



Once again we are glad to present the issue each year from which we derive most satisfaction: the members' issue, in which any of our members may present whatever of genealogical interest they wish to publicize. Starting on page 29 you will find 53 pages as submitted by 18 of our members, filled with much interesting data ranging from ahnentafels to items of family history; the content is always left to the submitter's choosing. On page 55, for example, member Margaret Long Wallace relates her experiences in researching her interesting family (and nicely plugs our Juanita Dodgen's genealogy classes). Londa Burns has happily chosen to represent her genealogical musings this year in cartoons (pg. 30), and very good ones, too.

Anyone reading this issue cannot help but be impressed with the wide range of information contained in those pages even if the subject names have no relationship with the reader's family. We salute and heartily thank the submitters for their excellent material and a level of interest which one can only admire.

In preparing this material for publication it was interesting to note how far our membership has obviously moved in the direction of electronic data handling during just the three years we have edited this journal. Even that recently, it was common for most everyone to supply pedigree and family charts as forms filled in pencil or ink--tedious for both the submitter and editor. A quick look at this year's material clearly indicates that virtually all of it was printed out from one or another piece of genealogical software or word processor. At times (when the hard disk fails or the program inexplicably loses valuable data from the file) we all are prone to wonder just how much progress this really is. Sad

truth is, if we stop to argue the point we are run over by the mob. Genealogy is traveling the information highway as vigorously as any profession. Your editor tries to stay up by such strategies as scanning the members' submissions directly into each page rather than the old cut-and-paste routine. This has the advantage of easily adjusting the size of each sheet to contain the subject material and still allow for the all-important margins and can also improve readability where originals are somewhat dim. As we've said before though, what you see in your copy of the Quarterly has gone through at least two intermediate steps of reproduction and some quality is unfortunately lost each time.

It is worth noting here that the greater part of our membership dues each year goes to defray the costs of publishing and mailing the Quarterly and the monthly Newsletter (edited so very well by Wilena Young). While it is certainly within the state of the art to publish a better quality journal, the cost would be noticeably greater and we would have to raise dues. We hope what we are doing is supplying an acceptable product for a very reasonable annual membership fee.

In addition to the members' contributions there are some interesting queries in Happy Hunting Ground. We were asked recently whether query requests can only be made by members. Decidedly not; we receive and are glad to print inquiries from all over the country, many asking about family connections in Texas or the Austin area. We are happy to publish any and all reasonable requests.

Our renowned Society pedagogue, Juanita Dodgen, has begun to present short (5-min.) snappy genealogy lessons at each month's regular meeting—another good reason you should always come! She has agreed to let us include summaries of those little jewels in the Quarterly. Summaries of her discussions for March and April begin on page 83.

As always at this time of year we are gearing up for our annual AGS Seminar to be held at the Terrace all day Saturday, 5 August 1995. We are pleased to have Desmond Walls as our speaker and from many personal reports, she is a master at her craft. An advance registration form is included on page 85.

AGS regrets losing Judy Duer as the supervisor of the Genealogy Collection at the Texas State Library. She left recently to become City Librarian for the City of Georgetown where she and her family have been living. Judy was not only a very good custodian of the State holdings, but a most helpful person and a warm friend. We shall certainly miss her but we know that she will serve her home town well. Best wishes, Judy, in all the years ahead, and many thanks for all you have done for us.

There are many items of general interest we see in the "broader" journals such as *Stirpes* (Texas State Genealogical Society) and the National Genealogical Society *Quarterly*. Knowing

many of our members do not receive these periodicals we keep an eye out for nuggets of genealogical knowledge which appear in them and try to reprint any short ones of general interest. One such article (about census taking dates) appeared in the December 1994 NGS Quarterly edited by Gary B. and Elizabeth Shown Mills, and is reproduced below.

Editors' Corner

Those !#\$%&! census traps—here're two we can avoid!

Historical researchers have a love-hate relationship with censuses. We can't live without them (or we think we can't) but we gripe constantly about their errors and inconsistencies.

