



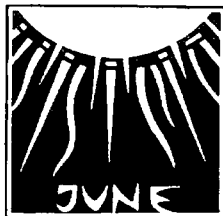

From the Family History Center, 100 E. Rutherford:

INDEX TO COMPILED SERVICE RECORDS

If a patron at an LDS Family History Center orders a military film that has as part of its title, INDEX TO COMPILED SERVICE RECORDS, he may be disappointed with the amount of information he finds. These 16mm films target a specific war and state. They give the soldier's name, his military assignment and his rank. Rarely do these index cards give any details of the soldier's service or of his personal background.

To acquire more information on a soldier, the researcher must contact the National Archives in Washington, D.C. and order the soldier's file. However, data taken from the index card on the soldier can expedite the National Archives' search for the record.

Chapter 8 of *THE SOURCE* (edited by Arlene Eakle and Johni Cerny) gives researchers extra information on military records. Last year's Seminar speaker Dr. George Schweitzer has published numerous books on researching soldiers in various wars. These books are available at the Texas State Library-Genealogy Collection.

LDS patrons can access these films in the Locality Catalog microfiche under *UNITED STATES-"Military records"*.

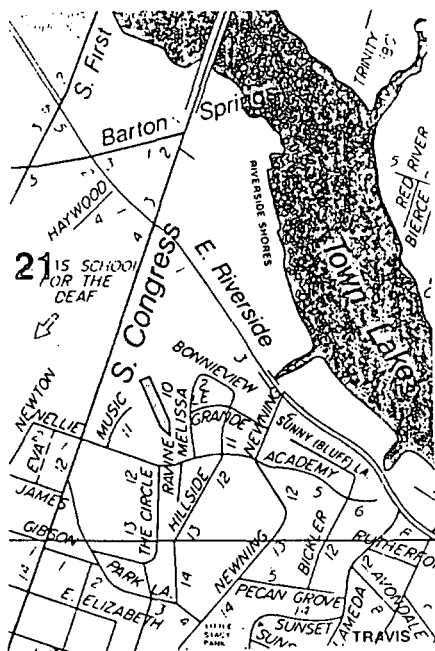

The Amarillo, Texas Genealogical Society Family Charts compiled by Mary Kay Snell and Lois K. Nix. Published by The Amarillo Genealogical Society, Box 2171, Amarillo TX 79189. Copyright 1990. 8½ x 11"; 704 pages; hard-bound; illustrated; full-name index.

For many years, the Family Group Sheets and Pedigree Charts of members of The Amarillo [Texas] Genealogical Society were bound and placed in the library annually. Realizing the depth and quality of their research, Mary Kay Snell, Lois K. Nix and Beth Netherton proposed that those charts be indexed and printed, a project which resulted in this handsome volume.

Those who remember Mary Kay as a member of Austin Genealogical Society (she was president in 1974) and as head of the Genealogy Collection at Texas State Library know how clever and efficient she is. Therefore, it will come as no surprise to discover that the book is far superior to most compilations of this genre.

One reason is that Amarillo is in the Texas Panhandle, long known as "a crossroads for migration both east and west as well as north and south." Thus these charts represent family origins in all corners of the nation and, indeed, the globe (Should I say rounded corners?).

An even stronger reason for its excellence is the way the charts are presented, which is not the hodge-podge of printed forms and sometimes weirdly computer-composed charts that are usually submitted. Mary Kay and Lois have designed a Pedigree Chart and a Family Group Record and transferred all submitted data neatly onto these forms.

At the bottom of each page are the name and address of the submitter. The Pedigree Chart records the name, birth date, place, marriage date, place, death date, place, and spouse.

The Family Group Record shows the name of the husband, born, christened, married, died, buried, father, mother, and other wives. After each of the five vital statistical items is the word Place. Data on the wife follows the same form.

For the children (each numbered), preceding the abbreviation CHR. is an F or M designating the sex, an important factor since many baptismal names are ambiguous in that respect. There is also a place for name of spouse of each child.

As we know, a town may have the same name as a county but not be in it. Sometimes a submitter may know the name of only the state or the county or the town. These ingenious ladies have solved that problem by inserting after Place: , , MO; or Place: , Botetourt, VA; or Place: Fluvanna, ,VA. Ideally: Place: Gonzales, Gonzales, TX -- the commas are the keys.

