## GENEALOGY COLLEGTION NEWS AND NOTES

State agencies run on a different cycle than much of the rest of the world. While other people are making plans for summer vacations, the hard work is just beginning for the administrators of state agencies. Here at the State Library the strategic plan has been adopted, and the budget to be presented to the legislature in the spring of 1995 is being prepared this summer. As users of the Library, you might want to keep your eyes on the Library's budget. As I'm sure you know from reading the newspapers, state agency budgets have been strictly limited for several years. The instructions which came from the Legislative Budget Board for the next budget cycle tell agencies not to request funds beyond what they received for the current year. When the rising cost of services and the continuing deterioration of equipment are factored into this, the overall effect is a reduced budget for the library. Since the agency has been asked to cut costs repeatedly over the past few budget cycles, there is no fat to trim from the bone. At this point it is too soon to know how we will have to deal with the possible shortfall, but you may want to keep an eye out for when the agency's budget is published and any hearings are held.

On a more cheerful front, the CD-ROM project continues to flourish. Thanks to your wonderful donations, we are continuing to slowly acquire new CD's. Our most recent acquisition is the General Land Office records from Arkansas. These CD's are being produced by the federal government at a bargain rate, so we will be acquiring the records of more states as they come out. The software for this is not quite as sophisticated as the GRS software which most of the other CD's use, but it is certainly useable once you've worked with it a little bit. There is some good information on the CD itself which you might like to read through which explains some of the cryptic field names. Patrons who have used this database have been very pleased with the results.

Other CD's are available for purchase if the money is available. Robert Casey has prepared a list of some of the CD's he has identified as being of possible interest to our patrons. The list is posted on the wall behind the laser printer, or I'm sure Robert would be glad to show it to you. The list includes the cost of the CD's and explains a matching fund program which is being initiated.

In lieu of other news to share, I thought l'd pass on some tips on working with what we already have. By the way, you have David Baskin to thank(?) for suggesting this topic...

The question often comes up, how do I find someone on the census when there's no index (or at least the Genealogy Collection does not own the index). This is particularly a problem with the later censuses (post 1900) which are only indexed by Soundex. As you know, for the most part, we do not have Soundex for other states, although we do have the census for all the states through 1910. (For 1920 we only have Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Louisiana.) Because the census is organized geographically, you may have a fighting chance to find your folks if you know where they were living when the census you are using was taken.

If you know the name of the town they were living in (and it's not a huge city), you want to try
flipping through the census for that county looking at the block at the top of the page designated to show the "city or town". If the census taker was conscientious and filled it in, that can narrow your search tremendously.

In states which use the township system (such as Ohio), you may find that they've grouped the townships alphabetically. Townships are a kind of geographic division (not used here in Texas) which are smaller than counties, but larger than cities. To find which township you need, use the Township Atlas. This handy reference guide is organized by state. For each state there are county maps which show the township breakdown.

Another less well-known tool which you may find useful are the Enumeration District Description films. We currently only own these for 1910, but I just ordered the reels for 1900, so we should have them this summer. This set of film allows you to narrow your search to a few ED's (enumeration districts) rather than having to check a whole county. (You do need to know where your quarry was living at the time though.) The ED descriptions show the boundaries for each ED. In the country these may be roads, creeks, or some other geographic feature. In the cities, the boundaries will be street names. For that reason, in order for this to be useful, you do need to have some idea of where they were living at the time.

This set of film is organized alphabetically by state. A the beginning of the section for each state you will find a handwritten list of counties which tells you which Supervisor's District your county is in. The descriptions are then in order by Supervisor's District. Once you're in the correct Supervisor's District, you look for your county. Under the correct county, start looking at the ED descriptions for the landmark street, stream, or whatever. You may find several ED's with a boundary matching your landmark, but at least you've narrowed it down somewhat. It's far easier to search 3 or 4 ED's than a whole county, particularly when it is an urban county.

