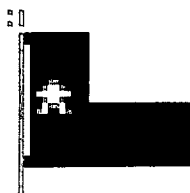

Guidelines For Publishing Web Pages On The Internet

Recommended by the National Genealogical Society, May 2000

Appreciating that publishing information through Internet web sites and web pages shares many similarities with print publishing, considerate family historians —

- ✦ apply a single title to an entire web site, as they would to a book, placing it both in the <TITLE> HTML tag that appears at the top of the web browser window for each web page to be viewed, and also in the body of the web document, on the opening home, title or index page.
- ✦ explain the purposes and objectives of their web sites, placing the explanation near the top of the title page or including a link from that page to a special page about the reason for the site.
- ✦ display a footer at the bottom of each web page which contains the web site title, page title, author's name, author's contact information, date of last revision and a copyright statement.
- ✦ provide complete contact information, including at a minimum a name and e-mail address, and preferably some means for long-term contact, like a postal address.
- ✦ assist visitors by providing on each page navigational links that lead visitors to other important pages on the web site, or return them to the home page.
- ✦ adhere to the NGS "Standards for Sharing Information with Others" regarding copyright, attribution, privacy, and the sharing of sensitive information.
- ✦ include unambiguous source citations for the research data provided on the site, and if not complete descriptions, offering full citations upon request.
- ✦ label photographic and scanned images within the graphic itself, with fuller explanation if required in text adjacent to the graphic.
- ✦ identify transcribed, extracted or abstracted data as such, and provide appropriate source citations.
- ✦ include identifying dates and locations when providing information about specific surnames or individuals.
- ✦ respect the rights of others who do not wish information about themselves to be published, referenced or linked on a web site.
- ✦ provide web site access to all potential visitors by avoiding enhanced technical capabilities that may not be available to all users, remembering that not all computers are created equal.
- ✦ avoid using features that distract from the productive use of the web site, like ones that reduce legibility, strain the eyes, dazzle the vision, or otherwise detract from the visitor's ability to easily read, study, comprehend or print the online publication.
- ✦ maintain their online publications at frequent intervals, changing the content to keep the information current, the links valid, and the web site in good working order.
- ✦ preserve and archive for future researchers their online publications and communications that have lasting value, using both electronic and paper duplication.

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GENEALOGICAL STANDARDS

I was going through some material given me several years ago by my "double" second cousin, and found the original clipping containing this story written by my great aunt Bessie, my paternal grandmother's youngest sister (on whose birthday I was born). The clipping is dated May 8, 1896, and is from "Wallaces' Farmer and Dairyman," page 8 (316), which is titled "Hearts and Homes" and has the following explanatory note: "This department is conducted by Mrs. Henry Wallace, Des Moines, Iowa, who invites contributions from all of its readers." Many people will recognize the name Henry Wallace, as among other things, the owner/ editor of this particular newspaper, which was very popular among the farmers. If I remember correctly, he also ran for public office a number of times. At any rate, Mrs. Wallace included a "Personal Note," explaining that she had initiated a contest in which children submitted stories they had written, and although prolonged illness prevented her from judging the stories herself, a friend, Mrs. Barbara Carver, who has for years been a contributor to various magazines and newspapers" had been the judge. Details of the judging process followed, with the remark that "the prize story is published this week." A runner-up and other articles of human interest appear on the same full page clipping, including recipes, and a fruit cobbler and dumplings to be made using the same dough, and served with a "boiled dinner," and "relished by the family on a cool day."

McLaughlin Family Genealogy

Ed. Note: In the last issue we brought you excerpts of the McLaughlin family genealogy furnished us by Myra Eichenburger of Livingston, TX. We regretfully excerpted a bit carelessly because, if we understand it correctly, the sire of this McLaughlin family was Elias McLaughlin, born in Carlisle PA in 1811 and whose Family Group Record should have appeared last time. We presented instead the Record of his fourth child, Chatham "Chat" Ewing McLaughlin. Below is Elias' Family Group Record, followed by discussions of Chatham and three of his nine children. Discussions of additional children will follow in the next issue. As you may note from the discussions, the McLaughlins have been quite involved with Texas and Austin history.

Chatham "Chat" Ewing McLaughlin Family

Chat was born on 15 April 1844 in New Lisbon, Columbiana, County, Ohio. Rowena was born on 1 July 1854 in Galveston, Galveston County, Texas.