So much for the format; now the typography. Composed on a computer, the type is a little smaller than we oldsters would prefer, m and n being hard to distinguish and double m merely a blot. That may be attributed to presswork; pages more heavily inked are harder to read (e.g., page 365). But the typing seems to be very accurate, no Goerges or Issacs being noticed by this reviewer. Picking up a magnifying glass occasionally is a small price to pay for acquiring so much useful information.

The index (nearly 50 pages) is excellent, consisting of three well-spaced columns of given names inserted alphabetically under their respective surname. When there is more than one page number, they are spaced enough for good visibility.

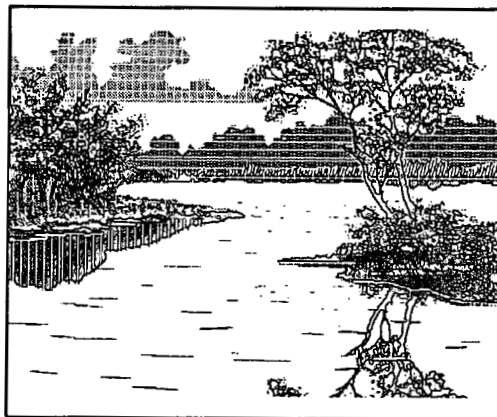
Illustrations. These are almost "worth the price of admission alone." Wherever a chart did not fill a page, the sensitive compilers placed an illustration appropriate to the nature and locale of the book. These range from the stately yucca to a Confederate soldier; from the state seal of Texas to a recipe for Texas Barbecued Pecans. There are reminders of the Indians who predate the Texas pioneers; of the flora and fauna of the state; buildings ranging from Spanish missions to NASA; singing cowboys, cooking moms, playing children, log cabins, Victorian homes, churches, antique automobiles, windmills, trains, old advertisements, plats of Panhandle towns, "Don't Mess with Texas" bumper stickers!

But the far-flung ancestors of Texans were not forgotten: There is a charming drawing of the Pilgrims and the Indians celebrating the first Thanksgiving.

An amusing example of the cleverness of the compilers is the page preceding the index. They drew a large stalk of bluebonnet blossoms shaped like a Christmas tree, topped by a map of Texas (outlined by barbed wire) containing a star. Hanging from the branches are cowboy boots, pistol holsters, jalapeno peppers, and stars made of "bobwar". The caption reads: "Deck Them Halls, Y'all! Mary Kay and Lois K."

We-all send an after-Christmas thank-you note to those ladies for their gift of this fine book to the Genealogy Collection at Texas State Library!

DICKERSON-WILLAN GENEALOGY by Melford S. Dickerson, M.D. Privately published 1991; Limited Edition, not for sale. 8½ x 11"; hard-bound; 334 pp.; maps and plats; lineage charts; facsimiles of printed documents; full-name index.

When Dr. M.S. Dickerson presented this handsome red volume to Austin Genealogical Society in memory of Gray Golden, he remarked that he has ancestors who have lived in Barbados, Canada, England, France, the Palatinate (along the Rhine), and South Holland. His Huguenot forebears have been found in the records of Amiens, Artois, the Province of Berry, and Picardy in France; later in county Kent, England, and after that in Flatbush and Harlem in New Netherlands/New Amsterdam (New York).

In the area now comprising the United States of America, his ancestral residences have been in Connecticut, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas and Virginia.

In addition to Dickerson, the lines that Austin Genealogical Society's esteemed member has meticulously researched are: Arnet, Aydelott, Baldwin, Barnes, Bogart, Borrett, Brecount, Catterlin, Costen, Delamater, Dent, DuBois, Edmundson, Fawcett, Fogg, Furness, Gilbert, Guttridge, Hay, Howard, Howson, Johnson, Lilly, London, McNeil, Riggins(s), Saum, Smith, Squire, Stavely, Stoddard, Thistlethwaite, Waldron, Watts, Wilder, Willan and Winter.

There are five major sections in the book: Dickerson Genealogy; Willan Genealogy; French Huguenot and Dutch Families; Pennsylvania Families of German Descent; and French Huguenot Families. Each section opens with Dr. Dickerson's No. 1 Ancestral Chart, followed by the chart(s) which show his connection to the families treated in that section. This is a capital idea, saving the reader the trouble of scrambling back see how each name fits in.

The first narrative page of the fifth section is an informative synopsis of the Huguenots' exodus from France in the late 17th century, and of their ultimate migration to North America.

