# TEXAS COUNTY RECORDS NOW MADE AVAILABLE ON MICROFILM

Texans will soon have available to them a new source of historical information. The result of a statewide project begun in 1974, it will consist of selected county records, most pre-1900, which have been microfilmed through a cooperative project of the Local Records Department of the State Library's Archives Division and the Genealogical Society of Utah. The project is estimated to require five years to complete and will result in records of Texas's counties being available to researchers at the State Library's Genealogy Section or one of twenty depositories throughout the state.

Under this agreement, archivists of the Local Records Department negotiate with county officials for permission to film their records, and prepare a list of records to be filmed. The Genealogical Society then films the records, using the archivists' lists as a guide, and provides the Local Records Department with a copy of the filmed records.

The agreement under which this work is being done is one that has been successfully carried out in several other states, and is part of a worldwide project of the Genealogical Society to preserve records useful to genealogical research.

Patrons may request the Local Records Department to send the film to one of its depositories most convenient for them or to the State Library, and will be allowed to keep the records there for their use for 60 days, with a 30-day extension if needed. Records for Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Hays, Travis, Williamson, Gillespie, Llano, Bastrop, and Gonzales counties will be kept in the State Library except when lent to a depository; other counties will be kept at the depository serving them.

For current information on records received in the future, interested persons may call the Local Records Department at 475-2449, or the Genealogy Section at 475-6727.

NOTE: At present this microfilm is in the Archives Division on the south side of the foyer of the State Library Building. Patrons check out desired rolls at the desk in the archives search room and take them to the readers in the Genealogy Section.

# PRINTED CENSUS INDICES, SCHEDULES, AND SUBSTITUTES IN TEXAS STATE LIBRARY

Before you start laboriously reading census on microfilm, check to see if there are any printed finding aids to facilitate your search. Many censuses have been indexed, so you can roll right to the page and line where your family is indexed.

A few schedules have been printed completely, and a number of specific counties on the federal census are indexed in print. Some guides to state and territorial censuses are in book form, as well as quite a few substitutes such as tax lists, tithables, etc.

The majority of the books listed below are on shelves along the east wall of the Genealogy Room in Texas State Library, but some are shelved with their respective state.

From time to time, more of these finding aids will be acquired (for instance, AGS has ordered a number to present to the library), so be sure to check the shelves whenever you go. Meanwhile, perhaps this chart will spur you to tackle a census you have long postponed.





#### EARLY AUSTIN POLICEMAN

John Everton Kennerly was born near Evergreen, Washington County, Texas in 1857. His parents moved to Travis County when he was a young man.

He married Mary Emma Davis in 1875, they were the parents of seven children.

In 1888 he was a policeman for the City of Austin. There were 19 police officers for a population of about 15,000 citizens. Early in his career the Austin Daily Statesman reported the following story.

Late Thursday night while the rain was coming down in torrents three overcoats were stolen from the Colorado House. Officer Kennerly was detailed to work up the case, and yesterday morning run in two men. He arrested them in the first ward, where he found one of the coats which they had sold. The men claimed to be painters. They were turned over to the county authorities yesterday morning and will have a hearing before Justice Calhoun today. The first ward was branded by 0. Henry, in his newspaper the Rolling Stone in 1895, as being a tough locality.

John Everton Kennerly served as a policeman, constable, detective and railroad policeman in his 42 years of public service. He lived in Dripping Springs, Hays County, Texas in his retirement years. He died in 1939.

My parents were SAMUEL LOUIS LANE (b. 1-15-1859, Palestine, Anderson Co. Texas, d. 10-23-1929, Alvarado, Johnson Co., Texas) and LUCILLE AGNES BROWN (b. 10-1875, Pontiac, Livingston Co., Illinois, d. 3-5-1916, Alvarado). They were married at Alvarado on 1-11-1905, as confirmed by Johnson Co. marriage records and records at St..Joseph's Catholic Church, Cleburne. Children of SAMUEL LOUIS and LUCILLE were: Harriet Madonna (b. 5-20-1907, d. 8-16-1949), Helen Louise (b. 7-3-1908, d. 1-28-1939), EVANGELINE ELIZABETH, and Marie Antoinette (b. 12-1915, d. 12-1916). S. L. LANE was first married to MAE O'DONNELL (b. ap. 1851 at New York City, m. \_\_\_\_\_\_, d. 8-17-1903, Johnson Co.). Mae O'Donnell and Lucille Agnes Brown were half-sisters.

SAMUEL LOUIS LANE was the son of LEWIS R. LANE (b. ap. 1817, Tennessee, d. between 10-1862 & 5-1868, Palestine) and MARGARET JANE BROWN (b. 7-1-1841, Kentucky, m. 4-19-1856, Palestine, d. 11-8-1911, Hillsboro, Texas). Other children of L. R. and MARGARET JANE were Elizabeth Jane (b. 8-7-1857, Palestine, m. 1-11-1874 to James Evans in Johnson Co., d. 1-29-1913, Hill Co.), James T. (b. 12-16-1861, d. 1-25-1877, buried in the old cemetery at Alvarado) and Tennessee P. (b. 6-17-1863, d. \_\_\_\_\_\_). Ancestry of LEWIS R. LANE completely unknown.

