BRAND REGISTRATIONS IN TRAVIS COUNTY 1846-1851, and 1850

CENSUS DATA ON HOLDERS THEREOF

It has been said that cattle brands are the equivalent of coats of arms; like most gross exaggerations, this claim contains a grain of truth. Brands do identify livestock as belonging to a certain man just as a lord's soldiers were identified by their banners bearing his coat of arms.

A man can design his own brand and get it registered to insure that it is uniquely his, both now and as long as he wants it. In the US this function (the prerogative of the Heralds' College in England) is performed by a county official called a Recorder, Clerk of the County Court, or County Clerk.

But having a brand does not carry the same prestige as bearing a coat of arms. A man with only one milk cow has as much right to a brand as a cattle "baron." A brand, unlike a coat of arms, can be bought with a herd, or assumed and registered by another if a former owner relinquishes it when he dies or retires.

Having fallen heir to some Xeroxed copies of pages from an early Brand Book of Travis County, I thought it would be interesting to publish the data therein. The registrations in this book seem to represent young men just acquiring a herd, men who had recently moved to the county, and men who resided in nearby counties but wanted their brands recorded here also. Presumably most of the earliest Travis Countians registered their brands in a volume that antedated this one.

The brand register also describes each man's mark, such as: "Swallow fork in the right ear and crop off the left ear," but, to save space, these were not copied herein. I felt that information about the brand owners' families was more important, so I looked them up on the 1850 Census of Travis Co. with the invaluable assistance of The State of Texas, Federal Population Schedules, 7th Census of U.S., 1850, transcribed by Mrs. V. K. Carpenter in 1969 (4 vols + index).

In 1976 Accelerated Indexing Systems produced <u>Texas 1850 Census Index</u> (by R.V. Jackson, G.R. Teeples and D.S. Meyer), which includes given names and refers to the page number on the census. Mrs. Carpenter's index lists only surnames and the page numbers in the four-volume set, so a great deal of cross reference is involved in using both indexes. But that gave the advantage of having more than one person's interpretation of the handwriting on the census to weigh against the often differently spelled but clearly written names in the brand book. In all likelihood, the names were spelled out to the Recorder in person, rather than being relayed to the census enumerator by whatever person happened to be at home when he called.

Most of the entries in the brand book were signed by A.B. McGill, Recorder, but occasionally he gave his title as Clerk of the County Court. In 1846 R.C. Doom was Deputy Recorder, and on 15 Aug 1859 J.T. M'Laurin, Clerk, noted a change in a brand. In our chart below, the date following each name is when his/her brand was registered. Incidentally, some of the women who registered brands do not seem to have been widows; conversely, some men whose names appear before 1850 appear to have died or left the county before the census was taken at mid-year.

Regrettably, in spite of focusing all my imagination on the subject, I was unable to identify some of the brand holders with names on the census in Travis Co. but have noted some possibilities in other counties seen in the Accelerated index.

The formula I have used for census data is: Family Number, Occupation, Value of Real Estate, Name of Head of Family, Age, Place of Birth, followed by Name, Age, Birthplace (plus occasionally Occupation) for members of his/her household。 (The Carpenter volumes also give color and sex, but I omitted them unless the name does not clearly indicate the sex.) When a new surname is introduced, it applies to the names that follow. Illiteracy (designated "No schooling" in the book) is not noted in this article, but * means the couple married within the year; + indicates a student. Alphabetical sequence is by the spelling used in the brand book; census data shows Mrs. Carpenter's interpretations.

From the more than 1,500 families histories, which I have compiled or written, I prepared a special booklet

in 1977, for my grandchildren:

'Direct Ancestors of My Grandchild ren," has brought more inquiries than most. It is based on about 60 years of ancestor hunting. Some facts took as much as 40 years to verify, and the verification came quite by accide ent, while examining a book at UT.

Curiosity, persistence and study...there is an answer somewhere. Do not lose hope. Just when you think you've hit a dead end, a blank wall, the answer will be found, perhaps, in a place and through a person, of which you've not thought. Ancestor hunters need to verify their data. President Lincoln will probably be judged by historians to be the greatest of all of the Presidents - but he was also

possibly one of the most libeled, or even slandered.