Truth is, many of the problems researchers have with census data are of their own making—particularly with regard to dates. As editors, we see this frequently in the manuscripts that cross our desks. Writers will have labored diligently to reconcile all evidence and explain all discrepancies. Endnotes and parenthetical asides regularly point out how and why, for example, the family Bible gives John a birth year of 1810 when the censuses of 1850–80 "agree" that the year was 1811. Other writers hit roadblocks in their efforts to correlate household/age categories on the censuses of 1820 and 1830.

Such common problems are often avoidable if we consider two points: the instructions given to the enumerators and the official date of the census under study. To illustrate:

1850-80. The official census date used during this period was 1 June, and census takers were to record ages as of that date. The typical deduction—if an individual appears on the 1850 census as aged 39, let us say—is to subtract 39 from 1850 and conclude that the person was "born 1811." Forget the simple math; it's likely to be wrong. There's a 58 percent chance that the ancestor was born 1810, rather than 1811. In order to be 39 on 1 June 1850, your individual had to be born between 2 June 1810 and 1 June 1811. That's seven possible months in 1810, only five in 1811.

1820-30. The pitfall here is a change in official census date that affects the age category of most enumerated people born during summer in a year ending with 0. The applied date in 1820 was the first Monday in August. The applied date in 1830 (through 1880, as noted above) was 1 June. Thus, a person whose birthday was 4 July 1810 would have been counted in 1820 among those aged 10-19, because he or she would have had that tenth birthday before the official census date in 1820. However, in 1830 the official date fell before that person's birthday. He or she would have been 19 on 1 June 1830 and would, once again, be tallied in the 10-19 category.


Attention to detail of this sort can save us countless headaches, convoluted conclusions, and erroneous judgments. Don't we wish all the traps that plague historical research could be so easy to avoid?







DEATH OF WM BROWN

In the death of Wm Brown last Saturday, is recorded the passing of one of the true men of Perry. He was a man who mixed with his fellows but little, choosing a few friends and keeping with them, rather than being familiar with many. To those who were favored with his confidence and with whom he was wont to discuss the matters of the day and the events of importance as the(y) occurred, he displayed a knowledge and culture few knew he possessed.

He was a self contained man to a large degree and while this came more from habit than desire, yet while he lived in Perry nearly a quarter of a century, he was less well known than many who have been here but a fraction of the time. Yet in the home his true worth as a man was most apparent. To the wife and to the children he was all that the name "husband" and "father" would imply. To them the loss is the more keen because he was always with them, always ready to counsel and aid.

Thirty years ago, when he first came to Iowa, he joined in the efforts of the early settlers in the making of the country and the laying of the foundations which have served thrucut the succeeding years so perfectly. During the 25 years Mr. Brown lived near Perry, he has ever been a man looked up to for his sterling worth and spotless character. The community loses a faithful and true citiaen in his demise and the tears of friends mingle with those of blood ties in these moments of first grief.

William Brown was born on the 17th day of June, 1845, in Monongalia county, West Virginia. He was a member of Co. G. 1st West Virginia cavalry during the last year of the civil war. He was married to Mary Etta Stickel March 6, 1873, in Illinois to which state he came some three years previously. In 1875 the family moved to Iowa. he was a member of the Methodist church at the time of death.

To Mr. and Mrs. Brown were born eight children, seven of whom survive him. Mrs. C. H. Bis (Bills), Mrs. T. W. Morfcot, Mrs. W.A White of Juniat(a), Neb., Arthur C., Orha (Orpha) A., Ferry A., and Varella Wilbreda (Wilfredo).