The format of Dickerson-Willan Genealogy is excellent in view of the wide range of records from which the data have been abstracted. In between the usual "name - born - died - married" formula, one often finds data from several censuses, accounts of court cases (uncensored!), obituaries, land grants, explanation of the demographics of the time and place, sometimes details from family history, published or eyewitnessed. Dr. Dickerson did not limit himself to his direct ancestors; he generously included everything he could find on his "co-lateral" lines.

[This reviewer does not understand why he coined or adopted "co-lateral" as an adjective. It does not appear in my Webster's Unabridged Dictionary (admittedly an old one), but the time-honored word "collateral" (from the Medieval Latin collateralis) is defined thus: "3. Belonging to the same ancestral stock but not in a direct line of descent. Thus father and son are lineal kinsmen but brothers, cousins, uncles etc. are collateral kinsmen." Why change a word that has been used by genealogists for centuries?]

The typography of Dickerson-Willan Genealogy is quite good,

very readable, with a minimum of typographical errors. However, there seems to have been a mechanical breakdown, a spasmodic switching back and forth from flush right to ragged right margin (e.g., page 19). This is a distraction to the attentive reader.

There are a few other eye-catching flaws scattered through the book: The second e in Frederick County, Virginia and the second r in Adventurers of Purse and Person are conspicuous by their absence, so the saying goes. "Personality" for "personalty" may be due to an idiosyncrasy of the Maryland court system, not a printer's error; massuages for messages was also noticed occasionally. And, deplorably, the typesetter got caught in the "descendants ... decedents" trap.

But these are minor matters compared to the wealth of information contained in this book. It is a paragon of thorough research, an example to be followed by fellow genealogists.

Especially commendable is Dr. Dickerson's use of boldface type to indicate which one in a listing was his direct ancestor. Otherwise, the following generations would have been hard to trace because each family listing starts with the same kind of arabic numeral 1.

The frequent insertion of county and township maps and city lot plats helps to make the residents seem more real and related to their fellow-citizens.

The author seems to have consulted every known source to compile so many details about his ancestors. He cites Bible, church (baptism, marriage, burial), cemetery, military, newspaper, and tax records; deeds, wills, census listings, passenger lists, livestock marks, letters held at post offices, biographical sketches, family and local histories. And he seems to have included a more thorough coverage of his collateral lines than most researchers bother to present.

Conscientious recorder that he is, Dr. Dickerson did not omit or gloss over legal records that might be considered derogatory or embarrassing. Nor did he unduly exalt or boast of his ancestors who were Patriots in the American Revolutionary War, or those who achieved fame and/or success in various ways. This is as commendable as it is rare in a family historian!

Another device that enhances the readability of this genealogy is the format of Dr. Dickerson's interpolations: whether it be explanation of the connection between one family and another, the evolution of surname spellings, the historical event or period that affected a family's migration -- all are couched in clear and concise terms.

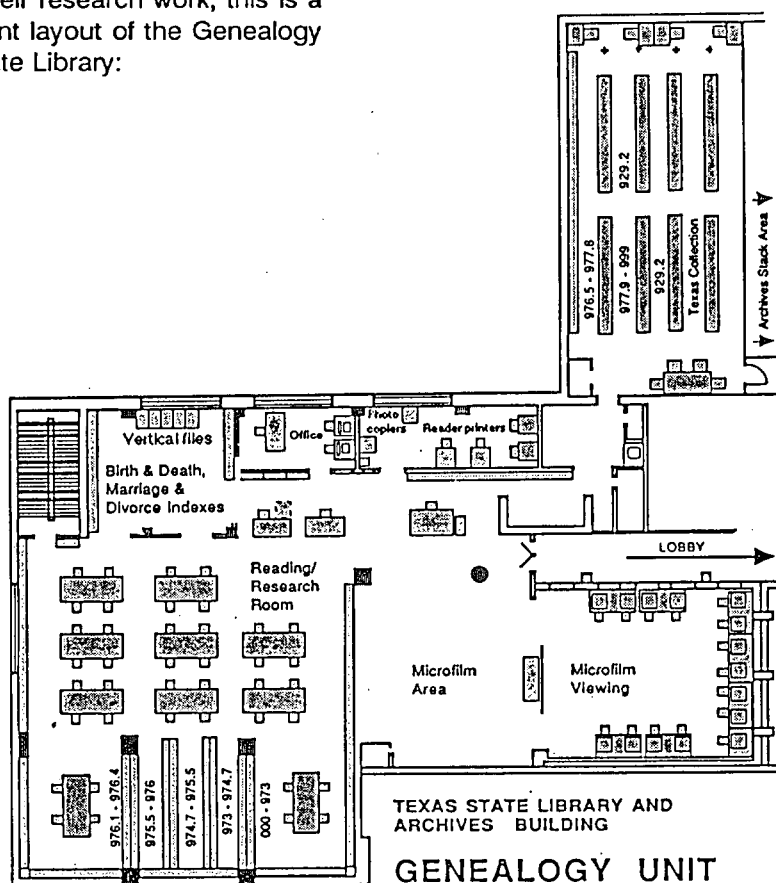
Dr. Dickerson's magnum opus has no bibliography per se, but it does cite the source of each bit of information as it is presented, which is convenient for the reader. Unfortunately, there is a lack of consistency in style -- some book titles are underlined, some are in boldface, some in all capitals, and some are merely caps and lower case, so it is not always clear whether "Records of Somerset County" refers to the records in general or is the title of a book.