No American or British reference book had his ancestry correct, until 1978 when the World Almanac and Book of Facts, said that the President was a son of Thomas and Nancy (Hanks) Lincoln. Mancy had been given as many as 51 fathers, even Gen. of the Armies Washington. Her mother was accused of "fornification," (not guilty) as the family wanted to blackmail her into marrying the bachelor, Henry Sparrow, Sro, for whom she as a widow was keeping house.

There is still a book on the market, "GENSIS of Lincoln," which by testimonials trys to prove that Lincoln was born in the mountains of Western N.C., the ill-

egitimate son of Abraham Enloe and a servant girl named Nancy Hanks.

Ezra Sparrow columnist, and descendant of two half-brothers of Lincoln; s mother says 18 first cousins and an uncle, Henry Sparrows, Jr are buried in lawrenceburg Ky, where he writes a column. A retired lawyer had the charge against Lincoln dismissed 10-6-1977. But many people are still not convinced.

DeBretts, of Winchester, England put out a press release that President Carter, was "the manor born," related to Geno of the Armies Washington and Queen Elizabetho J.M. Black, research specialist, of the Church of Jesus Christ of L.D.S. had prepared a family history of President Carter, which was presented in the Oval rm.

Then Prof. Philip H. Gray, at the annual meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science said (in part) "Of recent presidents only JFK and

Carter had no famous paersonages in their background.

Recently there was a headline, like the one that said Lincoln was a descendant of King Edward I, which read "Nazi Bormann's Bones stored in a celler" in Bonno The best seller, "AFTERMATH," reports that the author spoke with Borman in South America, in 1973. I spoke with a man, in Switzerland, in 1960, who saw Bormann

after the war and listened to his conversation, when he said he was going to South America. The point of the above is to make ancestor hunter aware that not every thing you hear, or read, is true. Search for evidence.

My Pearson ancestors named Chester, Pa., for their hometown, Chester, England. They moved to S.C. The Macy pioneer, my grandmother Pearsons ancestor, had descention to what is now N.C. An even 100 Pearsons were approved by the NS IMR as veterans of the Revolution. A Quaker, circuit-riding preacher told them to get out of slave territory, or they would all go to HELL. So both lines moved North through Tenn., to what is now Ohio. Some married enroute, and remained with their spouses, others accompanied their new partners to what is now Ohio. President Hoover's ancestors were in the group that trekked North.

My Westlake ancestor came from Mercer Co., Pa., to Miami Co., O. He put the fact on his tombstone, and that is the statement that it took me 40 years to prove. The Westlakes had come from England and settled in Newburgh, N. Y., in 1740. My other

grandmother's ancestors, Robbins, came from N.J. to Miami Co., O.

Mrs Pearson was a Scarritt, and it took me 20 years to prove her father wrong, when he said "There is my brother, myself and I did meet a family in K.C. Mo. The people in Mo., as young lawyers, etc., had gone back to New England, and made Photostats of all the records they could find. They gave them to me. I had my first book, "The Scarritt Clan in America," in 1938, the year I started my column on "how to do," which is still appearing, in the Genealogy Digest, and is sold by mail. In 1948 I published the second volume of "The Scarritt Clan in America," and have since put out an addenda. It was fun seeking out Scarritts in every state (then 48)

A few years ago, I stated in my column that I was going to select a name, and follow the advice I'd been giving others for then 28 years. Everybody that I first contacted told me, like my father-in-law, but this time it was Fee, in Pa.

Not only were there people named Fee, but after 1,601 pages, I started, putting

the material into seperate books, some 220 pages, and booklets.

One day a man, in Okla., sent me \$ 50.00 to further the work, and then I got the idea of making my hobby a book business. (Remember if you sell, as a recent writer adviced you need a sale license).

I never sell a book, except those sold through book stores, Charles E. Tuttle Co., Inc., lists some and Goodspeed's book Shop is a customer. without first having the potential purchasers furnish me details on their own family, for the benefit of others and posterity.

In my "Direct Ancestors of My Grandchildren," John Crysdale qualifies for the United Empire Loyalists. He had arrived in N.Y., in 1772, and was a Tory, harboring Gen. Burgoyne's spys. Thus to Canada, but most of the descendants are back today.

