BEAR/BAIR/BAER

My great-great uncle, **JOSEPH BAIR** was b. Westmoreland Co., PA, 1842; d. Iowa City, IA, age 97, 1939, as oldest Civil War Veteran, Johnson Co, IA. PA US Census, a850, reports Bears migrated from VA to PA; I'm trying to connect them to my family.

Joseph Bair fought with Sherman on his march to the sea, and years later belonged to the GAR—Grand Army of the Republic—veteran's organization in Mt. Vernon, IA. Joseph and his brother **ANDREW BAIR**, who was needed to support his widowed mother and family, and who did not go to war, migrated to Crawford Co., IA, joined by their brother **SAM BAIR**, a Civil War veteran. Joseph arrived in Clinton Co., IA, 1861, then to Linn Co., IA, 1871. He lived near Mt. Vernon, Linn Co., IA, while Sam lived sw of Denison and Andrew (my great-grandfather) lived in Friend's Grove, IA.

On Joseph's death, he left 3 daughters and 3 sons, and a number of nieces and nephews lived in the Iowa City area, according to the obituary.

I need names and locations of Joseph Bair's descendants so I might learn more of the Bair family history. **Dan and Kathleen Baer, PO Box 335, Oak Grove, MO 64075-0335; dkbaer@discoverynet.com**

This inquiry was first printed in "The Bair Family Newsletter," September 2002, and concerned the "other Bair Family," those not related to my maternal ancestry of Mt. Vernon, Iowa. I received additional information by mail recently as a result of my attempting to help distinguish the inquirer's Bair family from mine. "The Bair Family Newsletter" will be defunct after the December 2002 issue, having existed since Jan. 9, 1979. —LFH

WALKER/JAMES

WILLIAM WALKER was my great-grandfather, reported d. at home of his son-in-law, **WILL (WILLIAM) JAMES** 1890. Austin City Directories, 1887 through 1894 show William B. James, teamster (expressman) successively at 1409 Red River (along with **WILLIAM J. JAMES**, teamster) then at "se cor Brazos, E 16th" and "se cor E. 19th, Brazos." Also present at the first of these was **JAMES JAMES**, teamster.

The latter addresses were those of William Walker, stonecutter, and at those addresses was **JESSE WALKER**, laborer, later described as an expressman, and possibly as a plumber working for Grooms Hardware, rooming with **D. (David?) PENNINGTON**, and boarding at the Capitol Hotel (1891-1892).

Was **THOMAS WALKER** part of this family (not listed after 1887-1888)? When were these men married? Who were their wives and children? Where did they go after the last listings of 1893-1894?

NOTICE TO YOUNG LADIES WIDOWS AND OLD MAIDS

Whereas my husband Isaac W. Odom left home without any just provocation on Saturday night the 11th instant with an intention of not returning this is to forwarn all persons from stopping him or impeding him on his journey in any way whatever as I am resolved not to pursue him as this is the second time he has made the attempt. I particularly forwarn all young ladies or widows from marrying or harboring him as I do positively assure them that they would rue their bargain. He is about 5 feet 11 inches high spare made light hair blue eyes tolerably talkative fond of company 19 years old. Any person seeing him will do me a favor by advising him never to return as I positively will never live with him.

/s/ Mahalah Ann Odom Yalobusha Co. Nov. 23 1837

Recently I read the above item in an online genealogical periodical,¹ and considered it too good not to share. So I passed it on to have a dozen or so friends. One replied, "I wonder whatever happened to the cad?" "Excellent question," thought I, and went to Ancestry.com to see if I could learn more. The unhappy couple was not related to me in any way, but it seemed like an interesting genealogical exercise.

The results were interesting. Isaac appears on the 1850 and 1855 Coffee County, Alabama census, which dovetails with land records that he acquired 161.9 acres there in 1858. But the 1860 Census found him in Jackson Township, Maries County, Missouri.

Still more intruiging was his marital career. Online genealogical resources are often unreliable and contradictory, but Mississippi marriage records show a wedding for Isaac Odom and Mahala Ann Fowler in Yalobusha County on 9 September 1839, nearly two years *after* her vow never to see him again. Nothing more could be learned of Mahala(h), but three years later Isaac married 17-year old Lavina Coffey, reportedly in Maries County, and they became parents of seven children. In 1862 at age 44, Isaac married yet another young bride, Mary Jane Petty, then barely 18. Four more children appeared at regular intervals, stopped only by his death in Howell County, Missouri in 1873 at age 55.

