding your obsolete telephone directories, remove the pages pertaining to your city. For Austin these include a bit of history, geography, and economics; a description of interesting places to see; a skeleton map of the city, and an inset map of the downtown area.

When you are expecting out-of-town visitors (perhaps some long-time genealogical correspondents!) you can send these pages to them. The marked map will give them a general idea of how to reach your home, and they will have had time before they arrive to decide what sights they want to see.

BOOK REVIEWS

THE RESEARCHER'S GUIDE TO AMERICAN GENEALOGY, Val D. Greenwood. Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Co., 1973. xv + 503 pp. + 28 pp. index. \$10

In the Introduction to The Researcher's Guide to American Genealogy, Milton Rubincam lauds the author for his detailed discussion of records systems and his emphasis on using primary sources in genealogical research. Since Mr. Rubincam is an eminent authority in the field of genealogy, his endorsement confirms the importance of this book.

Part I, "Background to Research," explains the nature of genealogical research, lists problems (handwriting, the calendar, etc.), and discusses research tools (the library, reference materials, organization and evaluation of findings, and correspondence).

Part II, "Records and Their Use," includes such categories as newspapers; census returns; and vital, probate, land, court, church, military, and burial records.

Each topic is covered both generally and specifically, with much excellent advice on how to find and to use the various research tools. There are many helpful charts and enlightening illustrations.

There is a 12-page section of definitions of legal terms in alphabetical order which is an invaluable aid (though I must register a protest of his defining stirpes as "The person...", for stirpes is the plural of stirps).

The section on "Government Land: Colonial and American" is truly outstanding, clarifying such subjects as land grants, military bounty land entries, and the rectangular survey system.

Other welcome features include several bibliographies and a chapter on Canadian Research.

Written in readable fashion, with occasional touches of humor, the book is highly recommended for browsing as well as for looking up particular points.

LIBERTY, LIBERTY COUNTY, AND THE ATASCOSITO DISTRICT, Miriam Partlow. Austin: The Pemberton Press, 1974. 358 pp. + 11 pp. index. 258 photographs and illustrations. \$14.95

Liberty, Liberty County, and the Atascosito District may technically be classified as a county history (and a stupendous one it is), but it is also a dream-come-true for genealogists. All of us who see it will wish we could place our ancestors' records in such a handsome setting as this book.

Since the author's ancestors, notably Matthew G. White and Hugh B. Johnston, were so prominent in the affairs of Atascosito District, as were their descendants and collaterals in the subsequent annals of the area, this book includes a wealth of family history.

Besides the full scope of geographical and historical data (description of which we leave to reviewers for history-oriented publications), this beautifully designed and flawlessly executed volume contains pictures of old homes and family groups, human interest stories, and "folksy" vignettes that will be treasured by genealogists even if they have no roots in Liberty County, Texas.

BOOK REVIEW

CAPTAIN GEORGE BARBER OF GEORGIA, David W. Morgan. Copyright 1975. Mimeographed, 131 pp. + vi. Notes 8 pp., index 20 pp. Order from author at 6301 Berkman Dr, Austin TX 78723.

Captain George Barber of Georgia is a well-researched, excellently mimeographed (one side only) family history, replete with many verbatim documents. Many of Captain Barber's descendants are brought down to the present time.

Capt. George Barber was born ca 1743, probably in Augusta Co, VA; married Margaret Watkins 1766-67; and died 1822 in Oglethorpe Co, GA. The author is properly cautious about identifying his parents, but presents very good circumstantial evidence that they were George and Elizabeth Barber of Augusta County.

The collateral lines of Watkins, Posey, and Berryhill are treated in some depth. Other surnames with numerous entries in the index are Aldridge, Allen, Billups, Holliday, Hollis, Howard, Hudman, Johnson, Lucas, Matthews, Morgan, Morton, Orr, Reynolds, Scott, and Wood.

An impressive number of Bible records, wills, depositions regarding military service (in Revolutionary War, Indian wars, War of 1812, Civil War, etc.), lineage charts, census records, Cherokee Indian rolls, and the facsimile of an 1814 plat record authenticate this well-written genealogy. Personal letters and reminiscences give interesting details about the persons involved. The notes identify the sources of information, but some lack page references.

There is a general index ("Women indexed under maiden name when known") and a Barber index. The latter includes one of the most helpful devices I've ever seen in an index to a genealogy. After each given name appear the names of his male progenitors, from his father to the earliest known. Not only are they in ascending order, but each has the numeral of his generation typed above the line. When one thinks of the tedious typing involved, one wonders why the author did not announce the order used at the beginning of the index and then type "George . . . Samuel W., Reese, George . . . 34." But what a boon to the reader, when he encounters George on page 34, to be able to turn to the Barber index and discover his lineage at a glance!

Mr. Morgan is to be commended for his forthright, easy-to-follow style and for his restraint in refraining from fulsome praise and wishful but unauthenticated glorification of his worthy ancestors.

Destruction of Records

I have been asked to write an editorial in the name of AGS protesting the destruction of the original early tax rolls, but I feel that no good purpose would be served by casting recriminations, now that it has been done. Since the microfilm copies are so poor that many names cannot be read, it is a tragic loss to historians, genealogists, and other interested citizens. However, nothing can be done about it now except to hope that the State Archives will allow a panel of concerned people to have some input into the decision before valuable records are destroyed in the future.

We may not be qualified archivists, but we have a vital interest in the records of Texas.