If you don't know enough about where they were living to use any of these techniques, there are ways to get index information from other places. One place to try is a major library in the state in question such as either the State Library or a large public library. We have several library directories you can use to get the addresses of these libraries. You can write and ask them to make copies from the relevant index of the listings for the surname you are researching. Be sure to offer to pay for the copies. Don't be surprised though, to find they are charging a research fee as well as for copies. We're rapidly becoming one of the few State Libraries which does not charge a hefty research fee. It might be a good idea to call and inquire about any fees and guidelines. You can get the phone numbers from the same directories mentioned above.

If the census you're working on is 1880 or later you could also try to obtain a Soundex either from a commercial company or through the LDS family history centers. Or, if you're in the mood for a trip to the metroplex, there's always the National Archives branch in Fort Worth which should have all the Soundex.

I hope that some of these ideas prove useful to you all.

## NICHOLAS FAMILY HISTORY REFORT <br> 8 May, 1994

Following is a sumnary of our efforts to trace the NICHOLAS line back through time:
The time line written for us by my grandfather, William Abner ${ }_{\text {a }}$. parents were Andrew Jackson Nicholas and Felissia Ann Foster Nicholas, a.k.a. Melissa or Lydia Frances Foster of Ohio.

We have found records to verify that information received from W. A. is accurate. We have had many chuckles over great-grandmother's Christian names. We have found at least five derivations of her name, the latest being supplied by a new-found kinsman Dorsey Johnison of Hurricane, W甘A. Apparently she was known, in the Teays Valley of WVA, from whence the fainily came, as "Melissa". (speatfached family record.).
Dorsey Johnson isa direct descendant of Eliza Jane Nicholas, sieter of W. A. Eliza uquied Mahlon Morris Johneon. This vinon produced twelve children.

Other facts we have verified are as follows:

1. We: have established the Nicholas line on the Trace Fork of the Mud River, Putnam County, Curry Township, WVA, near Hurricane WVA. through birth records, deeds, court orders and interviews with present citizens.

In one recorded deed for a farm located on the Trace Fork of the Mud River, we learned that Elizabeth Nicholas willed to her sons, Johri and S.S. Nicholas, a parcel of land containing 11 acres (Book 7 , page 358) recorded $\sigma$ Dec. 1870 . This property was conveyed to Jack'son McCalijster. It is interesting to speculate, who Elizabeth's husband was and to speculate who Jackson McCallister's wife was, since she may have been the third heir of the three way division of property. It is also interesting to speculate whether the John of this transaction with McCallister was the father of Andrew Jackson, my great grand-father. So far we have been unable to make a connection.
A further point of speculation is the significance of John's brother's name, Is he a name sake of the famous Kentucky jurist, Samuel Smith, for whom other Nicholases were named? One Samuel Smith Nicholas was the son of Col. George Nicholas, the first attorney general for the Kentucky territory when it became the 14 th State of the Union.
2. In another deed for property dated 17 Oct. 1885 a parcel of 340 acres of land was conveyed to Creed M. Eird from Andrew J. Nicholas and his wife Felissia Ann. This transaction is recorded in book 12 , page 247.
On a visit to the area we heard this property referred to alternately as the Creed Home Flace and the Nicholas Home Flace. This information was given to us during our visit to Mt. Moriah Raptist Church, 9 May 1993. Incidentally this was the church where my grandfather, W. A., was ordained.

We were treated most kindly during our visit to Mt. Moriah. Mrs. Pam Harper, her Mother and young daughter graciously escorted us, after church services, over rough country roads to the Bird farm. Present

owner, Mr. Boyd Bird, a relative of Pam's, is the son of Creed Bird who purchased the property from Andrew J. Nicholas (Andy) ir 1885.
Mr. Bird indicated the farm house was built by Andy. Mr. Bird states that the original log house was still standing when the Bird's bought the property. It wari. later removed but some of the foundation may be still there, as well"as the man dug well.