State of IOWA, County of Dallas, on this 1st day of July. AD, 1907 personally appeared before me. a Notary Public in and for the aforesaid County, duly authorized to administer oaths, Mary E. Brown, aged 55 years, a resident of Perry, in the County of Dallas, and State of Iowa, whose Post Office address is Perry, Iowa (Dallas Co.) and who, being duly sworn, declares as follos: That she is the Widow of William Brown late of Co. G-1st Reg. W Va Vol Infatry and an applicant for a pension by reason Thereof; that she was married to said soldier on the 6th day of March 1873 by Rev A # Olds, under the name of Hary Etta Stickel; that the Binister combined my given name writing it as one name Marietta; while my correct name is Hary Etta-and I have since my mariage written it Mary E. - and so write it now-the minister combined the two making one name of it. Neither the Soldier or myself had been proviously married and we always lived together as husband and wife-ware never divorced and were so living at the time of the soldiers death-I have never remaried and our minor child, Varella Wilfredo Brown is still living, and under my care and custody-The only property I have is the ten acres of land given me by my husband in the North part of the NW quarter of Section 15th Range 228 W 5th Dallas Co Iowa he having divided the 140 acres between mo and our seven children all of whom are of age except Varella Willredo and Percy A. He also had \$1200 in personal property-a part of which was expended for medical services and funeral and living expenses-I have no property in my own right and there is no one legally bound for my support. I have not disposed of any property since Feby 11th 1907 and had no source of income except funds left by my husband and have not disposed of any real estate since his death-he had no life insurance.

That we have been well and personally acquainted with Hary E. Brown for 35 and 32 years respectively, and that we know her to be the widew of William Brown, that she lived with him continuously as his wife ever since they were married in 1873 and that neither of them were previously married and they were living as husband and wife at the time the said soldier died-Namely Feby 2th 1907-that she was never diverced from him nor he from her, nor has she remarried since his death-their minor child Varella Wilfredo Brown is still living and under the care and custody of her mether Hary E. Brown-at the time of her marriage her given name was written in one name Marietta instead of Mary Etta-that she only owns the property settled on her by her late husband being ten acres of land near Perry, Iowa on which there are buildings and will make her a good home but little or no income to be derived therefrom-He had a few hundred dellars personal property and some money which has principally been used up in sickness and funeral expences and there is no one legally bound

for her support. We Brown had 140 acres of land which he divided between his wife and their seven children-He have been intimately acquainted with the family, lived in the same vicinity with them all those years and know these statements to be facts. We further declare that we have no interest in said case and we are not concerned in its prosecution. She had no income except from her chickens and vegetables-and she has not disposed of any real estate since Feby 11th 1907.

THE LONG STORY

Due to a daughter's insistence, I had the wonderful privilege a few years ago of attending

Juanita Dodgen's first LIFETIME LEARNING Genealogy Class. What an enlightment for one
who knew nothing about census records, nor how to learn first and last names of people never
met.

But the LIFETIME LEARNING teacher was firm and thorough: Choose one line and concetrate on it. Easy...The total knowledge of my father's people consisted of two facts.

Grandfather was Francis Marion Long, county surveyor at Goldthwaite, Texas, and my Dad,

Albert Augustus Long, was born at Pearl, Texas, where ever that might be. After several false leads I learned that Pearl was in Coryell County.

Class Instruction-Go to Court Houses: It was a shock when I learned that the Gatesville Court House had a record of these grandparents' marriage. Grandmother Long's maiden name was new to me-Nancy GAZAWAY. What an ugly name I thought. A fellow Gatesville Court House researcher urged me to visit their local library's geneological section. Very reluctantly I accompanied her as she insisted on showing me the way. How could I gracefully refuse? BUT, what a gold mine-a privately published little book on the history of Pearl. One story told about this one-legged, early settler from Denton with a large family living in a shelter cave. The man was William Gazaway and one of his daughter's, Nancy, married a school teacher named F. M. Long. Now I've traced my family to the CAVE MAN. Should I stop?

That LIFETIME LEARNING teacher now included a fieldtrip to the State Archives, vaults, underground tunnels, and all. Found here were two helpful papers. The State of Texas Adjutant

General's Warrant of Authority and Descriptive List dated 7 June, 1918, contained the name F. M. Long, Goldthwaite, surveyor, age 69, born in New Albany, Indiana. The other important paper was W. W. Gazaway's Confederate Pension Application from Gillespie County with a Willow Cilty post office address. This paper, dated 10 September, 1907, showed Mr. Gazaway's as age 73, and "service in the army caused amputation of left leg above knee joint". More information referred to Denton County.

Again, that LIFETIME LEARNING teacher's instructions-follow every lead: An inquiry at Willow City's lonely two-pump filling station/ post office/store led me to a mobile home. A knock on this door brought forth a verbal invitation to "come in" from an unseen person.