The Index is almost ideal: three columns in a legible size type, variant spellings of a surname in alphabetical order, given names indented and alphabetically arranged.

Patrons of the Genealogy Collection in Texas State Library have good reason to join with Austin Genealogical Society in thanking Dr. Dickerson for his donation of this very fine book.

YOAKUM WOMAN CELEBRATES 100TH BIRTHDAY ANNIVERSARY

Yoakum, Texas—Mrs. Caroline Elizabeth Dickinson of near this city celebrated her 100th birthday on Thursday, the 7th inst. She was born in Mississippi November 7, 1818; married to Dr. S. B. Dickinson June 4, 1835; moved with him to Lavaca county, Texas, and settled within six miles of what is now Yoakum in 1843, while Texas was yet a part of Mexico. Dr. Dickinson was one of Fannin's company that was butchered at Goliad by the Mexicans, but the doctor happened to be away at the time. She has lived in Texas under five flags.

Mrs. Dickinson is the mother of eleven children, all of whom lived to man and womanhood except one. She has 67 grandchildren, 137 great-grandchildren and 30 great-great-grandchildren. Her husband died in 1887.

She has been a consistent member of the Methodist church since childhood, and one of her sons, S. B. Dickinson, is a Methodist minister. "Grandma" Dickinson is very spry for her age, assisting in the usual household duties of her home.

THE SAD HOMECOMING OF PETER ALEXANDER GREENE, C.S.A.

In the fall of 1859, Peter Greene, age 21, entered Emory and Henry College in Virginia due to a sentimental love for his forebear's birthplace, Sussex County, Virginia. Returning home to Georgia in the following spring, he found his aged mother fast declining in health, and so in order to stay nearer to her, he entered Auburn in the fall of 1860. In April 1861, at the outbreak of the war, he enlisted as a private in the Loachapoka Rifles, which formed a component part of the Sixth Alabama when that regiment was organized in Montgomery on May 8, 1861. He was the second man to volunteer for the service.

After first Manassas, the Sixth Alabama was encamped for several months at Langster's Crossroads, Virginia. During that time, Peter Greene and many others contracted measles or fever and were sent by rail to the hospital at Mitchell's Station some miles south of Manassas. A few miles from the station lived a Mr. Wharton, father of General Wharton of "Wheeler and Wharton" cavalry fame. At the request of Mr. Wharton, the hospital surgeon permitted Peter Greene and several other sick soldiers to be transferred to his hospitable home pending their recovery. This old gentleman had a wagon filled with hay and drawn by four enormous oxen to meet the trains at the station.

The eldest daughter, Miss Sallie Bettie Wharton was a very intelligent, vivacious young lady. When Lt. Greene arrived at the Wharton home, every room was full, but Miss Sallie, after seeing him, said she would claim him as her soldier and gave up her own room to nurse him to health. After his return to his Regiment, they corresponded regularly. Finally Miss Wharton was captured while carrying messages through the federal lines for Jackson and Lee, and the family was allowed to "refugee" to Opelika, Alabama. in 1863. It was here that Lt. Greene came on a leave of absence in the winter of '63-'64 and married his lovely lady.