Ancestry.com listed half-a-dozen persons claiming Isaac as an ancestor. On one hand, Mahalah's public notice would be considered unwelcome news by many genealogists who hold their forbears in optimistically high esteem. But I thought I would certainly want to know information so juicy about one of *my* ancestors. So I forwarded the RootsWeb piece. Their reactions were interesting. One thought certainly it must have been a different Isaac Walker Odom, born in 1818 in Mississippi. Another was grateful for the information and speculated on the reaction of the later wives, had they seen the notice. But my favorite was from a Ms. Gutierrez of San Antonio:

Thank you very much. I laugh it sounds like one of my brothers. Well he wasn't a horse thief. I am taking off on a trip, will get back latter. That woman were strong lady. He is lucky she didn't shut him.

After landing at Galveston, they traveled to Round Top and settled.

Registration for the reunion started at 10:30 a.m. and again the color code system was used. The families of each descendant wore different color name tags. Group pictures were taken of each descendant's family. The table prayer was given by Edgar Leonhardt, first in German and then in English, and the noon meal followed.

The meeting was called to order by president Birdie Barker, and Alice Kneip, secretary-treasurer read the minutes and gave the treasurer's report from last year's reunion.

Vivian Kneip Barker is chairperson for getting the five new grave markers put on the cemeteries. Grave markers for Felix Etzel and Carl Kneip were put on at Florida Chapel cemetery and grave markers for William and Theodore Kneip and the old Grandpa Adolph Kneip were put on at the cemetery at Round Top Bethlehem Lutheran Church. Both cemeteries are in Round Top. This project is now complete and the graves will not be forgotten.

Loretta Leonhardt reported the Kneip Family History Book committee has gathered very interesting family information. At this time, 836 family members have been documented.

Officers for 2003 were elected: president – Jerry Kneip, Kerrville, Texas; vice president – Leland Kruse, Taylor, Texas; secretary-treasurer – Jane Kneip Patterson; food committee – Melvin (Pat) Patterson, Sweeney, Texas; Family History Book – Gladiola Martin Kruse, Taylor, Texas; Lydia Ann Mayer Heins, Brenham, Texas; and Loretta Hartfield Leonardt, Red Rock, Texas.

Oldest person attended was Edgar Leonardt of Red Rock, and youngest person was Cassidee White of Marble Falls, Texas. Longest married couple was Edgar and Loretta Hartfield Leonhardt of Red Rock and most recent married couple was Norman and June Kneip Wiginton of Woodsboro, Texas. Birdie Barker won the adult candy guessing game, and Ashley Biggs won the children's candy guessing game.

Next year's reunion will be held on July 13 at the same location.

45th Krebs Reunion held in September

One hundred ten Krebs Family members gathered at the American Legion Hall in Shelby, Texas, Fayette County, on Sept. 15, 2002. For the past 45 years, this has been their place to gather and to remember, "Where we came from and who we are."

Heinrich and Dorothea (Keidel) Krebs and their eight children -- Wilhelm, Franz, Marie, Otto, Theodore, Edward, Hermann and Julius -- left Alberbuitel, Hanover, Germany, for their Journey to Galveston, Texas, arriving at Galveston on Nov. 27, 1847. Marie, their only daughter, had a twin sister who died at a very young age and was buried in Germany. In 1849, Heinrich

and Dorothea had another child, a little girl, who did not survive. She was buried on the Krebs farm near Shelby Texas. This was the beginning of the Krebs Family Cemetery. Over the years, family members were buried there, with more than 80 graves in the cemetery.

Registration started at 10:30 a.m. and different colored dots on nametags were used for each direct descendant. Spouses had the same color, with a heart in the center of the dot. Wilhelm, the oldest child who married Augusta Ortman, had the most children, and many of the descendants still live around the Shelby area. For those, two small dots of different colors were placed on the name tags to show which family they descended from.

Prizes were given to "super seniors," those 80 years and older, including Adolph and Elvia (Weyand) Schmidt, from Seguin, Texas; Edgar and Ida (Krause) Schmidt from Round Top, Texas; Weldon and Cora Nell (Strickler) Liebscher from La Grange, Texas; and Glenora (Gaertner) Krebs from Shelby, Texas.

Children's books were given to the younger family members: Allysa Rudloff, Sydney Krebs, Brice Pizzitola, Luke Lahrmann and Zack Powers.

My History is America's History: National Endowment for the Humanities encourages families to save ancestors' stories and history

Thanks to a school history project at Austin's Highland Park Elementary School, Lexington resident Bill Schobey now knows his 79-year-old father's story of moving in 1929 from Jeddo, Texas, a small farming community south of Bastrop, to Gonzales.