Fearfully, I entered but left with information about an upcoming Gazaway Reunion at Utopia.

Back to class-Family reunions are MOST IMPORTANT: Consulting the highway map and in my motor home, my daughter and I found our way to Utopia and spent a night under grand old cyprus trees in a beautiful City Park on the Sabinal River. At the Gazaway Reunion, I received a small, just published book, GENEALOGICAL HISTORY OF THE JESSE GAZAWAY FAMILY. Also included at Utopia was a visit to the grave of one Nancy REEL George Gazaway.

That LIFETIME LEARNING Class was over with no more pressures nor answers from that insistent teacher. Likewise, no more research. But failing students repeat courses. This time the teacher is not Juanita Dodgen, but Betty Kaiser and back to that Gazaway book. W. W. Gazaway's father, Jesse, when widowed, married a neighbor widow woman named Nancy REEL George. Now here is the connection with that Utopia grave. W. W. Gazaway pulled a trick by marrying his step-mother's daughter, Mary Ann "Polly" GEORGE. The afore mentioned Nancy

REEL George Gazaway, born in Missouri, came to Texas according to THE FIRST CENSUS OF TEXAS, 1829-1836, at age seventeen with brothers, sisters and parents Barbary and David Reel.

More class work-visit the State Land Office: A native of Holland, David Reel received a "Spanish" land grant from the Supreme Government of the State of Coahuila and Texas by issuance of titles to the colonists in the Enterprise of Citizen David G. Burnet with Assisting Witness, Thomas J. Rusk. This land grant was situated on the waters of the Angelina River.

Having heard for years of our Scotch-Irish heritage from my mother's people, I now want to explore this possible Dutch linage. OR Should I concentrate on my original LONG story.

1870 Denton County Census shows a 20 year old cattle driver, Marion Long, living with his family including his 45 year old cabinet maker/preacher father, Peter B. Long. The 1850 Harrison County, Indiana Census shows F. M. Long as a 7/12 year old male in the 27 year old Peter B. Long's household with a 25 year old Sarah (wife?). Here ends my LONG trail.

My new questions call for more lessons, Professor Dodgen!

The JENSEN and MARTIN JOHANSEN Families of Limestone County, Texas
The First 100 Years

Norway, a country of unsurpassed scenic beauty, with its breath taking views of snow capped mountains, fjords, lakes and forests, has little arable land on which to raise food for its people. In the mid 1800's Norway experienced rising birth rates and declining death rates, and could not comfortably support its increasing population.

Men like Cleng Pearson, "The Father of Norwegian Immigration to America", wrote glowing tales of America, enticing many of his fellow Norwegians to emigrate. During the latter 1800's, Norway sent more emigrants to America in proportion to its total population than any other country. Its people were returning to the land discovered by a Scandanavian Viking, Leif Ericsson, in about the year 1000.

During this period, in the year 1873, brothers Hans and Anton Jensen, sons of Jens Halvorsen and Eli Jorgensdatter, left their native Norway to come to America. They came to Bosque County, Texas, which had been settled by Norwegians as early as the 1850's.

In 1884 Hans married Julia, also from Norway. They had six children, Emma C., Albert J., Henry Julius, Elida S., John E. and Clara M.

On 5 Dec 1878 Anton married Mary Kaja Halverson in Bosque County. Kaja was born in Texas of Norwegian parents. This union produced six children, Jens (James) Elevin, Olina Constance, Axel W., Alma Ottine, Willie Marion and Johnnie C.

It is unclear why Hans and Anton moved to the Callina (Calina) Community in Limestone County, though some Norwegian families did settle there. Callina was once a thriving small community in East Central Texas between Hubbard and Coolidge on FM 936. It boasted of having, among other things, two doctors, two grocery/general stores, (Bates and Carson's), a Norwegian blacksmith, livery stable, school and the all-important cotton gin. "Everyone" grew cotton. Today a stock pond, which once served the cotton gin, and a few foundation stones and bricks, are all that mark the location. Unhappily the railroad passed Callina by.

Norwegians in Callina worshipped in one another's homes. A pastor came by train from First Lutheran Church (Waco, Texas) about once a month, staying in one of the parishoner's homes. He held services in Norwegian, officiating at baptisms and weddings, holding communion, etc. I have been told that many early records of the Jensen (Jenson) and Johansen families can be found at this church in Waco.