The Abdrews family claims a Revolutionary ancestor. Col. John Fee served in two units from Bedford Co., Pa. Aaron Greeley, 1745- who m. Susanna Burnham, is shown in the Greeley family history. Paul Macy, 1744- who m. Bethia Macy, and 2nd Deborah Goggeshell and his brother-in-law Barachiah, 1766- are listed as veterans. Thomas Pearson, 1728- who m. Ann Powell, and later Mary Campbell, a widow; were in S.C when he was credited as a veteran. Eli Roberts, 1744- who m. Abagail Durand was a veteran. Nathan Scarritt, 1753- who m. Abagail Atkins was a veteran.

There are probably others who are veterans, but the above are cited as evidence

of what curiosity, persistence and study will do for you.

I was fortunate in that I knew my great-grandmother Macy, a Neal; the grand-father of Mrs. Pearson, my own grandparents, and almost all of their opouses. In fact I use to spend my time, as a youngster eating their cookies and gathering data, that most do not know about today.

Young people who get interested in ancestor hunting will find that history becames much more interesting. Older people can contribute to history and get mail. If senior citizens learn something about the subject and can sit, and search, they can make money, looking up things for people who cannot afford to come here to look at a single book. Books on "how to do," are available in three areas of the city, or if not in stock, they'll get them. B. Dalton Booksellers, Cochrans and Walden's Book Shop. There are classes in ancestor hunting offered by the Lifetime Institution of Learning (listed also by some Community Schools in their brochures.





Most of this story has been handed down in my family and now today, we are not even sure of the spelling of the name of one of the main characters. My g-g-mother, Christinia Heinger (Heminger) came to Texas with her parents, Frederick and Rozenna Heinger and several brothers and sisters in 1834.

Frederick Heinger had a land grant for land in Wood, Smith and Houston counties, but they lived and died in Bastrop. At that time Texas was in a state of turmoil and they even made the trek to San Jacinto after the fall of the Alamo. One of the girls remembers the scalding of a small child by a pot of coffee. It seems as though a woman picked up a pot of coffee from the fire to pour a cup, but the coffee pot came apart in her hands and scalded a child by her side. Since there was no medication at hand, a handful of manure was used to spread over the burn. The child did survive this treatment.

Some time during the latter part of 1836, both Frederick and Rozenna died from Texas fever within days or hours of each other. The children were found by a neighbor and the children were still tugging at the parent's clothing trying to awaken them. A son, Conrad, died soon afterwards, leaving two sisters, Rachel, age 14, and Christinia, age 13. They were farmed out to neighbors and had a hard time. Rachel was staying with a family and they made a trip into town for supplies with plans to spend the night before going back home. Rachel did not like the family where she was to stay, so she went back to the farm alone, so she thought. However she was followed by some Indians bent on a little fun; they spent the night harassing her, running around the cabin, grunting like pigs, letting out the livestock, and overturning the milk in the dog-trot. The Indians left at sunrise, and Rachel spent the day cleaning up the mess and finding the loose livestock.

Rachel was the older of the two girls and married early to escape her ill fate. She married Edward Dickerson in 1841 and Christinia married soon after that. Rachel's wedding dress was made from a piece of white linen that Edward had taken from a band of Indians he had found riding with a long white streamer trailing behind them. No doubt the Indians had stolen the linen just for the fun of it, and really didn't have any use for it. Life wasn't easy for the two Heinger girls, and they often found themselves without a husband and moved back and forth with their children to the family that had a husband and father for the children. Between them, they had five marriages; but Christinia finally married my g-g-father, Thomas T. Williams and had eight children by him. Thomas T. was an orphan boy, born in Jefferson Co., KY; when he came to Texas from Missouri on a mule with the Conn family for his health. Texas must have agreeded with him for he lived to be 88 years old having worked most of his life as a blacksmith in Gonzales Co.

I am still working on the Williams and Conn families, and do not have the Williams family any further back than James Williams, father of Thomas T. Williams. The mother of Thomas was Amelia(Milly) Conn, the daughter of Mildred Ann Conley and Thomas Conn of Bullitt Co. KY.



