TEXAS VOLUNTEER UNITS IN THE MEXICAN WAR 1846-48

When the United States declared war against Mexico on 13 May 1846, President Polk was authorized by Congress to call for 50,000 volunteers. "More volunteers flocked to the colors than could be taken; they had to draw lots," stated Fairfax Downey in Texas and the War with Mexico (American Heritage Junior Library, 1961).

Needless to say, Texans were especially eager to get into the action, for there had been several incursions by Mexican forces into the Republic of Texas since it had been wrested from Mexico in 1836. Now that the State of Texas was the borderland between the United States and Mexico, she wanted that boundary clearly defined.

For a modern version of the causes and outcome of the Mexican War, I can recommend Seymour V. Connor's Adventure in Glory (Austin: Steck-Vaughn, 1965; pp. 238-48). Many fine books have been written on the subject; for an early Texas historian's account I consulted John Henry Brown's History of Texas (Vol. II, pp. 318-44).

According to The Handbook of Texas (Vol. I, p. 185), 8,018 Texans enlisted during the War with Mexico.

The National Archives Microfilm Publications Microcopy No. 278 consists of the "Compiled Service Records of Volunteer Soldiers Who Served During the Mexican War in Organizations from the State of Texas." (Some of these organizations included non-Texans, of course.)

Roll 1 covers names beginning A-S in the First Texas Mounted Rifles. There are 19 rolls of this microfilm in all, so this will be a continuing feature in AGS Quarterly into the unforeseeable future!

The jacket-envelope for each soldier typically contains (1) card abstracts of entries relating to the soldier as found in original muster rolls, returns, and pay vouchers; and (2) originals of any papers relating solely to that soldier. Space does not permit my giving all the available information; if you find hereinafter the name of a man you are interested in, by all means look him up on the microfilm (at Texas State Library, for example). This is not difficult because they are well alphabetized, but different clerks spelled names variously, so don't be so shortsighted as to reject a Hofman because of the number of f's or n's. There are cross references to variant spellings.

This compilation of records was begun about 1891 by the Record and Pension Division of the War Department, and was double checked for accuracy.

Preceding the envelopes of each organizational unit are record-of-events cards indicating the station(s) of the unit and occasionally details of its activities. These are quite dim, so I was unable to devote the time necessary to decipher them, much as I'd have liked to include a brief history of each unit. However, excellent details regarding the service of these soldiers can be found in Texas Volunteers in the Mexican War by Henry W. Barton (Waco: Texian Press, 1970). From the book (based on these microfilmed records, inter al.) I compiled a list of the First Texas Mounted Rifles' field and staff officers and a table of company letters, full names of captains, and places of recruitment, which will appear at the end of the table of soldiers herein.

If your Mexican War veteran does not appear in any of the subsequent lists, it may be because: (1) He did not serve in a Texas unit; (2) He used a different name or spelling; (3) His records got lost; (4) References in the records were too vague to identify him; or (5) He served in the Regular Army.

If application for a pension or a bounty-land warrant was made, see pertinent files of the Veterans' Administration.

FIRST TEXAS MOUNTED RIFLES

(Record Group 94, Records of the Office of the Adjutant General)

Most of the men of this regiment enlisted for six months, many at the home town of their respective captain. Others joined the regiment after it was encamped at Point Isabel or nearby Fort Polk (both in Cameron County, Texas); at Matamoros, Mexico, etc. The majority were mustered out at "Monteray" (Monterrey, Mexico) on 2 Oct 1846.

The regimental commander was Col. John Coffee (Jack) Hays, a renowned captain in the Texas Rangers, who brought many of his rangers into Federal service with him. Jack Hays distinguished himself in the battles at Monterrey and Mexico City, and later in civil life in California where he had gone during the 1849 Gold Rush. Therefore, he does not appear on the 1850 census of Texas; the same applies to Capt. Christopher Acklin/Ackland and perhaps others.

The regimental return for June 1846 shows the First Regiment of Texas Mounted Rifles stationed at Point Isabel (near the mouth of the Rio Grande) except companies A and H which were at Matamoros and Co. K at Camargo. Although present-day maps show two neighboring towns in Mexico named Camargo (prefixed Ciudad and San Miguel), Ciudad Camargo (founded in 1749) seems to be the one referred to in Mexican War records (The Handbook of Texas, Vol. III, pp. 136-37).

Additional Details Taken from Census. As I abstracted military data about these men from the microfilm, I began to wonder how many returned to Texas and founded families. The 1850 Census being the logical place to find out, I started with Jackson, Teebles and Meyer's Texas 1850 Census Index (Accelerated Indexing Systems). This reveals a man's given name, county, and page on the original census.

Next I turned to The State of Texas, Federal Population Schedules, 7th Census of U.S., 1850, transcribed by Mrs. V. K. Carpenter. Her index gives only surnames, but matching a county name from the other index with page numbers for that county in her book narrowed the search down considerably.

If a name on the census was not identical with that of the soldier but it was in the county in which he enlisted, I copied the census data, and placed an asterisk before the soldier's name in the first table. Allowing for variant spellings, I looked for Benbridge under Bin, Bain, etc.; for Enoch Bell I tried Beal, Beall, Beel, Behl, Beil, Bell. But with a common name such as Bell, I rejected the initial E alone unless it was in the very town where Enoch had enlisted.

N.B. We usually assume that the first woman named in the census listing is the man's wife, but we should bear in mind that she could be his mother (taking care of his motherless children), his sister, sister-in-law, daughter, daughter-in-law, cousin, niece, aunt, or his aunt-in-law--and still have his surname!

