TEXAS VOLUNTEER UNITS IN THE MEXICAN WAR 1846-1848 Part 7

This continuing feature is a compilation of data found in the National Archives Microfilm Publications Microcopy No. 278. This consists of 19 rolls of microfilm of the "Compiled Service Records of Volunteer Soldiers Who Served During the Mexican War in Organizations from the State of Texas." (Some of these organizations no doubt included non-Texans, but <u>The Handbook of Texas</u> (I:185) states that 8,018 Texans enlisted during the War with Mexico.)

The jacket-envelope for each soldier typically contains (1) card abstracts of entries relating to the soldier as found in original muster rolls, returns, and pay vouchers; and (2) originals of any papers relating solely to that soldier.

For further explanation of this feature, see pp. 113-114 of AGS Quarterly XIX:4.

The organizing of the companies, battalions and regiments was far too complicated for me to attempt to summarize; interested readers can find books that treat the subject in greater or lesser depth. Mrs. W. H. Ligon (to whom we are indebted for transcribing these service records from the microfilm) recently sent me several listings of Mexican War titles, including some 65 that are held in the Barker History Center. Interested researchers, be advised!

As the result of reorganizing when some enlistments ran out, some men of the 1st Texas Mounted Rifles became members of the 1st Mounted Volunteers (12 months) under Col. John Coffee Hays. Many had scouted with him as members of ranging companies formed to protect the frontiers of Texas against marauding Indians, and continued to live up to their reputation as "wild Texas Rangers."

Thinking that readers would be interested in knowing how many of these soldiers remained in Texas after the war, we have looked them up on the 1850 census. First we examine the Accelerated Index to the 1850 Census of Texas for a name that closely resembles that of a soldier. When there are several, we look on the microfilm at one in the county where he enlisted, if we have his age to check against. If the microfilm is illegible, we consult Mrs. V. K. Carpenter's printed 1850 census of Texas.

Therefore, in the list which follows, an asterisk precedes each name which bears a reasonable resemblance to one that appears in the 1850 census. With the more common names there is, of course, less assurance of identity. REMEMBER: These are just possibilities—we do not guarantee that the man on the census was the soldier. But by showing all the details given in the census, we hope to enable the readers to locate their ancestors. Many may be found in the <u>Handbook of Texas</u>, especially Volume III, the new supplement.

OKLAHOMAN SEEKS CENTRAL TEXAS ANCESTORS

Armstrong - Burleson - Christopher - Coquat - Davis - Gage - Pierce -Pilcher - Priest - Whitehead

Recent correspondence with a reader in Oklahoma who had ancestors in Bastrop and Hays counties renews my regret that the Hays County Historical & Genealogical Society no longer publishes a quarterly. hope that our readers in Bastrop, San Marcos, Buda and Gonzales may be

able to supply some information.

Mrs. Marie (Armstrong) Pierce (Box 765, Ringling OK 73456) writes that her 6-great-grandfather Aaron BURLESON was born about 1690 in Durham England. In 1726 he came to America by way of Caerleon, Monmouth, Wales; they landed at Baltimore MD and migrated to North Carolina. He died in 1763 in Rutherford Co. He and his wife Sarah (need all data) had children named Thomas, Aaron Jr, Jesse, Edward, Daniel, James and John.

Mrs. Pierce knows very little about Aaron Jr, except that he married "after 1748" a lady named Rachel. In 1781 or '82 he was killed

by Indians on Clinch River in Tennessee.

Their son Joseph Sr was born 1 Feb 1770 in Buncombe Co, NC and married Nancy GAGE there 29 Feb 1790. She is said to have been "an Indian princess"--details desired. Born 19 June 1772, she died 19 Jan 1815 in Madison Co, AL. Their children were: James, John, Mary E./ Polly, Jonathan, Rachel, Aaron III and Joseph.

In 1833 Joseph Sr came to Bastrop Co, TX, where he died 2 Aug 1849 and was buried in Burleson Cemetery (on land he had donated) near

Smithville.

Their daughter Mary E., called Polly, was born 2 Jan 1798 (in NC or AL?). When and where did she die? Her husband, Richard PRIEST (b. ca 1796) in 1857 was in Gonzales TX and signed an affidavit that he knew his brother-in-law James was "in the war 1814." [Polly seems to have had an uncle in the War of 1812 also--see James Burleson (b. 1758,

son of Aaron) in <u>Handbook of Texas</u>, I:249.]
Only known children of Richard and Mary E. Priest were (a) Elizabeth, and (b) Mary E. (also called Polly) who married Henry Harvey WHITEHEAD. He was born 13 Feb 1821 in TN & died (when?) at Jeddo TX in southern Bastrop Co; established in 1860s; had post office 1874-1927]. Polly Priest was born 13 Feb 1826 in TN & died in 1865 at Crockett, Harris [Houston?] Co, TX. Their children: Joseph, William Richard, Mary Ann, William Monroe, Aaron, William Munroe [sic].