Annie Jensen, sister of brothers Hans and Anton, and her husband, Martin Johansen, a miller in Norway, joined Annie's brothers in Callina ca 1881. The closeness of the Norwegian families in America, and of the Jensen and Johansen families in particular, is illustrated by the joint purchase on 1 September 1883 by Hans Jenson and Martin Johanson (sic) of 460 acres in Limestone Co. for \$5948.00 They paid \$500.00 down, the balance payable in 5 years at 10% interest.

However, when Martin Johansen died in 1895 the note had not been paid. His widow, Annie, was unable to make the payments. On 2 February 1898, in order to secure a release from, and cancellation of the note, she conveyed the land back to John Korner, holder of the note. Annie received \$500.00 for improvements she and Martin had made on the land.

Norwegian immigrants would save money to send back to Norway to help someone else come to America. This newest immigrant would then work for that person(s) until the passage money was paid off. Before Martin's death, Martin and Annie sent for a young girl who would help

Annie with her work. Emma Snarvold Jensen willingly came.

Emma left her native city of Elverum, Norway with her ticket and \$5.00 to see her through customs. According to a letter written 24 March 1964, when Emma was applying for American citizenship, she sailed from Christiania (now Oslo) for London. She left London on the White Star Ship, Britannica, and landed in New York. There she boarded another ship and came to Galveston, Texas. She traveled by train to Mexia, Texas, arriving April 7. 1893. The last leg of her long and arduous journey from Elverum, Norway to Callina, Texas was by buggy.

A family legend has it that Emma sailed under someone else's name. A Norwegian who had booked and paid for passage was unable to leave. Rather than waste the passage money. a thrifty Norwegian came under the name of the person who had booked passage. Emma's daughters agree that the passage money was used by a family member. Anna Johansen (Ronning) said that this was Olaf, Emma's brother, and a fellow Norwegian, Pete Antonsen. Emilie Johansen (Bittner) says it was Emma.

In 1894 Emma married Martin and Annie's son Jens (Americanized in early documents to Jim or James) Johansen. Seven of their children were born in Callina: Anna Christine, Marie Josephine, Hjalmar E. and Hjalmar, Carl Martin, Emilie Beata and Olena Severina.

Hjalmar (Elmer in English), the elder, died at age 2 1/2. The second son was also named Hjalmar. Visiting playmates, older and heavier than young Hjalmar, teased him about his "funny talk". Hjalmar was anxious to be accepted by the other boys. When they demanded that he pull them in a wagon, he strained to do so, as Emilie and Anna watched. The weight was too much for him and he developed a hernia. The family firmly believed this caused his death, age 8.

For many years the family has not known the location of Hjalmar and Hjalmar's graves. Martin Johansen and Even Johansen (Martin's son) were buried in the Norwegian cemetery, an unmarked cemetery lying adjacent to the Armour Cemetery, Coolidge, Texas. The two cemeteries are separated only by a dry creek bed or swale. Martin and Even's graves, marked with beautiful marble headstones, are located at the back of the cemetery near a barb-wire fence that separates the cemetery from some farm property. Pauline Jenson (widow of Jim Jenson, son of Christain Jenson, Emma's brother) mows and cares for these cemeteries. She was able to determine that there is an adult buried to the left of Martin, the customary place for a wife's burial, so, logically Annie, his wife. Beside Martin's grave, there are two field stones, no engraving, marking the position of two children's graves. This is the reasonable place for burying Martin's two grandsons, Hjalmar and Hjalmar.

Back in the "Old Country", Norway, some years earlier, work was hard to find. Jens Olsin, Emma's father, found work in Sweden. (At that time Norway was ruled by Sweden. Norway gained her independence peacefully in 1905.) While working in Sweden, Jens became enamored of a young Swedish girl, Kirsti Eriksdatter Snarvold. Returning to his home in Norway, he brought Kirsti with him as his bride.