When fourth-grader Zach Mallard-Schobey interviewed his great-grandparents recently and asked a question about moving as a child, William Schobey told the story of making a 42-mile trip to Gonzales in a wagon pulled by two mules. The family left their farm in Jeddo before daylight and arrived in Gonzales after midnight. Zach's great-grandfather was 6, and the family left Jeddo to get jobs in the Gonzales cotton mill.

It is stories such as this that the National Endowment for the Humanities wants to preserve through its family history project called My History is America's History. The project encourages families to explore their own stories and learn how they link to our nation's history.

The organization suggests preserving your family's history by starting a journal as a gift for your children and grandchildren and by interviewing relatives about their early memories, school, chores and news they remember.

Covenant Presbyterian Church, 3303 Northland, Austin A 40-Year History by Jane Mack

Covenant Presbyterian Church was officially organized by the Presbytery of John Knox on Palm Sunday, March 26, 1961, with ninety-eight charter members. The Rev. Carlton O. Eaton, called as an organizing evangelist in June of 1960, was installed as Pastor of the new congregation on March 11, 1962. A former missionary to China, he had recently graduated from the Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary.

For 4 ½ years, the congregation met in the cafetorium, gym, and hallways of Highland Park Elementary School before the first building, now named Eaton Hall, was completed on the present site in 1965. This building served as sanctuary, as well as fellowship hall, offices, classroom space, and it had a kitchen. Soon two services were conducted. With the leadership of Rev. Eaton, the supporting presence of his wife, Esther, and the work, prayer, and diligence of the members, the young congregation was beginning to thrive. In 1969 a third service on Sunday was added at 8:15 a.m., which for the most part was a contemporary service with a band or numerous other instrumentalists being used.

It was soon necessary to start construction of the Education Building, which was dedicated on Oct. 18, 1970. Later, the patio portion of the building would be enclosed.

The years from 1970 to 1980 were characterized by even more rapid growth and expansion of ministries, not only within Covenant Church, but also including involvement with programs such as Extend-A-Care, Meals-on-Wheels, and the St. John's Clothes Closet, to name a few. The Covenant Cooperative Preschool and many community organizations began using the facilities on a regular basis. The Rev. J Carter King III was installed as the first Associate Pastor on June 21, 1970. By the end of 1970, there were 619 active members.

Following Rev. King's ministry, when he left in 1975 to teach at the Presbyterian Seminary, the Rev. Charles Hendricks was installed as Associate Pastor in 1976. Another Associate Pastor, the Rev. Robert Bullock Jr., was called in 1978. In 1980, the third phase of the building program began, a sanctuary building with added classroom space, a parlor and a choir room. The new sanctuary was dedicated March 22, 1981. Plans were soon underway for the addition of stained glass windows and a pipe organ. The membership was now over 1,000.

At this time Rev. Eaton announced his retirement effective April 29, 1981, after twenty years of ministry. He was beloved by the people he served, especially the children.

The Rev. Hendricks was called to begin a new church in The Woodlands, Texas, where he remains today, and a few months into the interim period, Rev. Bullock was called to a church in Lynchburg, Virginia.

The Rev. R. Richard Baldwin III followed in 1982 as Senior Pastor after Rev. Eaton's retirement. There was more expansion of staff and programs. More educational opportunities and retreat programs were begun. Our neighborhood witness was expanded by providing day care for the very young and the very elderly in the form of Mother's Day Out and Eldercare programs. Commitment to community groups and needy individuals was also increased to include many Austin outreach opportunities. Increased involvement in mission also took place at the state, national and international levels.

In 1983, the bicameral form of government was changed to unicameral, with 24 Session members instead of twelve Session and Diaconate members each. During the next few years, with the economic downturn in Texas, Covenant was finding that it had to be especially cautious and careful with its finances. For example, lawn service was terminated and members now helped mow the grass. The services of two associate pastors were still needed: the Rev. James Boelens served Covenant from 1983 to 1987, and the Rev. Stephen Carl served from 1985 to 1991. In 1986 Rev. Baldwin accepted a call to Evergreen Presbyterian Church in Memphis, Tenn.

The Rev. George Cladis came as our third Senior Pastor in 1987. During the almost 11 years of his ministry, Covenant's budget grew from \$500,000 to \$1.3 million and the membership grew to 1,500. These statistics, however, are not important in themselves, but rather reflect the spiritual growth and development of the congregation. Emphasis was placed on building quality ministries. Many new programs, ministries, and missions were added as expansion took place. Additional parking was added, the patio of the Education Building was filled in for additional teaching space, and the Office Building, now called Covenant Hall, was erected.