There are three family burial grounds on the property, two of Bird ancestors. The third, directly back of the farm house on the ridge overlooking the valley has at least two burial plots with illegible headstones. We would like to make rubbings of these headstones to bring out any inscriptions that might be thereon.
3. We found it interesting to have found records of Andrew Jackson's election to Justice of the Feace of Curry Township, putnam county, Second District, Jan. 1862 to Aug. 1864 Court Order Book, Vol. 2, page 370 , period 1857 to 1873 . Andy Served as a Sargeant in the Union Ariny during the Civil War, Company $G$, 11 th Volunteers, Infantry from Feb.

1862 to May 1865, the same years he was serving as Justice of the Peace.

As one final act of hospitality, Pam Harper gave us the name and phone number for previously mentioned Mr. Dorsey Johnson and his wife, Ilene, as she thought Dorsey might also be working on genealogy, and might have a Nicholas connection. Oh boy, what a bonanzaz fe shared the information he had and escorted us to the home of another cousin of ours, 89 year-old Myrtle Caldwell, Dorsey's great aunt. This spry, alert lady knew my grandfather, $W$, $A$., and had corresponded with him during his ministry. We had a'marvelous visit and have corresponded frequently since our visit, as well as with Dorsey and ilene.

During our visit to Mt. Moriah Baptist Church, we learned that the first sunday of August each year is their homecomirg. People come from all over to visit and renew friendships. Sinoe this is the church where my grandfather was ordained, and where great-grandiather Andy served in several church positions, I thought perhaps Rev. Ralph Chaney, pastor, might be willing to share his pulpit on this inportant day with another gousin of mine, an ordained Eaptist minister, and also a grand-son of W.A., the Rev. Johr T. Wallace. Rev. Chaney has graciously consented to do this, and has contacted Rev. Wallace, who has eagerly accepted

So, now we are impatiently awaiting home coming and a chance to extend our search.

## JOHANN PETER SAMES

Johann Peter Sames was born 3 October 1807, in Werdorf, Hessen, Germany and was married to Maria Christine Dorlas on 3 August 1834, in Dillheim, Hessen, Germany. She was born 29 April 1811, in Katzenfurt, Hessen, Germany. ${ }^{1}$

Records from the Texas General Land Office, Austin, Texas, show that on 22 September 1845, Peter Sames signed a contract with the German Emigration Company at the Consulate of the Republic of Texas for the port of Bremen to emigrate to Texas. A copy of the ship's list from the Texas State Archives shows that he and his family arrived in Texas at the port of Galveston on the ship Neptune on 2 December 1845. The family members in addition to his wife were the children: Louis, Johannette [my great grandmother], Louise, John, and Frederick.

Research of the Solms-Braunfels Archives at the Barker Texas History Center shows that they were detained at Galveston until the fall of 1846 perhaps due to a shortage of carts because of the Mexican War. The records of the Eirst Protestant Church of New Braunfels, Texas, show that one child, [Johann] Peter Sames, aged 5, died on 8 August 1846 and his mother, Maria Christine, died on 28 August 1846, and are buried on the left bank of the Guadalupe River across from New Braunfels. A copy of family bible records ${ }^{2}$ show that they were "shipwrecked and lost all their money, jewels and linens"; and that Peter had drowned in the Guadalupe and that his mother died almost three weeks later in childbirth.

Peter Sames was then left with four children when he arrived in New Braunfels, only to lose his two renaining sons in the epidemic which caused the deaths of approzimately 373. ${ }^{3}$ Ludwi.g [Louis] died on 4 October 1846 and Friedrich died on 9 October 1846.

Family tradition says that he took his surviving daughters, Johannette and Louise, to San Antonio to live with family friends, Herman Dietrich Stumberg and wife, Dorothea Elizabeth nee Heiner. The Stumbergs were managing a boarding

[^1]house near the Alamo owned by William Menger who later built the Menger Hotel. The girls remained with the Stumbergs until their marriages.