Chat moved to Texas with his family when he was about 9 years old. The family settled in Belton, Texas for about 7 years and then moved to Austin, Texas about 1860. Chat served in the Confederate Army for 4 years, from the age of 17 to 20. His job was to confiscate horses for the army's use.

After the end of the Civil War, Chat began a long career in various facets of the newspaper business. In 1865, at 21 years of age, he returned to Houston to work as a printer on the eight-page Houston Telegraph, a daily which dominated Texas papers during Reconstruction. In 1866, he became a charter member of local #87 of the Houston Typographers Union and he remained active in union locals throughout his long career. He worked at the Houston Daily Telegraph until 1868 and thereafter worked as a printer on newspapers in Dallas, Galveston, and Austin. In all of these places he was a member of the typographers local unions. He was president of the Austin Typographical Union for many years.

It was while he was in Galveston that he met and fell in love with Rowena. They were married on his birthday in 1872, he was 28 years old, she was only 17 years old. They were married in the home of her grandmother, Eliza Delphine Totten Terheun. In one of her writings Rena McLaughlin Darter wrote: "So one April morning at 6 o'clock she was married to Chatham McLaughlin by the Rev. J.G. John, a Methodist minister who was an ancestor of George O'Brien John who married another Rowena McLaughlin several generations later." Chat and Rowena moved to Austin, Texas to live with his parents in a house that was identified in the City Directory as a boarding house on Peach Street, between Lavaca and Guadalupe. The house was later given the address 304 West 13th Street. It is one block west of the Texas Capitol Building. Elias and Amelia must have rented rooms in the house, because the house stayed in the family. Chat and Rowena had nine children, three girls and six boys. Chat liked to tell people that they had 3 and a half dozen children.

Chat's printing and newspaper career in Austin, Texas included but is not limited to the following newspapers and print shops. Austin Daily Evening News (1876); Democratic Statesman (1877); Chat and his brother Wesley published The Texas Capitol (1877 - 1881); Chat and Wesley were also doing book and job printing from their shop on the south side of Pecan Street (6th Street); between Brazos and Congress, (1879); Austin Argus, (1884); edited the Austin Evening Tribune (1884); printer at State Printing (1891); printer at the Benjamin C. Jones Company (1893); printer at Benjamin C. Jones and Company (1895-7); proofreader for the Gammel Statesman Publishing Company (1903); proofreader for the State Printing Company, (1905); Chat was a printer for the Austin Forum and Sifter (1909); stereotyper foreman for the Austin Statesman (1912).

Maud married Justin A. Paddleford in 1895. She and her mother both had daughters born in 1896. (Maud named her daughter Rena after her younger sister, Rowena named her daughter Mildred Amelia). When the 1900 Census was taken all the children, except Guy and Maud, were still living at home with their parents. Guy was living in Chicago, Illinois. He married Frances "Fannie" Clemow of Houston, in Chicago, Illinois on 16 November 1900. Also in 1900, Hugh McLaughlin married Callie Mae Eaton. On 18 Dec 1907, Fred McLaughlin married Della Sperry in Nephi, Utah. In 1909, Rowena had the first of a series of strokes. She was paralyzed on one side of her body and confined to a wheelchair. She remained paralyzed the rest of her life.

When the 1910 US Census was taken the only children still at home were Rena, DeWitt and Mildred "Millie/Mickie". Chat, Jr. married Anna Tracy sometime before Rena married William Darter on 7 June 1911. On 9 September 1912, Allan married Ruby K. Spears in Austin, Texas. On 26 June 1917, Chat, Jr. married

Julia "Judy" Burke Costellos in Portland, Oregon. About 1917, William Alexander Darter and his family moved to Brenham. Chat, his wife, Rowena, and their daughter, Mildred who had been living with the Darters, moved to Brenham with them. In July 1923, the extended family, Rena & Bill Darter and their 4 children and Rowena & Chat and their daughter Mildred "Millie/Mickie" moved to Giddings. On 8 August 1923, Mildred married William "Scot" Sutherland Milligan in Austin, Texas. And on 11 Sep 1924, DeWitt married Evangeline Kroh in Peking, China.

On 7 April 1927, Rowena Amelia Terheun McLaughlin died in Giddings, Texas. She was buried the next day in Austin, Texas, in Oakwood Cemetery. After the death of his wife, Chat moved to Washington, DC to live with his oldest daughter, Maud Paddleford, and her family. On 3 September 1929 Chat died in Washington, D.C. Hugh went to Washington, D.C. and brought his father home to Austin, Texas to be buried next to his wife.