Under an Act of 1862, which allowed men from other states to transfer to the commands organized from their home state, he received a transfer. He was made a non-commissioned officer in Company G, 31st Georgia Infantry, Lawton's, afterward, Gordon's brigade. Soon he was elected 2nd Lieutenant, then promoted to 1st Lieutenant, and from the early part of 1864 to his surrender April 7, 1865, commanded his company. He was a great admirer of John B. Gordon as well as a personal friend. At times, Gordon would have him take supper with him in his tent. Although Peter Greene was a 1st Lieutenant, he acted as Captain during the last year of the war after his Captain was disabled.

The armies of Lee and Grant had been engaged in almost daily battles. From the 5th of May at the Wilderness, to Spotsylvania down to Hanover Junction, to Cold Harbor and on to the very banks of the Chickahominy, was one long trail of blood of the boys of the South. During all that time, relatives at home received no word from their soldier boys in Virginia.

Lee with 60,000 Confederates was barring the way to Richmond against Grant with 200,000 Federals. It was to be their last major engagement. On April 6, 1865, near Appomattox Court House on a stream called Sailor's Run, Lt. Greene and a number of other soldiers were captured by the 2nd Ohio Cavalry, under the immediate command of Genl. George Armstrong Custer of the U.S.A. On seeing that capture was inevitable, Capt. Greene broke his sword and threw it from him. General Lee surrendered the Army of Northern Virginia three days after the capture of the remnant of the 31st Georgia.

On the morning of April 7th, all the prisoners captured on the retreat from Richmond and Petersburg were collected and the officers separated from the privates. There were 600 officers and 8,000 private soldiers. Among the officers were Genls. R. S. Ewell and Grenshaw DuBose. They were marched to Petersburg en route to Washington. At City Point on the James River, they were put aboard a transport and arrived in Washington on April 13, 1865. After being paraded through the streets, they were sent to the old Capitol Prison on the morning of April 14, 1865. The city was decorated with flags and bunting to celebrate Genl. Grant's victory over Genl. Lee.

The next morning he was perplexed when he looked out the window of his prison cell and saw the streets draped in mourning. He then learned of the assassination of President Lincoln and became aware of the danger to the prisoners. They were told that if they attempted to look outside, they would be shot. They could see ropes that the mob had prepared to hang them, and could hear an Army Chaplain prevail upon the mob not to carry out their threats. The minister, who had served with an Ohio Regiment, succeeded in getting the guards to rush the Confederate Soldiers into freight cars for transportation to Baltimore and on to Johnson's Island Prison at Sandusky, Ohio. They arrived safely as the cars were lined with bluecoats inside and out. They were ushered through the gate into an enclosure called the Bull Pen, surrounded by a fifteen foot wall and containing eighteen acres. There Peter discovered some old friends: two school mates and a Dr. Neal Gillis. All grades of society, all occupations and professions were represented by the prisoners. The commissioned officers were from Third Lieutenant to Major-General.

Lt. Greene was placed in a room with some Tennesseans who had been captured at the battle of Franklin. But now the war was over, and the Prison rules had been relaxed. Still, they were ill fed, and many were hungry all the time. Like other Confederate prisoners, Peter whiled away his time making souvenirs for the visitors. Finger rings and bar pins were made from dimes, and hard rubber combs made from gutta-percha.

During his service, he had been wounded twice. The first time in the leg but it was not serious. The second time he was struck on the head just above the ear, and the side of his neck taken off. As long as he lived he suffered from pains in his head. He came near dying of typhoid fever early in the war, however this setback led to his introduction to the lovely Miss Wharton.

Sadly, after their marriage in Opelika, he never saw her again or heard from her while he was in prison.

July 18, 1865 was the day he was finally released from prison. After tedious days of a 1200 mile journey by water, rail and on foot, he finally reached Opelika. His allowance for transportation and subsistence left him only ten cents which he paid to a negro boy to carry him across the Chattahoochee River in a small boat, the bridge having been burned. Hurriedly he sought the home where he had left his young bride and quickly entered the door. He expected to see the one person in the world who was first in his thoughts.

Instead, a young negro girl came into to room to tell him that "Miss Sallie" and his little son had been dead for two months!