MARGARET JANE BROWN LANE subsequently married a MR. CAPPS in Palestine. They had one son, John S. (b. 3-13-1869, Palestine, d. \_\_\_\_\_\_). After the death of Mr. Capps, she married WILLIAM H. GOODRICH on 5-8-1872 at Palestine. They had one daughter, Alice (b. 2-17-1874, m. \_\_\_\_\_\_ to Sam Hansard, d. 1923 and buried in Hillsboro).

MARGARET JANE then married WILLIAM C. WATSON in Johnson Co. on 7-2-1875. Their children were: Thomas Edward (b. 5-10-1876 in Johnson Co., m. 6-5-1898 to Ida Powell, d. 1-1-1952, Smithville, Texas) and Orlena Evelyn (b. 7-11-1882, Johnson Co., m. 3-5-1900 to R. E. Howell in Johnson Co., d. 11-5-1906, Hillsboro).

MARGARET JANE BROWN was the daughter of JAMES D. BROWN (b. either 1801, 1810 or 1814, Kentucky, m. 6-28-1838 to Dicey Stone Fox, d. 8-9-1866 in Anderson Co., Texas) and DICEY STONE FOX (b. 8-18-1815, Kentucky, d. 2-4-1891 in Alvarado and buried in the old Alvarado cemetery). James D. and Dicey Brown had the following children: John S. (b. 1839, Kentucky, d. 8-19-1869), MARGARET JANE, Emily (b. 4-25-1843, Kentucky, m. 2-2-1860 to John Russell at Palestine, Texas, d. 7-25-1921), Mary Elizabeth (b. 1845, d. 8-29-1867), James R. (b. 1847, Jackson, Tennessee,), Irene (b. 2-27-1849 in Jackson, Tennessee, m. 11-20-1868 to Nathan Ruben Grisham at Alvarado, Texas, d. 6-20-1944 at Glenrose, Texas), Lewis (b. 1851, Tennessee, d. 1884, Alvarado), Wesley (b. 1853, Texas), and Neal (b. 1856, Texas).

According to family understanding, James D. and Dicey Brown came from Jackson, Madison Co., Tennessee to Palestine, Anderson Co., Texas in 1853 (1850 census places them in Jackson, Tennessee). James D. was a Methodist minister and was also a carpenter and brick mason. It is reported that he and his sons paved or helped to make the first brick street in Palestine and also built or assisted in building the Masonic Lodge in Palestine (none of which has been verified through records). There is a possibility that he preached in Llano as well as Palestine.

It is believed that James D. Brown's father was JAMES ELLERY BROWN, but no other ancestral information is known.

Evangeline E. Lane 8100 Balcones, Apt. 163 Austin, Texas 78759 LUCILLE AGNES BROWN LANE was the daughter of GEORGE BROWN and CATHARINE O'NIELL (b. ap. 1830 in Ireland, m. 3-6-1867, Pontiac, Ill., d. 5-21-1896, Pontiac). They were married by a Catholic priest named R. P. O'Niell (believed to be a brother of Catharine). Other children were: Theresa (b. Pontiac, m. 8-14-1900, d. ). According to the Catholic church records there were two other children, George and Cecelia, who died in infancy. No other information pertinent to George Brown has been found.

According to the 1860 census taken in Pontiac, Illinois, CATHARINE O'NIELL was married to WILLIAM O'DONNELL (b. ap. 1823). Both were born in Ireland and their first two children--Mae E., age 9, and John, age 4, were born in New York and the third child, CATHARINE, age 1, was born in Pontiac. Other children were: William, Anna (d. 1931 at Alvarado), and Julia.

William O'Donnell served in the Union Army, 7th Regiment, Illinois Cavalry, and was discharged due to disability (tuberculosis). Death and burial of Catharine at Pontiac have been verified through Catholic church records, but no additional information has been found.

Information as to the residence of Catharine O'Niell and William O'Donnell in Ireland, name of the ship or date of arrival in New York are all unknown. Information as to relationship to the O'Donnells and O'Niells reportedly from Donegal is still only tentative. Whether they were married prior to leaving Ireland or upon arrival in New York is unknown. Sources contacted in New York have produced no information.

The Mandbook of Texas states that he was a captain in Battery B, 1st Michigan Light Artillery and was wounded near Resaca, Georgia. In 1867 he graduated from Union Theological Seminary in New York. For his devoted services to the Confederate Home for Men in Austin he was made an honorary member of John B. Hood Camp, United Confederate Veterans. The 1889-90 directory of Austin shows his title as Rev., as pastor of First Pēsbyterian Church at 7th and Lavaca streets. His residence was at 404 West 11th Street.

Readers of the new publication can expect to find family genealogies, biographical sketches, cemetery inscriptions, family Bible records, early birth, marriage and death records, extracts from old wills and deeds and ancestor charts compiled by readers. All of these items will pertain to Maine family members of past centuries.

In addition, the publication will offer a variety of reader services, including free queries, tips on how to trace your ancestry, and reviews of books on Maine people and places. "We also will carry a directory of Maine's historical societies, museums and lineage societies, plus news items on activities of these organizations," Ms. Bachelor said.