#### WHO WAS DR. THOMAS DONNELL?

Dr. Thomas Donnell was on the tax list of Sumner County, Tennessee, as early as 1792. In 1793 he was one of the founding members of the Shiloh Presbyterian Church near Gallatin, Tn. In the April Term of the Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions a deed of conveyance for 320 acres from Edward Cox to Thomas Donnell was proved by Andrew Jackson. In 1795 and for several years after that Dr Donnell was member of the Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions. Dr. Donnell was a witness on the will of Isaac Bledsoe on 15 April 1795 and also on the will of Absolam Hall in 1806. Thomas Donnell and Adlia Donnell were both witnesses on the will of Joseph Motheral on 23 Oct 1815.

The census records for 1820 indicate that four young men (ages beteen 16-26), two young ladies, and one older lady (over 45) were living in the household of Thomas Donnell who was then in the "over 45" category. In the 1830 census, the household contained Thomas (70-80), three young men (30-40), one young lady (20-30), and three young boys.

I have identified two of Dr Donnell's sons, Levy and Persis. Persis was born 15 July 1796 and died 7 Oct 1832. Levy was the executor of his brother Persis' will. In his will, Persis named his three sons, John H., Thomas W., and William. From the will and the following probate actions, we gather that Persis, his wife, Sally Edwards Hassell Donnell, and their three sons were living in the household of Thomas Donnell during the 1830 census. Levy was also the executor of the will of his father. Dr Thomas Donnell. Dr Donnell's grave marker is reportedly among several Donnell graves in the Rice-Henly cemetary, 21 miles east of Gallatin, on the Scottsville Pike. The marker indicated that Dr Donnell died 8 Feb 1842, age 86. This would place his date of birth in 1755 or 1756. Dr Donnell, in his will, named son Levy, grandsons John Hassell Donnell, Thomas Whitfield Donnell, and William Donnell, plus three granddaughters Sophia, Harriet, and Eliza Bain, and another grandson, Robert Washington Donnell. Dr Donnell left his set of Scott's Family Bible commentaries to the three sons of Persis, and my wife, who is the great-granddaughter of John Hassell Donnell, has Volume III of that set. Levy was listed in the 1820 and 1840 census as a head of a household was apparently born during the 1880's. He died after 1846.

In the 1850 census records for Sumner County, the birth place of Robert W. Donnell is shown as North Carolina. Since Robert W. is probably the Robert Washington of Dr Donnell's will, we gathered that Dr. Donnell came from North Carolina and we have attempted to identify him from that end too. In North Carolina, we found two Thomas Donnells whose age's would approximate that of Dr Donnell. One was the son of Thomas Donnell, Sr, of Guilford County. This man reportedly became a

doctor and settled in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina; however, the census records of Mecklenburg County for the period 1790 - 1830 do not list a Thomas Donnell. It was noted that Robert King, a good friend of Dr. Donnell, and also a founding member of the Shiloh Church, and William McGee, the first pastor of that church, came from Mecklenburg County. There are several indications that Thomas Donnell was a medical doctorrather than a doctor of philosphy or of theology. For example, in the tax records he was listed as "Thomas Donnell, doctor", the inventory of his effects included "a lot of pills and bottles". Several other descendents of Thomas Donnell, Sr. did move to the Sumner County - Wilson County area of Tennessee. (Wilson County was carved out of Sumner in 1799.) There was a William Donnell on the Sumner County tax rolls as early as 1790, and William assumed the duties of Constable in Sumner Co. in 1792. This William Donnell is very probably a son of Thomas, Sr. The Adlia Donnell, who was a witness on the Motheral will, is very probably the son of Andrew and a grandson of Thomas Sr.

The other North Carolinian whose age approximated that of Dr Donnell was the son of Robert Donnell. This Robert Donnell, who is often referred to as Robert Donnell, the First, was also from Guilford County, and was a brother to Thomas Sr.. Robert's son was born about 1754, reportedly became a Presbyterian minister after the Revolutionary War, moved to Tennessee and, later on, to Missouri where he had the first Presbyterian Church west of the Mississippi River. A Thomas Donnell was ordained by the Orange Presbytery in North Carolina in 1782. Research indicates that a Rev. Thomas Donnell did arrive in Missouri about 1816 with two brothers, James and Eliel (or Eli). Reverend Donnell was a Presbyterian minister in and around Washington County, Missouri, for about 25 years. The 1830 census records indicate that Eli was between 40 - 50, James between 50 - 60, and Rev. Thomas also between 50-60. If he was born in the 1770's, this Rev. Thomas Donnell was about twenty years younger than the son of Robert Donnell the first. It also indicates that there were two Rev. Thomas Donnells for the one who went to Missouri, being born in the 1770's, was not the one ordained in 1782.