Jens Olsin and Kirsti's children were Beata (Borg). Emma (Johansen), Carl Jensen (died of TB in 1920's), Olaf Jensen, Christain Jenson and John Jensen. (John married Mary Murray but left her and disappeared. Mary was sister to Jenny Jensen, Pete Antonsen's wife.)

In 1910 Jens Johansen moved his family to a farm he purchased near Thompson Gin, seven miles from Hubbard. Thompson Gin was also in Limestone County, a smaller community with only a two room school, named Cowser, and the cotton gin. There was a small store in conjunction with the gin which sold only a very few non-perishable necessities, such as kerosene and a few canned groceries. It carried

a very few small luxuries, like candy bars, often stale.

Here, in Thompson Gin, the last six Johansen children were born: Twins, John Otto and Jimmie Frederick, Catherine Louise, Pauline Margaret, Leon Herman and Inga Mable.

Education for the children was important to the Johansen family, determined that they and their children would have a better life in America. Anna, the oldest child, was sent to Clifton to enroll in Clifton Lutheran College (CLC) in Bosque County. The cotton crop was late the next year. Anna was kept home until after the cotton harvest. She arrived in Clifton too late to re-enroll in CLC. Instead she went to Toby's Business School, graduating with honors. After graduating from Toby's and finding work, Anna took Marie in. Marie attended upper school and earned her teaching certificate.

Marie taught school for a year. She married Verner Hassell, a cotton farmer. There are seven children of this marriage: Christine, Geraldine, Vivian, Venita. Betty. Owen and Shirley.

Anna married a Norwegian immigrant, John Oscar Ronning, in 1922. Anna, born and raised in America, became an alien because of her marriage. John was naturalized 27 February 1927. Anna took the Oath of Allegiance and was repatriated 16 July 1941. They had three children, Evelyn, Frances and John, Jr. John was a master machinist. Anna was the only one of the Johansen children to marry a Norwegian.

Of the four Johansen boys, three, Carl, Jimmie and Leon, stayed on the farm. Carl, the third son and fifth child, married Maggie Bryant. They had two sons, James and Royce. Carl was a cotton farmer and a community leader in his quiet way. Deeply religious, he often led services at Bowman Baptist Church, located in another of the small communities in the area. After he retired, he and Maggie would lead the "singing" at Hubbard Nursing Home about once a week.

Emilie lived in Corsicana for 3 1/2 years with Emma's sister, Beata (nee Jensen) Borg, earning her high school diploma from Corsicana High School in this time. She then moved to Dallas, living with Anna and John, until she graduated from business school and found work as a secretary. Emilie married Leonard Bittner, a Western Union employee. They had two girls, Jacquelyn Joyce and Carol Jean.

Olena lived with sister, Anna, in Dallas, while attending high school. She took a business major and became a legal secretary. Olena married Shadden Rountree, a salesman. They had one daughter, Emma Jo.

True to their Lutheran tradition, John and Anna Ronning, Olena and Emilie Johansen, were charter members of Central Lutheran Church, Organized in Dallas, TX in 1922. Olena was confirmed in Central's first confirmation class in 1925.

Johnny worked his way through the A&M College of Texas, earning his degree in landscape architecture. Johnny served as a radar technician during World War II, when radar was in its infancy and very, very top secret. He was in #66 Service Corp attached to the Navy, rank Tech 4. After the war, he was Parks Director for the City of Big Spring, Texas, for many years. Johnnie married Elizabeth Akers. They had three children, John, Jr., Betty and Carl Edward.

Jimmie, Johnny's twin. married Nina Ruth Lambert. They had two children, Mickey and Beverly. Jimmie bought the farm adjoining the old homestead which had the old Cowser School building on it. A cotton farmer, he also worked at the State School in Mexia.

Schools were consolidated in the 30's. From Thompson Gin students were taken into Hubbard to the public schools. The last three girls,

Catherine, Pauline, and Inga, graduated from Hubbard High School.

Catherine lived with John and Anna while she went to linotype school. It was here she met her future husband, Harry Coutant. After they graduated from the school, Catherine worked as a linotype operator for the "Dallas Morning News". Harry became a sheet metal worker, working as foreman at American Sheet Metal in Dallas. Catherine and Harry had two children, Paul and Linda Kay. Paul died in an industrial accident while working in Dallas.