Family History:

Peter Alexander Greene was my second cousin three times removed. His grandfather, Rev. Myles Greene, Sr. (1767-1853) was a younger brother of my g-g-g-grandfather Peter Greene (1760-1795). They were born in Sussex County, Virginia. Rev. Myles moved to Hancock County, Georgia where Myles, Jr. was born on June 6, 1801, the sixth of twelve children (three wives). Myles, Jr. also married three times and had fifteen children. His first wife, Martha Wyche Jackson, died in 1859 at the age of 49; she was the mother of thirteen children. He married Martha Rutledge in 1861; she had two children and died on June 7, 1878. In 1879 he married Jane ---. This was her sixth marriage! Peter Alexander Brannon (named for our hero) writes that Jane, although married six times, never had any children, but after her first marriage, there were children in all the homes she entered, and they were all devoted to her.

Peter's older brother Stephen Clements Greene married Martha Turner Bass on April 17, 1860. Seven months and ten days later, Stephen was accidentally killed and Martha Stephen 'Stephie' was

born posthumously the following February. After Peter Alexander returned to Opelika and made his tragic discovery, he married his brother's widow in the Fall of 1866. They raised 'Stephie' who later married George Thomas Brannon and had five children. The oldest was Peter Alexander Brannon. Brannon was an authority on Creek Indian history and a Director of the Alabama Department of Archives and History for many years. He did extensive research on the Greenes of Virginia.

Peter lived in Georgia until 1868, when he moved to Russell County Alabama and settled near the town of Seale. In 1880, he was elected Clerk of the Circuit Court of that county and served until his death. He brought together what will probably be found to be the first collection of relics of the War between the States to be accumulated in Alabama, and what was probably the original collection of relics of the Indians of that state.

In 1898, thirty-three years after his capture, he learned, quite by accident, the name of the Baptist minister who had served with an Ohio Regiment and assisted in his transfer from the prison in Washington, D.C. He quickly wrote to this gentleman, only to learn from the daughter that her father had passed away only two days before his letter arrived. The daughter replied that she had often heard her father speak of the incident and how he had succeeded in prevailing upon the unruly mob.

Martha G. Greene died on July 31, 1902; less than four months later, Peter Alexander Greene passed away in Columbus, Georgia on November 23, 1902 at the age of 64. He led a remarkable and memorable life.