The second son, Richard Whitehead (b. 29 Apr 1846, TX; d. 29 Sep 1897) was buried in the Jeddo Cemetery. After being a circuit-riding preacher for a number of years, he "quit the church and became some sort of Law [officer] or detective." (He was called "Colonel Dick.") the course of his duties, he was killed as he stepped off a train--at

Rosanky?

Richard's wife, Martha E. CHRISTOPHER, was born in June 1848 in Mississippi & died 10 Dec 1934 [Ed. Note: I guess this is what she meant; she wrote 12-10-1934] at Oakville TX [Live Oak Co]. She was buried in Jeddo Cemetery, Bastrop Co; her parents, John and Minerva, were interred at Cedar Creek (Cedarvale) near the town of Bastrop.

Martha and Richard Whitehead's children were Sallie, Rebecca, Mary*, Fannie, Minerva, John, Henry and Aaron.

[Ed. Note: Can anyone connect the above Whiteheads with this group in my BROWN line?

*Mary Whitehead (b. 1867; d. 1890 Jeddo TX) in 1882 married Lucian Claude COQUAT (b. 1866/7 near Paris France). His parents were killed in an accident and he was raised by sisters Louise and Marie until placed in a Catholic boarding school. His brothers August & Joseph brought him to America. Lucian & Mary's children were Janie (died young), Sarah/Sallie Rachel, and Rebecca. After Mary's death he married her sister Rebecca and had Lucian, Leon, Mathew, Gladys L., Julia K. & Idell.

Sarah/Sallie Coquat was born 12 Aug 1885 at Jeddo, Bastrop Co, TX and died 6 June 1980 at Ringling OK (buried in Ringling Memorial Cemetery). On 8 Aug 1903 she married Barney Roland ARMSTRONG** who was born 6 Jan 1882 at Kyle, Hays Co, TX and died 1 Jan 1919 at Stamford, Jones Co, TX. Their children were Jasper, Marie Iva, William Lee (died in childhood at Lueders, Jones Co, TX), Roland Debbs, Glenora Pearl (died at age of 4 in Stamford), and Maurice Gabriel.

Marie Iva Armstrong was born 22 June 1906 in Live Oak Co, TX. She married Oliver Frederick <u>PIERCE</u> (b. 8 Mch 1908 at Calvin OK), son of John Oliver & Minerva (Solomon) Pierce. Mr. Pierce had one son, Vernon L., by a previous marriage.

**Barney Roland was the son of William Jasper ARMSTRONG who was born in 1845 near Tallassee, Tallapoosa Co, AL. [By county division, Tallassee fell into Elmore Co in 1866.] Barney Roland's mother was Anieas <u>DAVIS</u> (need data). William Jasper and his brother Sherman settled in Texas after the Civil War, the former purchasing land in Live Oak Co near present-day Three Rivers. Both had large families and were sons of

BOOK REVIEW by Wanda O. Hickey

KINGDOM COME: KINGDOM GO: by M. Jourdan Atkinson and Eugene Giles. 261 pp.; photos; complete index; \$11.95. Order from Eakin Publications, Eakin Press - Nortex Press, Box 178, Burnet TX 78611.

This well-documented book is the story of Frederic and Harriet Jourdan who arrived in the Republic of Texas in 1839 and settled on Walnut Creek. Much detail on day-to-day happendings and life on Walnut and Gilliland creeks and surrounding communities is told. The Jourdans raised ten children, and each of their stories is told, covering a 100-year period. A genealogy chart is included in the book, along with photographs of family members, which make it most appealing to family historians. The reader learns much of the history of areas east and northeast of Austin in such places as Sprinkle, Fisk-ville, Corn Hill, Gilesburg, and Greggs Corner.

This interesting book is the work of cousins Eugene Victor Giles and M. Jourdan Atkinson, grandchildren of Frederic and Harriet Jourdan. Today, the homesite of the Jourdans is the Jourdan-Bachman Park which is managed by the Austin Natural Science Association. It is an educational center for the teaching of cultural history and an adjoining seventy-five acres has been converted into a pioneer farm.
