TEXAS VOLUNTEER UNITS IN THE MEXICAN WAR 1846-1848
Part 5

This continuing feature is a compilation of data found in the National Archives Microfilm Publications Microcopy No. 278. This consists of 19 rolls of microfilm of the "Compiled Service Records of Volunteer Soldiers Who Served During the Mexican War in Organizations from the State of Texas." (Some of these organizations no doubt included non-Texans, but The Handbook of Texas (I:185) states that 8,018 Texans enlisted during the War with Mexico.)

The jacket-envelope for each soldier typically contains (1) card abstracts of entries relating to the soldier as found in original muster rolls, returns, and pay vouchers; and (2) originals of any papers relating solely to that soldier.

For further explanation of this feature, see pp. 113-114 of AGS Quarterly XIX:4.

The organizing of the companies, battalions and regiments was far too complicated for me to attempt to summarize; interested readers can find books that treat the subject in greater or lesser depth. The only sources I happened to have at home are Texas and the War with Mexico (American Heritage Publishing Co., 1961), Texas Volunteers in the Mexican War (Henry W. Barton, 1970), and Dayton Kelley's article "The Texas Mounted Rifles in Mexico" in Soldiers of Texas (Texian Press, 1973).

As the result of reorganizing when some enlistments ran out, some men of the 1st Texas Mounted Rifles became members of the 1st Mounted Volunteers (12 months) under Col. John Coffee Hays. Many had scouted with him as members of ranging companies formed to protect the frontiers of Texas against marauding Indians, and continued to live up to their reputation as "wild Texas Rangers."

Thinking that readers would be interested in knowing how many of these soldiers remained in Texas after the war, we have looked them up on the 1850 census. In Part 1 we found a name in Accelerated Indexing Systems' index which seemed likely to be the same as a given soldier, and noted what page of what county's return he was on. Then we laboriously sought an identical man in Mrs. Carpenter's index and transcription. Since then, we have bypassed Mrs. Carpenter's voluminous work and gone directly to the microfilmed census.

Therefore, in the list which follows, an asterisk precedes each name which bears a reasonable resemblance to one that appears in the 1850 census. With the more common names there is, of course, less assurance of identity. By showing all the details given in the census, we hope to enable readers to locate their ancestors. Many may be found in the Handbook, especially Volume III, the supplement.




BONANZA! A GOLD MINE OF SPECIAL
MICROFILM IN THE GENEALOGY SECTION
OF TEXAS STATE LIBRARY

Some of us are unaware that the Texas State Library possesses any microfilm besides the census rolls. True enough, in the dark caverns of those metal file drawers lies a fabulously rich deposit of census reports: all that exist for every state, 1790 through 1900, plus the 1880 Soundex (index) for Texas, Mississippi, and South Carolina, AND the 1900 Soundex for Texas and Oklahoma.

But there is a vast treasure of other microfilm accessible to the diligent digger; in addition to the rich veins of official Texas records, such as tax rolls and many others, the mine has been "salted" with gold nuggets donated by individuals (notably AGS member Lucie Clift Price) pertaining to an assortment of other states.

The next time you go down into the mines, enter the Genealogy shaft on the first level of the Lorenzo de Zavala Library and beam your miner's lamp at the book labeled "Microfilm Holdings in the Genealogy Collection of the Texas State Library." Study it carefully and then you'll see that you may make a lucky strike if you dig into such veins as:

Index to heads of households on the Texas census -- all counties for 1850; counties Anderson through Guadalupe plus Panola for 1860--11 rolls.

TX Agricultural Schedules 1850-80.

TX Social Statistics, 1850-70 (value of real estate; educational institutions; libraries; newspapers; churches, etc.--by counties).

Book Reviews

FINDING AIDS TO THE MICROFILMED MANUSCRIPT COLLECTION OF THE GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY OF UTAH, Roger M. Haigh, Editor, University of Utah Press, Salt Lake City UT 84112. #1: PRELIMINARY SURVEY OF THE MEXICAN COLLECTION by Susan M. Cottler, Roger M. Haigh, and Shirley A. Weathers. 216 pp. \$12 paperback. #2: PRELIMINARY SURVEY OF THE GERMAN COLLECTION by Ronald Smiser with Thomas Dullien and Heribert Hinrichs. 630 pp., \$20 paperback.