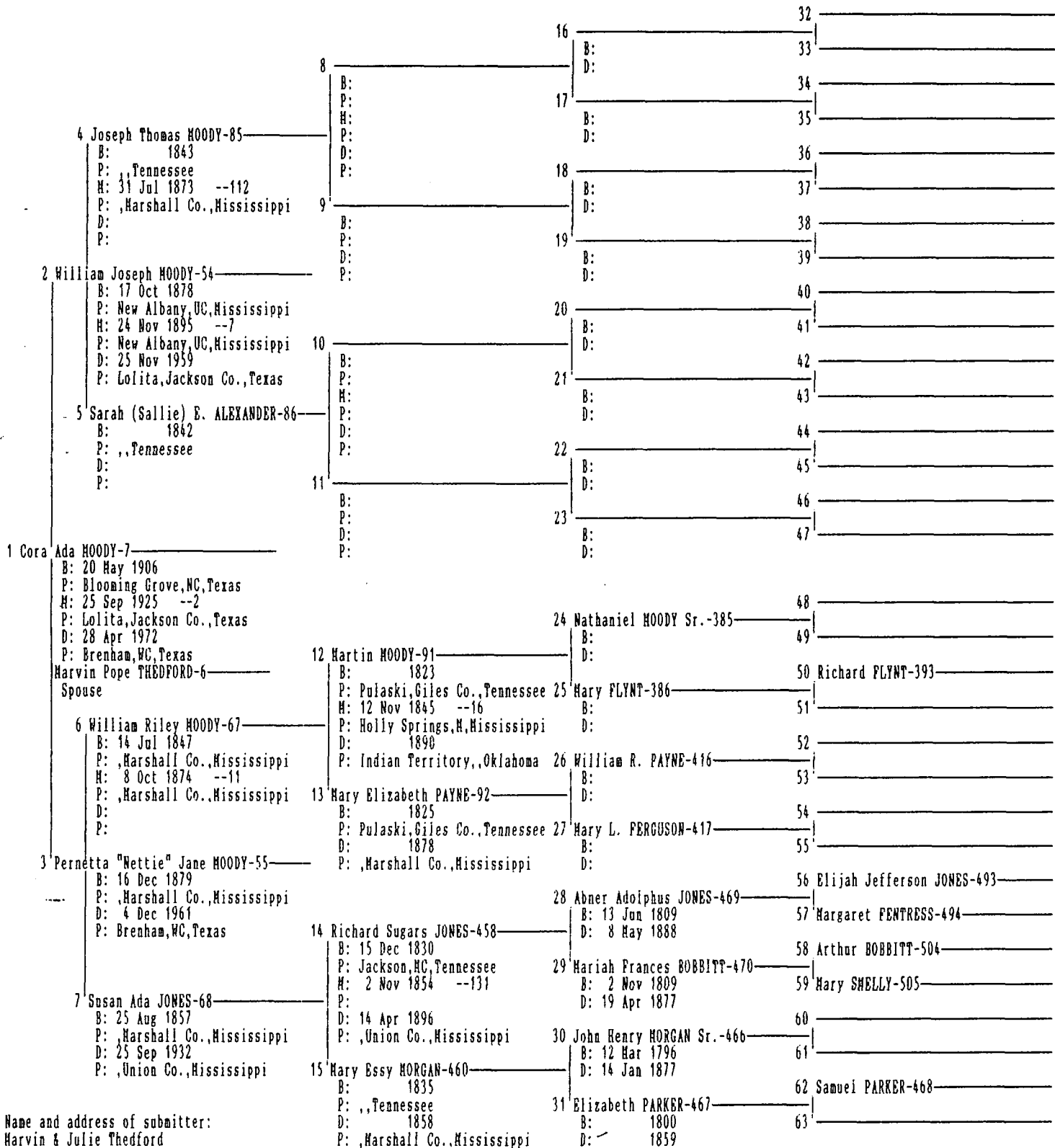

To all members and readers of this quarterly of the Austin Genealogical Society,

The history of my line of Thompson's in this quarterly is here mainly in hope that some reader might pass this information on to others with the same last names as the ones in this article and I might then learn of some kin that I have never met.

I will start from the beginning of my line as far back as I have traced them, but before you lose interest of them being in the Carolinas or Tenn. please let me remind you that my Grand Father James William THOMPSON was married and lived in your beautiful city.

Henry THOMPSON b. 1730 in Ireland. Moved to Scotland in 1755. Married a lady named Carmichael in 1760. First name unknown. Came to America also in 1760 with 3 brothers and 3 brother in laws, (CARMICHAELS). The THOMPSONS all settled in S.Carolina and the CARMICHAELS opened a shipping business in Savannah, Ga. Henry & wife started their family in S.Carolina, but later moved to N.Carolina. It is not known if they had any daughters, but we do know they had 5 sons. They were Henry, John, George, William and James Steele THOMPSON. Don't know for sure what part of N.Carolina they were living at but I found all of these names very close together in the 1800 census of Robeson County. One exception was James Steele THOMPSON who probably was still living with his dad Henry. He was born in 1780 and didn't marry until 1812.

James Steele THOMPSON was born June 22, 1780. Married Eliza Jane HORN in 1812 and they settled in McMinnville, Tn. Warren County. His wife was born in Georgia in 1797. Their children were all born in McMinnville.

John Henry THOMPSON b. Nov. 30, 1818. Married Emily Louise PAYNE in Pikesville, Tn. on July 1, 1846. She was born in Rhea Co. Tenn. on Oct. 14, 1823. Both died and are buried in the Tutt Hill Cemetary in Yellville, Ar.

Isabella Cornelia B. Mar. 3, 1821. Probably never married as her head stone still listed as a THOMPSON. Also Tut Hill Cemetary. Died 1900.

Sarah Ann b. Aug. 3, 1823. Married James FLOYD Dec. 12, 1844.

Caroline L. b. July 30, 1825. Married Lewis R. FAINE 1847.

Margaret E. b. March 13, 1829. Married James E. FOUST 1860.

A.H. b. Oct. 1, 1831. Married Irene SWAN in 1867.

James William B. April 7, 1834. Married Mary Caroline NICHOLS on May 1, 1867 in Austin Texas. They were my grandparents.

Logan Eugene b. Sept. 22, 1839. Married Susan Ann JORDAN Oct. 16, 1868.

1870 census has James William THOMPSON living in Limestone County.

1880 census has him in Austin living on Plum Street. His brother Logan was in Limestone County at this time. They both had children listed on this census but since they were not all born yet, I will list all of their families from the 1900 census of Erath County Texas.

Erath Co. Texas Census. 1900

I am in hopes that someone out there will know something about some of these people. I would love to hear from any of you.