According to County Clerk records of Comal County, on 11 February 1847, Peter Sames married Lisette Deupler [Teufel?]. In the church records she is listed as the widow Schmidt. The witnesses were: Meckel and Fröhlich. It is possible that she was the widow of Heinrich Schmidt who died shortly after arriving in New Braunfels as a result of the trip since there was a Heinrich Schmidt, wife Lisette, and children Theodor, Frederike and Adolphus, who came over on the same ship as the Sames family. However, on the 1850 census records, Peter is shown alone with his daughter Louise. The last record that we have been able to find is a ta: record for 1852 showing that he was still living in New Braunfels and that he had paid his poly tax.

My great grandmother, Johannette, first married John Martin Woerner from Baden, Germany on 13 November 1854 and they had four children. According to my mother, he died of cholera while serving in the War Between the States. However, no date of death is shown in his Confederate records but some family papers state that he was buried in a mass grave. She then married Raymond Betzer and they had four daughters.

Louise Sames, Johannette's younger sister, married Andreas Lingsweiler, a musician from Baden, Germany, on 30 November 1854 in San Antonio. Before their marriage, Andreas enlisted for five years in the Eighth Infantry of the United States Army on 14 April 1849 in New York City. He was sent to Ringgold Barracks, a border cavalry post at Rio Grande City in Starr County, Teaas to fight in the Meaican War. By 1850, he was stationed in San Antonio where he remained after his enlistment was over and was one of the first members of the old Volunteer Fire Department formed in 1854.:

Any information regarding Peter Sames and his second wife and John Martin Woerner would be appreciated. I am willing to share additional information I have and to pay for expenses incurred in any copying of information in your possession. There is a family with the surname Sames in Cuero, Texas, but they have said they are not related.

I am seeking verification of some old tales: Ellen Swift b. ca 1852 DeWitt Co. TX; sometime ward of Judge Baker in Cuero, later lived in Trespalacios area with her sister Mary C. (b. 1842) who had maried William E. Moore (1837-1902). His sister Eudora (1847-1933) described Ellen`s mariage to Ed [Thomas li.?] Patain but gave no date.

My stepmother Dorothy (Kuykendall) Hoskins was the great-niece of above Eutora Inez Moore (author of Indianola Scrap Book) and handed down her recollcetion that Ellen Swift had four husbands, marrying (after the death of land-rich Pattain) first Charles A. Can anyone furnish dates, corroboration, or disproof?

The tale gets more melodramatic: No name or date is given for Ellen's fourth husband, who, it is said, killed her in a hunting "accident," but he was subsequenty convicted of something and "spent many years in prison."

PURPOSE: Austin Genealogical Society was organized in 1960 as a not-for-profit corporation chartered by the State of Texas. Its purposes are to collect and preserve genealogical and historical information about the people of Texas, particularly pertaining to the City of Austin and to Travis and surrounding counties; to instruct and assist members in genealogical research; and to publish public and private records of genealogical interest. In addition, the AGS supports the Genealogical Collection, Texas State Library by donations of books and other genealogical material. Gifts and bequests to AGS are tax-deductible.

MEMBERSHIP is open to all upon payment of annual dues; $\$ 15$ per individual, or family membership at $\$ 17$ for two in the same household, entitling them to one copy of each Quarterly and monthly Newsletter, as well as two pages apiece (a total of four pages for $\$ 17$ whether one or two people submit listings) in the Ancestor Listing issue (June). After 1 July, dues are $\$ 7.50$ for the balance of the year, but you will only receive the publications produced after the date you join.

DUES FOR EXISTING MEMBERS ARE PAYABLE on or before JANUARY FIRST of each year for the ensuing year. If dues are not received by 1 February, the name must be dropped from the mailing list.