"The vast genealogical archives of the Mormon Church are being made accessible to scholars, librarians and students throughout the world by the University of Utah Press in a series entitled Finding Aids to the Microfilmed Manuscript Collection of the Genealogical Society of Utah", their brochure announces.

The series will consist of three types of publications:

1. The preliminary survey to give a researcher definite information about the holdings of parish and civil registers in large national collections. As these will indicate regions where records are missing, study of a given survey beforehand will prevent disappointment to those planning to go to use the collection. Also, a patron may write ahead and request that certain rolls be available on his arrival, thus saving time.
2. The descriptive inventory, a more precise bibliographic instrument, classifies and records manuscripts and indicates film footage, with extensive cross references.
3. The bibliographic guide will focus on smaller collections of heretofore uncataloged material. Requiring careful reading of each roll in order to make a precise description and cross references, the guides are planned only for collections the Society regards as complete.

Most genealogical researchers know that the Genealogical Society of Utah (the Mormon Church's genealogical library) has the largest collection of filmed manuscripts in the world, and that they generously allow non-members to use it. "The declared intention of the Society is 'to gather records on everyone who has ever lived', " an astonishing--perhaps utopian--but highly desirable goal.

The next three books in the series (which I hope to have the privilege of reviewing) are descriptive inventories of (a) the English Collection and (b) the New York Collection, to be followed by Preliminary Survey of the French Collection. All these vast genea-

logical archives are thus being made accessible to researchers everywhere but, unfortunately, the film rental price has been so drastically raised that the information is out of the reach of many of us. Therefore, reading these surveys is somewhat tantalizing.

The books sent us for review are beautifully typed and generously spaced. They have three or four photographs each - maps and facsimiles of typical manuscript pages. Each has a lengthy and interesting introduction, in one of which it is revealed that sometimes "archives insist that the Society microfilm material with little or no genealogical significance before they will grant access to material high on the Society's list of priorities." Therefore, these collections contain data of great value to scholars and historians who have no interest in personal statistics per se.

For example, for the Archdiocese of Mexico, a collection of 341 rolls entitled "Documentos y Expedientes, etc. 1534-1966" was imprecisely described in the card catalog as Ecclesiastical Council Records, Citation Orders, Tithing Records, Royal Provisions and Bills, Miscellaneous Letters, Votes, Medical Certificates, Parish Land and Monthly Accounts, Ministers' Writings and Petitions, Court Accounts, Royal Decrees, Papal Bulls, Documents and Communications. Preliminary Survey of the Mexican Collection devotes a paragraph each to these topics, really revealing the nature of the records.

The body of the book describes the Society's holdings for 28 states in Mexico, plus City/parish Censuses, some dating as far back as 1617, with the latest being 1945.

The huge Preliminary Survey of the German Collection lists 42 archives filmed for the German Collection, including cities in the Netherlands, France, Strasbourg, Poland, etc. The survey is in three parts: Territories Now Part of the Federal Republic of Germany (West Germany); Territories Now Part of the German Democratic Republic (East Germany); and Territories Formerly Part of the German Empire, now Within the Borders of France, Poland, or the Soviet Union.

The non-parish records have been grouped under the headings of Guild, Migration, Legal, Medical, Military, Municipal, Provincial, Genealogical, and Jewish Records, plus "Diamonds in the Rough" (alphabetical listing by land of those communities from which the Society has material, along with information showing what kind of material, etc.).

The Guild Records consist of membership lists and financial records. Almost four pages of occupations (in German or English) should prove helpful.

Of primary importance to genealogists are the Migration Records; e.g. Hamburg Passenger Lists cover all of that city's emigrants between 1850 and 1934. Manna from heaven for some fortunate seekers, they give date of departure, name of ship and captain, the passenger's name, sex, age, place of origin, occupation, number

of accompanying family members, and destination.