Guy McLaughlin/MacLaughlin Family

Guy (nmn) McLaughlin was born on 11 March 1873, in Galveston, Texas, at the home of his maternal grandmother, Eliza Delphine Totten Terheun. He was the first child of Rowena Amelia Terheun and Chatham Ewing McLaughlin. When he was born his parents were living in the same house that his grandparents, Amelia Jane Wheatley and Elias McLaughlin, had bought when they moved to Austin about 1860. The address of the house was 304 West 13th Street, and was located one block west of the Texas Capitol Building. Frances "Fannie" Cecilia Clemow was born on 6 December 1881, in Houston, Texas. She was the daughter of Minerva Harris and Nelson Clemow.

In 1895, Guy was living with his parents and working as a Notary Public. He also sold advertising for The Rolling Stone, an Austin weekly newspaper edited by William Porter, later known as O. Henry. He served in the Spanish American War as Chief Clerk of 1 st Division of the 7th Army Corps. On 11 August 1898, he was promoted to Corporal in Company A, 1st Regiment of the Texas Volunteers. He was also a war correspondent for the Houston Post (newspaper).

Sometime before he was married, Guy changed the spelling of his last name from McLaughlin to MacLaughlin, changing it made it appear to be of Scottish origins, not Irish. It is interesting to note that his grandfather had changed the spelling from McGlaughlin to McLaughlin about 1836.} Guy married Fannie in Chicago, Illinois on 16 November 1900. They had five children, all born in Houston, Texas: Margaret (20 November 1901), Frances Eugenia (6 December 1902), Donald (5 June 1906), Rowena (11 September 1910) and Guy, Jr (15 September 1915).

Guy worked for the Franklin Life Insurance Company from 1910 until his retirement in 1933. He was active in the establishment of American College of Life Underwriters. Houston Association of Life Underwriters honored him by placing a bronze plaque with his name inscribed in the lobby of the National Association of Life Underwriters in Washington, D.C. (This honor happened before his death and pleased him very much.) He was active in cultural affairs in Houston in the early 1900's. He was secretary-treasurer of Houston Music Festival in 1911 and secretary to the association that brought Grand Opera to Houston. He played an important part in the formation of Houston Little Theater. He served as chief registration officer for City of Houston during the First World War. He was a Life Member of Houston Club, a member of Trinity Episcopal Church, and a member of Houston Light Guard Veterans Association. He served on advisory board of Salvation Army and served as Chairman of Publicity Department of the Houston Chamber of Commerce.

Fannie died on 17 March 1956; Guy died on 8 May 1960. They both died in Houston are buried there in Glenwood Cemetery.

Maud McLaughlin/Justin Abijah Paddleford Family

Justin Abijah Paddleford was born 9 March 1870 in Henry County, Missouri. He was the son of Davis Abijah Paddleford and Mary Sidna Sewell. His mother died 9 August 1875 and his father remarried Sallie Kuhn Waring Barnett, a 19 year old widow on 25 December 1879. They had nine children. The family moved to Texas and Justin Abijah left home and lived with Uncle Henry. Maud (nmn) McLaughlin was born on 8 January 1875, in Austin, Travis County, Texas. She was the 2nd child of Rowena Amelia Terheun and Chatham Ewing McLaughlin. When she was born her parents were living in the same house that her grandparents, Amelia Jane Wheatley and Elias McLaughlin, had bought when they moved to Austin about 1860. The address of the house was 304 West 13th Street, and it was located one block west of the Texas Capitol Building.

Justin Abijah became a printer in the old hand set days and worked on newspapers in Austin. He was one of the first to learn to operate the new lineotype machines for printing newspapers and magazines. Maud graduated from Austin High School with honors, about 1893. They were married in Austin on 28 March 1895 at the home of Maud's parents. Their first child, Rena Adelia, was born in Austin on 4 June 1896. In 1900, Maud and her family lived in the cottage next door to her parents. Maud was still living in Austin in 1909 when her mother had the first of a series of strokes that left her partially paralyzed. In 1911, Maud's younger sister, Rena, was married in her home. Maud made her wedding dress.