At this point we have no conclusive evidence that Dr. Thomas Donnell of Sumner County was either the son of Thomas Sr. or the son of Robert the first. Neither have we been able to eliminate either of the North Carolinians by definitely locating them in another part of the country when we know our Dr. Donnell was in Sumner County.



thrown over his shoulder with an air of lordly superiority - intellect and nobility stamped on every feature you would declare that he was a man born to govern. Dr. (Anson) Jones passed through the city last week on his way to Galveston. I was much pleased with him also though not so fascinated with him as I was with Old Sam. However he only made a call of about an hour and I could scarcely judge much about him. He insisted on my going to Austin with him and James. I was very anxious to go but James wouldnot let me, he says he will take me up when the Legislature meets which will be the sixteenth of Febry. - - - I have been in a constant whirl of excitement since I have been here that I cannot collect my thoughts sufficiently to write a letter. Remember me to all at your house and be sure to write directly you receive this. Your cousin Harriet"

"P.S. I forgot to tell you that James wife is the most exquisite little creature you ever saw. She asked me just now if I had put anything about her in my letter, I told her that I had so I must be as good as my word."

(James W. Scott married Isabella Theresa McConnell July 9, 1840, Harris Co.)

Harriet's father, Bennett Scott, died in Houston October 7, 1848. She met Hilliam R. Thomson, A Scotchman from Canada, a cotton broker. Their granddaughter, Mary Elizabeth Decherd, who taught mathematics at The University of Texas before her death in 1954, wrote this account. "The wedding date was near and all of the daughters of Bennett Scott were dressing in black. When Hilliam Thomson found that Harriet's wedding clothes were also black, he objected. Since Harriet said that all of her trousseau money was spent, the future groom insisted on handing her a roll of bills, which she sweetly accepted and went to the trouble of making by hand a new trousseau, which the sisters eagerly helped sew, since they received the discarded trousseau."

Harriet and William Thomson were married October 4, 1849. Their first child, Kate, was born August 16, 1850 in Houston, and they moved to Galveston later that year. Another daughter, Annie Bennett, was born in 1852, William Robertson Thomson was born in 1854 (drowned in the Colorado River at Bastrop in 1871), and James Scott Thomson was born in 1855. William Thomson died in Galveston April 30, 1861, and Harriet moved to Bastrop where her sisters were living.

Here is a newspaper account from a scrapbook of a happy reunion?

"After Nearly a Half Century. Mrs. Capt. F.W. Cozad is enjoying a visit from her eldest sister, Mrs. H.V. Thomson and daughter Annie of San Antonio, Texas, who arrived last week. This is the first time the two sisters have met in about 47 years — since Mrs. Cozad was about 10 years of age — when they separated at the old homestead in Richmond, Va., and Mrs. Cozad went to Cincinnati to live with her Uncle Price Purcell. ————married the Captain and came to Newton (Iowa).——No one can imagine the joy of the meeting of these two sisters after their long separation."

After the death of Harriet's daughter, Annie, a teacher in San Antonio in 1891, she came to Austin to live with her daughter, Kate, and her husband, George H. Decherd, and family. Kate died in 1919, and James Scott Thomson in 1906. At age 94 Harriet died October 17, 1917 and is buried in Fairview Cemetery in Bastrop with her children (all but Kate) and her sisters, Indie Sayers, Martha Fouchee, and Mary Elizabeth Scott. Bennett Scott, James H. and Isabella Scott were buried in the Episcopal Cemetery in Houston, which was moved to Brookside Cemetery in 1931, perhaps they are among the 36 unknown re-interred. William Thomson's grave was lost or covered over in the Calveston storm of 1900.