Under "Genealogical Records" is an interesting example of the Genealogical research undertaken during the Third Reich to determine if a family had any Jewish blood. If you have ancestors who lived in the area of Mittelfranken, you MUST see the Brenner Collection of Ahnentafel (lineages).

I didn't dream that I, possessing not one drop of German blood (I consider Charlemagne French or Frankish) or word of the language, would become so fascinated with this book! If you have German connections you really should examine it. And if you have Mexican ancestors (or perhaps some unreconstructed Rebels who went there after the Civil War), Number 1 of the Series is a must.



WATERS-TURNER-WILSON-HATCH FAMILIES OF MARYLAND: ANCESTORS OF SHELAH WATERS AND NANCY TURNER. Compiled by Jean Young Kent; text by Harry Wright Newman. Privately published by the Young family and copyrighted in 1979. 86 pp. + over 4 pages of index. Illustrated with portraits, drawings, maps, charts, and facsimiles of documents.

This is a handsome and scholarly family history -- elegant with its slick white cover and printer's type in contrast with the typewriter type that soaring costs have forced on most genealogies today. The text, accompanied by footnotes showing the source of each document cited, was written by the eminent historian-genealogist Harry Wright Newman who first researched and wrote about the Waters family forty years ago. The present volume is evidence of the intensity of his research, but a complaint might be made that, having such a thorough knowledge of early Maryland records himself, he sometimes fails to explain points that are obscure to the un-initiate of today.


The Young family are to be commended for their choice of title which, though long, instantly reveals the subject to a time-pressed researcher. Thankfully they did not follow the lead of a predecessor who wrote a biography of Shelah Waters and modestly entitled it "The Perpetuity of Goodness".

One very helpful feature of Waters-Turner etc. is a table of descendants of Shelah and Nancy (Turner) Waters down through their grandchildren, showing vital statistics, spouses' names and sometimes the number of children they had. In the Preface Jean (Young) Kent expressed the hope of producing a companion volume that will bring names of descendants down to the present.

The book is rich with quotations of and full abstracts from documents, with complete citation so that one may write to the Hall of Records for copies (if you have the address).

The four families named in the title (plus Carnell/Cornell, Dement, Dent, Chapman, Haly?, Sley?, Young, Branch, Phillips, Taylor, Neal, Moore, et al.) are clearly tied together by chart and text. As a bonus, there are enough personal details to make it interesting as well as informative. Mr. Newman tabulated the forms of Colonial or Revolutionary War service performed by these prominent men, which render descendants eligible for membership in patriotic organizations.

The appearance of this excellent book is enhanced by wide margins and generous spacing, and there is a minimum of typographical errors to distract the reader. This reviewer was not informed if there are any copies for sale; interested seekers may inquire of AGS member Clarice (Mrs. Joe W.) Neal, who did cemetery research for the book; or the compiler at 4066 Mattison Avenue, Fort Worth, Texas 76107.



EAST TEXAS GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY SURNAME INDEX, Volume I 1977, compiled by Brenda Springfield and Janice Brown, 62 pp.; Volume II 1978, compiled by Frances Faircloth, 45 pp.

These surname indexes have a very attractive front cover drawing of covered wagons, and an outline map of Texas counties in 1840 on the back.

They contain numbered lists of members---the first 143 (charter members) are alphabetized. The society was formed in April 1977 and by November had enrolled the amazing total of 259 members. The second year, holdover members were listed only if there was a change in name or address; new ones brought the total to an enviable 455.

The second part, the index to surnames that members are researching, is nearly arranged in two columns. Under the surname in all caps is the name of a state with a county further indented under it, followed by the number(s) of the member(s) who are seeking that name in that county, and so on---all in alphabetical order.