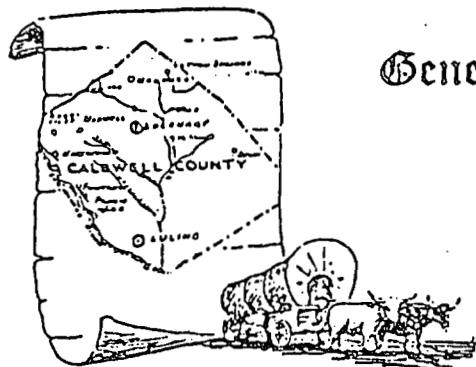

PURPOSE: Austin Genealogical Society was organized in 1960 as a not-for-profit corporation chartered by the State of Texas. MEMBERSHIP is open to all upon payment of annual dues; \$12 per individual, or family membership at \$14 for two in the same household, entitling them to one copy of each Quarterly and monthly Newsletter, as well as two pages apiece (a total of four pages for \$14 whether one or two people submit listings) in the Ancestor Listing issue (June).

DUES ARE PAYABLE on or before JANUARY FIRST of each year for the ensuing year. If dues are not received by 1 February, the name must be dropped from the mailing list. If membership is reinstated later and Quarterlies and Newsletters have to be mailed individually, postage must be charged. (Back quarterlies supplied only IF available--very few extras are printed. Send payment to AGS Treasurer, P.O. Box 1507, Austin TX 78767-1507.)

MISSING COPIES: If your Quarterly does not reach you by the 10th of April, July, October or December, notify the Society at Box 1507, Austin TX 78767-1507. (Note: Exchange Quarterly Chairmen should use the TEXAS STATE LIBRARY address given on the inside front cover.) Members who fail to give AGS sufficient advance notice of address changes and whose Quarterly is returned by the Post Office will be responsible for the postal fee for returned copies and for remailing the copy at individual rather than bulk mailing rates.

MEETINGS of the general membership begin at 7:30 p.m. on the fourth Tuesday of each month except August and December. Members are encouraged to come as early as 6:30 to socialize with each other. **MEETING PLACE:** Room 12, First Baptist Church, 901 Trinity downtown. Enter on the east side (Neches Street) entrance. Free parking in the lot south of the church, 9th & Trinity. **VISITORS ARE WELCOME.** The Board of Directors meets at 6:15 in a separate room.

AGS QUARTERLY is issued about the middle of March, June, September and November. Contributions are welcome, subject to editing to conform to our style. Contributor is responsible for accuracy and any copyright infringement. Send directly to the Editor (see inside front cover).

BOOK REVIEW POLICY: Books on appropriate subjects related to genealogy will be reviewed, but CANNOT be reviewed in AGSQ on the basis of advertising alone. If a review copy is received by the Review Editor at 2202 W. 10th St., Austin TX 78703 by the First of February, May, August or October, it will be reviewed in the next Quarterly. It will then be placed in the Genealogy Collection, Texas State Library, available to all patrons.

CHECK RETURN POLICY: Members and other payers must pay AGS cost for any returned check (currently \$5.00).

ANCESTOR LISTING PAGES (June issue) must reach the Editor at 4500 Hyridge Dr., Austin TX 78759-8054 by the TENTH OF MAY. They must be BLACK and LEGIBLE, whether typed, hand-printed, computer printout, or in superior calligraphy. Months must be SPELLED or abbreviated, not in figures. DATES SHOULD BE SHOWN in accepted genealogical style, that is, DAY, MONTH, YEAR. Allow space for binding at inner margins of facing pages; i.e., your first page will be a left-hand page. Carefully check horizontal pages (reading in the 11-inch direction). Otherwise, the Editor has to position some pages upside down to prevent loss of data in the stapling-punching process. NO 8 1/2x14 sheets, please!

You may submit Lineage or Family Group charts, Ahnentafels, narratives, cemetery inscriptions, Bible records, census data, queries, or a combination of material, just so it is not under copyright. BE SURE to proofread your material for accuracy and clarity so we will not be guilty of disseminating faulty or incorrect data. Put name and address of submitter on each page in legible form (NOT blind embossed). Consult a recent June issue of AGSQ for suggestions.

REMEMBER: \$12 membership entitles you to two facing pages in Ancestor Issue.
\$14 membership (one person or two) allows you four pages.