### HARRIET VIRGINIA SCOTT THOMSON

I remember my great grandmother as I was four years old when she died at age 94. Harriet Virginia Scott was born in Richmond, Va., November 15, 1823. Her parents were Bennett Scott from Scotland and Ann T. Pulliam, whose parents, Mosby Pulliam and Sally Timberlake, were native Virginians. Bennett Scott and Ann married in Henrico Co., Va., August 18, 1812.

Harriet lived with her family on the Main Street of Richmond near the office of the Southern Literary Messenger where Edgar Allan Pos worked and passed her house several times a day. Her school was having a May Day Celebration and Harriet was to say a greeting to the May Queen. Her cousin, Bartholomew Slade, an attorney and also a friend of Poe⁰s, took Harriet to the Messenger Office to ask Mr. Poe to write the lines for her. In those days Poe was considered a great poet. He wrote several stanzas and sent them to her the next day. An account of the Celebration and verses were printed in a pamphlet or periodical at the time. Many years later at the age of more than ninety years Harriet could recite one verse as follows:

## QUEEN OF MAY ODE

Fairies guard the Queen of May Let her reign in Peace and Honor--Every blessing be upon her; May her future pathway lie, All beneath a smiling sky.

Information for the above verse and preceding paragraph were on Page 164 of "The Complete Poems of EDGAR ALLAN POE", Collected, Edited and Arranged with Memoir, Textual Notes and Bibliography by J.H. Whitty - 1917.
----Later the entire poem was found and published in a local newspaper.---

Harriet was one of eight children. Her sisters were Martha Ann (Mrs. Martha Nickerson Fouchee), Indiana (1828-1887, Inda, 2nd wife of Dr. David Sayers, married 1854, and stepmother of Governor Joseph Sayers), Mary Elizabeth (Lizzie, who never married), and Sarah (Mrs. Felix Cozad, who lived with Aunt Sarah Purcell and Uncle Price Purcell, growing up in Cincinnati, Ohio). Her brother, James W. Scott (1816-1868) arrived in Texas on April 21, 1836, the day of the Battle of San Jacinto. He was paymaster of Sam Houston's Army, represented Harris Co. in the 3rd and 4th Legislatures, 1849-1853, a business partner of Francis R. Lubbock, (later Governor of Tex.), a lifelong friend of Peter W. Gray. A second brother, Bennett C., came to Texas, married and moved to Germany. Samuel T. Scott was the third brother.

After the death of Harriet's mother, Ann Pulliam Scott, James W. Scott persuaded his father to bring his family to Houston. They arrived in Galveston, Texas, on Christmas Day 1845. Harriet wrote her cousin, Bartholomew Slade, Esq., of Richmond, Va., telling of their safe arrival, saying that James came in a boat to greet them on their ship, and after a short stay at Mrs. Moffitt's, proceeded on to Houston. This letter is in the Barker Collection in The University of Texas Archives. The following is a direct quote of a description of her visitors in January 1846.- "General Houston and his wife called on us a few days ago. He is decidedly the most splendid looking man I ever saw, one of Nature's noblemen, the most intellectual countenance and the most fascinating address - if you were to see him walking up town with his Mexican blanket

An Offer from a THREATT. . . . . A new member writes that her grand-father was a circuit-riding minister (Methodist?), and left among his papers about two dozen marriage certificates. Most were from MS and LA but one was from TX: Jefferson, Marion County, Texas - Mr. Joe Scott and Miss Dessie Colgan were married 9 Aug 1918 by the Rev. Benjamin Franklin Threatt.

Our new member offers to make a copy of the original if you will send an SASE to Mrs. Joanna D. Goodwin, 12319 Inglewood Ave, Hawthorne CA 90250. Mrs. Goodwin is looking for any information on the THREATT surname. Let's repay her kindness by writing to her if we have any such data.

In the Austin phone book, Threatt is outnumbered by THWEATT five to one. I suspect that both names were derived from THWAITE, the Old Morse word for a piece of forest land cleared and converted to field or meadow. The word was often used in English names such as Stonethwaite, Goldthwaite, and (A)Postlethwaite (which may now be seen as Postalweight!). The English have long been strong on giving names to their fields, farms, houses, and estates, and many took their surnames from their place of origin.


For the Channel family, may I suggest "Root Canal"; for Johnson families of the Southwest, "Grass Roots"; for the Hogg clan, "Root,