It's a commendable start toward getting the members acquainted with each others' interests, but a lot of stamps can be wasted inquiring about Scotts in Virginia and Johnsons in Tennessee (not even a county, much less a date or given name). Although this reviewer is writing a Brown genealogy, she is not tempted to spend time writing to #262 whose Browns are just "in Canada"!

It is thought that William moved his family to Bastrop (later Travis) Co, TX, after the birth of son William Jeff Sanders. His land was about 9 miles northeast of Austin; his neighbors were:

James Manor, Philip McElroy, Reuben Hornsby, John B. Walters, Margaret Castro, Oliver Buckman, James Manning, James Gilleland.

After her husband's death (before March 1838?), Elizabeth M. Sanders moved to Shelby Co, where son Richard (b. 1827) married a Sarah (Knight? He had a brother-in-law named Thomas J. Knight, but that could be a sister's husband) and moved to Upshur Co by 1851.

Have many records confirming these statements, but wish more data on the children of Wm. H. Sanders: Richard, possibly David (b. 1830?), William Jeff (b. 1834). Did a daughter marry Richard Hooper? Was Mary E. Sanders a daughter or daughter-in-law?---Mrs. Chessie-Lou Pollary, 1890 Foothill Dr, Salt Lake City UT 84108.

MORE ABOUT NICKNAMES



Members of Austin Genealogical Society who have seen the handsome quarterly of the North Carolina Genealogical Society know what a fine publication it is. The Journal, now in Volume V, contains valuable information from all over the state--the last issue had items about three of my eight widespread NC lines, but that's not only why I am recommending it! Your editor firmly believes that everyone with ancestors in the Old North State should subscribe to this excellent quarterly, or join the Society if near enough to participate.

Now the Society has embarked on a project that should be of tremendous value to those who would like to exchange information with others working on their North Carolina family lines. It is planning to publish AN INDEX TO NORTH CAROLINA SURNAMES, made up of persons who lived, however briefly, in the state. Target date for publication is early 1980, so would-be contributors must not delay. They will be notified of the release date of the book. FEES are \$1 for the first ancestor entered and 50¢ for each additional one. On reverse is an entry form which may be Xeroxed to save time, or forms can be ordered (address at bottom).

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING OUT ANCESTOR FORMS for NORTH CAROLINA SURNAME INDEX

1. Enter only those ancestors who lived in North Carolina. For those who did not marry or die or were not born in NC please use column "Other NC County of Residence".
2. Enter ONE SURNAME per sheet. Write the surname for that sheet in the space provided in the upper right hand corner. Do not repeat surname on numbered ancestor lines.
3. Please read carefully the statement in italics. Sign and date it - ancestors entered on sheets which lack this signature will not be printed in the book.
4. Put your name and address where indicated. If you are a member of the Society or a subscriber to the Journal enter that information in parentheses after your name.
5. Fill out all above-the-line information for every sheet sent to us.
6. Enter available information on each ancestor of that surname in spaces provided on the form. If a date is approximate write it "c1789", "c1800", etc. If you are not sure of a place write "?VA", "?PA", "?Halifax", etc.
7. If date, place, or spouse is not known, either leave the space blank or put "?". Do not use "Unknown" or "unk"
8. Use abbreviations for states and countries in the "place" column. [ex. VA, SC, ENG, IRE, GER, etc.] Write county names in full.
9. If an ancestor married more than once: (a) enter information on 1st marriage on the line immediately below that ancestor line - put "1" in (); (b) skip next ancestor line and enter 2nd marriage on next marriage line - put "2" in (); (c) continue in this manner until all marriages for that ancestor are entered before going on to enter the next ancestor.
10. When entering the names of married women either as Spouse or as separate entry, use "Mrs. Mary Jane (JONES) JOHNSON, SMITH - the name in () being the lady's maiden name followed by surnames of previous husbands in the order in which she married them. The book will have a Spouse Index, but only by entering female ancestors separately will their dates of birth and death appear.
11. Do not fill in the "sheet ___ of ___" at the lower right hand corner of the form.
12. If possible, enter documentation for ancestor information on back of the entry form, using the same ancestor number as appears on the front of the form.