The census information abstracted from these two books follows the military data table.


In Texas Volunteers in the Mexican War, Henry W. Barton devotes pages 27-35 to the organization of the 1st Regiment, Texas Mounted Rifles. From that section was compiled the following list of field and staff officers and the table of company letters, captains, and places of recruitment or mustering in.

Field and Staff Officers: John C. Hays, colonel; Samuel H. Walker, lieutenant colonel; Michael H. Chevallie, major; Charles A. Harper, adjutant; James M. Alexander, quartermaster; Charles W. Tait, surgeon, resigned 6 Sep and was succeeded by Henry W. Baylor; Francis McKay, assistant surgeon; Morgan L. Payne, sergeant major, returned to Company E as first sergeant and was succeeded by Silas B. Hart, 10 Sep.



BOOK REVIEW

NUGGETS: A GLIMPSE BACKWARD. © 1977 by Rado McKnight Peak, 1109 Northwood Drive, Jewells 50, Marble Falls TX 78654. 8½ x 11"; card cover; pp. ix + 123. Order from author; \$15.

Although not strictly a genealogical book, NUGGETS: a glimpse backward should appeal to many family historians. It consists of nostalgic essays on a wide range of subjects, several emotional poems composed by the author and her granddaughter, and a sprinkling of Mrs. Peak's favorite quotations. It is not clear whether all the poems are original or not.

On the title page (of the copy she sent to the Reference Division or Public Services Department of Texas State Library) is pasted a photograph of the author's first great-grandson, to whom the book is dedicated. The last page is a copy of the floor plan of the White House Family Quarters; that will give you an idea of the diversity of interests entertained by this sprightly author.

An indication that she eschews rigid molds is the absence of a pattern in the naming of the "pieces"--some titles are one word and some are whole sentences. No slave to conventional style, Texarado insists that she be called Rado "with a long a," Colorado to the contrary. Yet she signs herself "Mack" to her close friends.

Despite extensive hearing and sight loss, repeated eye surgery, and confinement to a nursing home, this indomitable little lady has retained her sense of humor--one can sense the twinkle in her eye in many of her one- or two-page essays.

The nostalgic ones touch on such subjects as dress styles in Mrs. Peak's childhood, her first introduction to the sewing machine, the telephone, the horseless carriage, the airplane. A very poignant memory of what the death of a loved one means to a child; early school days and teachers; social customs and principles; homely remedies and use of herbs; and borrowing money with no collateral but character are some of the topics treated with warm insight.

Then there are genealogical nuggets, all emphasizing the superiority of Scotsmen over mere mortals. And the author is honest to a fault to include a letter of rebuff she received when she had the audacity to ask a museum to return an old family clock!

Characteristic of Rado McKnight Peak's sense of humor are such sketches as "Time To Milk the Cow," "Unexpected Guests," and "And Still Numbered with the Living" about the numbers we all bear.

"Austin--A City of Perpetual Moonlight" reveals some interesting information, as well as the now-amusing attitude toward the tower lights in the beginning. Because of the elimination of darkness, "The optimist pictured strawberries like pineapples, while the pessimist viewed with alarm the possibility of chopping weeds with an ax!"

NUGGETS is rounded out by several serious articles treating on such topics as a cure for worry (p. 83), "Hearing Loss," "Slow Start in the First Grade," "My Trip to New York," and "How Does the Mind Work?"

All in all, this is a delightful book to browse in, and an example to be emulated by many people whose written memories would be as beneficial to the writer as to the reader.

HOLLYWOOD'S HEX ON HOSKINS

Hollywood has done it again to my maiden name, and I'm furious! An episode of "Little House on the Prairie" featured a character referred to as "Big Dumb Luke Hoskins." His father, a feisty little blacksmith for contrast, could have been the brother of "Jelly" Hoskins, an unshaven banty rooster of a man who was the chuck wagon boss of an interminable cattle drive on TV a few years back. In a present-day episode of "CHiPs" "Farmer Hoskins" (in striped overalls) was a cattle rustler, and an unsuccessful one at that!

I first noticed this conspiracy to disparage the name Hoskins back in the days when most magazines carried a full page of jokes. Remember the format?

Farmer: (asks stupid question)

Traveling Salesman: (gives smart-alec answer)

Sometimes names would be assigned to these stereotyped roles, such as Worldly W. Sharpe, Bunker Bradshaw, and Country Pumpkin Hoskins. I've seen Rube Hoskins, Si Hoskins, Clem Hoskins--always the butt of the joke.

Why is it that Hollywood has "typecast" the name Hoskins as denoting a numbskull, a hick, a minor character who evokes a snicker every time he appears on the screen?

The name, according to a credible authority, is derived from the Anglo-Saxon Hodge (a familiar form of Roger) plus the diminutive suffix -kin or -kins, originally meaning offspring. In many old records the name was spelled Hodgekins and even Hotchkins (as I saw when researching in England), but the middle consonant sound was eventually worn down to s. What's so ridiculous or rustic about that?

True enough, many Hoskinses have been farmers and ranchers, often owning vast quantities of land. Colonial records show that they had early grants in Virginia and North Carolina; no doubt their ancestors in England also were land owners, for coats of arms were granted to several of the name.

On the other hand, some of our kinsmen have been prosperous merchants and respected office holders. Many have been leaders in the military and naval forces of their country. Men named Hoskins have also been painters (one a miniaturist of kings), judges, statesmen, doctors, bankers, clergymen--all kinds of dignitaries, as is true of most surnames.

I wish that just once Hollywood would call a handsome, suave, sophisticated hero Hilary Howard Hoskins!