About 1915 Maud's daughter, Rena Adelia, moved to Washington, D.C. to attend school. She was studying to become a kindergarten teacher. While she was there she met her future husband, Howard Andrew Sherman, and they were married on 14 June 1916. It was about this same time that Maud and Justin Abijah moved to Washington, D.C. On 20 March 1917, Maud had a son, Justin Davis. The family moved to Takoma Park, Maryland, and then in 1922, Justin Abijah built a Sears and Roebuck house at 2300 Monroe Street, NE, Washington, D.C.

Justin Abijah worked as lineotype operator and proof reader in Government Printing Office until mandatory retirement at age 65 in 1935, he did the proof reading for the Congressional Journal. He had been leading the office in amount of type set at the time of his retirement. After retirement from the government, he worked for the National Publishing Company until final retirement after his wife died. Justin Abijah was very active in the Masonic order, and was secretary of the the East Gate Chapter, Royal Arch Masons in Washington for many years. He became a Shriner after moving to Cumberland, Maryland.

Maud died on 7 April 1940 in Washington, D.C. After her death Justin Abijah went to live with Justin Davis in Cumberland, Maryland, and later lived with his daughter, Rena Adelia, in New York. He died on 1 December 1950.

Hugh McLaughlin Family

Hugh (nmn) McLaughlin was born on 12 January 1877, in Austin, Texas. He was the 3rd child of Rowena Amelia Terheun and Chatham Ewing McLaughlin. When he was born, his parents were living in the same house that his grandparents, Amelia Jane Wheatley and Elias McLaughlin, had bought when they moved to Austin about 1860. The address of the house was 304 West 13th Street, and it was located one block west of the Texas Capitol Building. Callie Mae Eaton was born on 26 September 1880 in St. Joseph, Texas. She was the daughter of Belle Cook and William Eaton.

Hugh attended Austin High School, the Austin Business College and Southern Methodist University. He was a Court Reporter for the United States District Court, Western District of Texas. The 1900 U.S. Census shows him living with his parents and gives his occupation as Stenographer. On 14 September 1900, he married Callie Mae Eaton in Austin. They had five children: Hugh McLaughlin, Jr (25 June 1901), Thelma McLaughlin, Mae Rena McLaughlin (10 March 1908), Rosalie McLaughlin (28 October 1910), and Norman McLaughlin (30 September 1912). Hugh attended a Houston night law school. He also studied with Judge Townes, and passed the bar examination with highest honors. He was admitted to the bar on June 9, 1915 and practiced in Houston and Dallas before settling in Dallas in 1918.

He was a specialist in the field of taxation as it affected railroads. He went to Dallas in 1917 as Assistant Tax Commissioner for the Texas and Pacific Railroad company, and he retained this position until the time of his death.

From 1917 to 1919, his brother, Fred, was confined to Walter Reed Hospital in Washington, D.C., first suffering from the flu which was epidemic that year, and later from tuberculosis he contracted while in the hospital. While Fred was hospitalized, Hugh went to Washington, D.C. and then took Fred's wife, Delia and their three children to Utah to stay with Della's family. In 1927, when his father died, Hugh went to Washington, D.C. and took his body back on the train to Austin, Texas for burial.

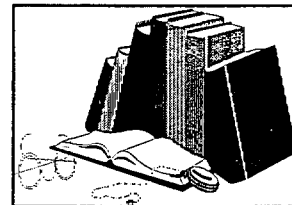

HEINRICH AND DOROTHEA (KEIDEL) KREBS REUNION HELD AT SHELBY, TEXAS

Descendants of Heinrich and Dorothea (Keidel) Krebs met on September 17, 2000 at the American Legion Hall at Shelby, Texas in Fayette County. All family reunions are held at this same hall. When the Krebs family arrived in Texas in the year 1847 their first home was in this Shelby area. Many Krebs families still live in this area.

A catered meal of ham, roast beef and all the trimmings was served to 125 people in attendance. Good home made German cakes, pies and cookies were for dessert.

At last year's reunion the first Krebs Family History book---An Eight Generation Journey --- was printed and sold. This year correction, additions and picture sheets were added to keep the book up to date.

The background and cloth worn by these people are very elegant. If our ancestors had taken the time to write names on these pictures, it would mean so much more to our generations now. Out-of-state family members came from Wichita, Kansas: Richard and Sherelyn McLaury, Sr., fifth generation descendant of Heinrich and Dorothea Krebs.