Pauline came to Dallas and went to work for American Sheet Metal before Harry did. She and went to kneed a Sorority with a group of girls from the "Y". This group has stayed active and in contact with each other through the years. "Polly" married her boss-owner of American Sheet Metal, Robert E. (Bob) Allison, "Mr. A.". This was his second marriage. They had no children.

Leon served as a Corporal in the Army Air Force during WW II. He received a medal as an expert rifleman. Shairbshooter. He is living on the old homestead, raising cattle. He grows grass (Coastal Bermuda) for himself and other farmers. He has a fairly large inventory of heavy farm machinery, which he hires out to neighboring farmers. His marriage to Dorothy Ray Hull ended in divorce. No children.

Inga married Horace Combest, a civilian personnel manager for the Naval Station in Corpus Christi. Texas. until his retirement. Inga worked as an aide in the Corpus Christi Schools. They had one son, David.

Emma lived on the farm with her youngest son, Leon, until about 1960. At that time she moved to Dallas, dividing her time between her daughters, Olena, Anna and Pauline. Emma was not content. Hoping to make Emma happier, John and Anna moved to Hubbard, TX, taking her with them. Here she would be closer to the farm, friends and her three children who remained in the area. She and John spent many happy hours reminiscing about the "Old Country" in their native Norwegian language. Emma died in a Dallas hospital 28 May 1964. She is buried beside her husband, Jens Johansen, in the Armour Cemetery in Coolidge.

First person is number one: should be YOU.

All males are even numbers. Your father is 2, grandfathers 4 and 6, your great grandfathers are 8 and 10 and 12 and 14. Your great great grandfathers are 16, 18, 20, 22, 24, 26, 28, and 30, etc.

Females are always odd numbers (except that 1 can be male or female, of course.) A wife is always one number more than her husband. Hence, mother is 3, grandmothers are 5 and 7, great grandmothers are 9, 11, 13 and 15 etc.

A father is always twice the number of his child and the mother is always twice the child's number plus one.

Using the ahnentafel numbers can be a great filing tool—any one of your ancestors has one and only one distinct number—and a great reporting tool because so many ancestors can be listed on one page.

Who is number 480? The father of 240, who is the father of 120, the father of 60, the father of 30 who is one of your great grandfathers.

Who is number 70? The father of 35. And what is distinct about 35? Only females have odd numbers. Number 35 is female, the wife of 34 who is father if 17, another female--the wife of 16 who is the father of 8, the father of 4, the father of 2 who is your father.

DESCENDANCY NUMBERING

For further discussion see William Dollarhide's book MANAGING A GENEALOGICAL PROJECT.

REGISTER system: Used by the New England Historical and Genealogical Society in their periodical THE REGISTER. Uses numbers and little letters (a,b,c,d) in two columns—an adult column and a child column. Children whose lines are not continued do not receive a number—only a letter.

RECORD system: Used by the National Genealogical Society in their QUARTERLY. Uses numbers (such as 1,2,3,4) and roman numerals indicating birth order (i,ii,iii,iv). Each individual gets a number. Those lines continued in the discussion are marked with a plus (+).

HENRY system: (Named after the man who first used it) Uses numbers in order to indicate succeeding generation. So that the number 13572 indicates-reading from right back to left--the second child of the seventh child of the fifth child of the third child of the first child. The HENRY system's major flaw it that many families had more than nine children. Mr. Dollarhide suggests combining numbers and letters to resolve that problem.

DODGEN system: This system combines the Ahnentafel system with the Henry system and uses periods to separate the generations. The first number is the Ahnentafel number. Succeeding numbers indicate the birth order.

16.3.6.11.2 The first number is Ahnentafel number. The second number indicates that the individual was the third child of the person numbered 16; the third number that the person was the 6th child of the third child of 16 etc. This system allows for numbers over 10 because the period separates the generations.

So the children of Ahnentafel number 16 on your chart are numbered 16.1, 16.2, 18.3 etc.

The children of 16.1 are 16.1.1, 16.1.2, 16.1.3 16.1.4 etc.

The children of 16.2 are 16.2.1, 16.2.2 etc.

The children of 16.3.6 are 16.3.6.1, 16.3.6.2, 16.3.6.3 etc.

a numbered individual is YOUR direct ancestor, put parentheses. Ahnentafel number be can in 16.1(8).2(4).3(2).1(1) indicates that I (number 1 on the right and on the Ahnentafel chart) was the first child of my father, who was the third child of his father, who was the second child of his father who was the first child of the individual numbered 16 on my chart (my great great grandfather).

GENERAL INFORMATION

PURPOSE: Austin Genealogical Society was organized in 1960 as a not-for-profit corporation chartered by the State of Texas. Its purposes are to collect and preserve genealogical and historical information about the people of Texas, particularly pertaining to the City of Austin and to Travis and surrounding counties; to instruct and assist members in genealogical research; and to publish public and private records of genealogical interest. In addition, the AGS supports the Genealogical Collection, Texas State Library by donations of books and other genealogical material. Gifts and bequests to AGS are tax-deductible to the full extent permitted by law.

MEMBERSHIP is open to all upon payment of annual dues: \$15 per individual, or family **mem**bership of \$17 for two in the same household, entitling them to one copy of each Quarterly and monthly Newsletter, as well as two pages apiece (a total of four pages for \$17 whether one or two people submit listings) in the Ancestor Listing issue (June). **After 1 July**, dues are \$7.50 for the balance of the year, but you will only receive the publications produced after the date you join.

DUES FOR EXISTING MEMBERS ARE PAYABLE on or before JANUARY FIRST of each year for the ensuing year. If dues are not received by 1 February, the name must be dropped from the mailing list. If membership is reinstated later and Quarterlies and Newsletters have to be mailed individually, postage must be charged. (Back Quarterlies are supplied only IF available--very few extras are printed). Send payment to AGS Treasurer, P.O. Box 1507, Austin TX 78767-1507.

MISSING COPIES: If your Quarterly does not reach you by the 10th of April, July, October or December, notify the Society at Box 1507, Austin TX 78767-1507. (Note: Exchange Quarterly Chairmen should use the TEXAS STATE LIBRARY address on the inside front cover). Members who fail to give AGS sufficient advance notice of address changes and whose Quarterly is returned by the Post Office will be responsible for the postal fee for returned copies and for remailing the copy at individual rather than bulk mailing rates.

MEETINGSof the general membership begin at 7:30 p.m. on the fourth Tuesday of each month except August and December. Members are encouraged to come as early as 6:30 to socialize with each other. BOOK REVIEW POLICY: Books on appropriate subjects related to genealogy will be reviewed, but CANNOT be reviewed in AGSQ on the basis of advertising alone. If a review copy is received by the Review Editor at 2202 W. 10th. St., Austin TX 78703 by the first of February, May, August or October, it will be reviewed in the next Quarterly, space permitting. It will then be placed in the Genealogy Collection, Texas State Library, available to all patrons.

CHECK RETURN POLICY: Members and other payees <u>must</u> pay AGS the cost of any returned check (currently \$5.00) over and above the charge their bank may impose.

AGS QUARTERLY is issued about the middle of March, June, September and November. Contributions are welcome, subject to editing for style/size. Contributor is completely responsible for accuracy and any copyright infringement. AGS assumes no responsibility for content of submitted material. See inside front cover for address.

ANCESTOR LISTING PAGES (June issue of Quarterly) must reach the Editor at 4500 Hyridge Drive, Austin TX 78759-8054 by the TENTH OF MAY. They must be BLACK and LEGIBLE, whether typed, handwritten, computer-printed or in superior calligraphy. Months must be SPELLED or abbreviated, not in figures. BE SURE to proofread your material for accuracy and clarity so we will not publish faulty or incorrect data. Put name and address of submitter **on each page** in legible form (not blind embossed). Consult a recent June Quarterly for suggestions. Remember that reproductions are dimmer than originals so try to provide good quality originals.

REMEMBER: \$15 membership secures two facing pages. \$17 membership allows you four pages.

DEADLINES for everything in the Quarterly except book reviews: 10th of February, May, August and October. Material sent addressed only to AGS Box Number may not reach Editor in time.