In 1991, retired Senior Pastor Carl Eaton was made Pastor Emeritus, a title he held until his death in 1992. His dear wife, Esther, who was a constant and encouraging support to him for so many years, had passed away four years earlier. Associate Pastors serving with Rev. Cladis were the Rev. Anne Ledbetter, 1992-1994; the Rev. Greg Kennedy, 1992-1995; and the Rev. Sel Harris, 1995-1998. The Rev. Tammy Gregory Brown served as associate pastor from 1996 to

2000. Rev. Cladis served until 1998, when he left to pastor Noroton Presbyterian Church in Darien, Conn.

In 1999, the Rev. Dr. James Singleton came to Covenant from Spokane, Wash., as our fourth Senior Pastor. The church continues to thrive with even more programs and an emphasis on mission. By the end of 2000, Covenant's membership reached 1,675, and the year 2000 budget had grown to over \$1.9 million. A fourth Sunday worship service was added, contemporary in format.

The pulse of the church is healthy and the membership continues to thirst for a closer relationship with God through our Lord Jesus. In 2000, the congregation was blessed with the arrival of two Associate Pastors, the Rev. W. Dan Cravy II and the Rev. Lynne Lockwood Hall. The Rev. Dr. Rick Myers joined the staff in 2002 as associate pastor.

That small, inspired, and determined congregation which gave Covenant birth has developed into a body which has made a vast difference in the lives of so many people over the years, not only within our walls, but also more importantly, beyond our walls. We have truly been blessed with the vision of our Charter Members and the inspired leadership of our Pastors through these forty years. For that we are deeply grateful.

Annual Seminar – Austin Genealogical Society Saturday, August 16, 2003



1902 to 2002: What a difference a century makes

The year is 1902, one hundred years ago – what a difference a century makes. Here are the U.S. statistics for 1902:

The average life expectancy in the U.S. was 47. Only 14 percent of the homes in the U.S. had a bathtub. Only 8 percent of the homes had a telephone.

A three-minute call from Denver to New York City cost \$11. There were only 8,000 cars in the U.S. and only 144 miles of paved roads. The maximum speed limit in most cities was 10 mph.

Alabama, Mississippi, Iowa and Tennessee were each more heavily populated than California. With 1.4 million residents, California was only the 21st most populous state in the Union.

The tallest structure in the world was the Eiffel Tower.

The average wage in the U.S. was 22¢ an hour. The average U.S. worker made between \$200 and \$400 per year.

A competent accountant could expect to earn \$2000 per year, a dentist \$2,500 per year, a veterinarian between \$1,500 and \$4,000 per year and a mechanical engineer about \$5,000 per year.

More than 95 percent of all births in the U.S. took place at home. Ninety percent of all U.S. physicians had no college education. Instead, they attended medical schools, many of which were condemned in the press and by the government as substandard.

Sugar cost 4¢ a pound. Eggs were 14¢ a dozen. Coffee cost 15¢ a pound.

Most women washes washed their hair only once a month and used borax or egg yolks for shampoo.

The five leading causes of death in the U.S. were:

1. Pneumonia and influenza
2. Tuberculosis
3. Diarrhea
4. Heart disease
5. Stroke

The American flag had 45 stars. Arizona, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Hawaii and Alaska hadn't been admitted to the Union yet.

The population of Las Vegas, Nevada was 30. Crossword puzzles, canned beer, and iced tea hadn't been invented. There was no Mother's Day or Father's Day.

One in 10 U.S. adults couldn't read or write. Only 6 percent of all Americans had graduated from high school.

Marijuana, heroin and morphine were all available over the counter at corner drugstores. According to one pharmacist, "Heroin clears the complexion, gives buoyancy to the mind, regulates the stomach and the bowels, and is, in fact, a perfect guardian of health."

Eighteen percent of households in the U.S. had at least one full-time servant or domestic.

About 230 murders were reported in the entire U.S.

Just think what it will be like in another 100 years. It boggles the mind.

Christmas memories in Round Rock, Texas, in the 1920s

When I was a child growing up in Round Rock, Texas, the first herald of Christmas was the abundance of fruit in Cousin Harry Stockbridge's store. Cedar boughs had been hung up for decoration.

The odor of apples and oranges mingled with that of cedar in the cold air of the store was the essence of Christmas to me. It still is.

Across the street at Mr. Carlson's store, wooden kegs filled with what looked like strips of oatmeal-colored cardboard appeared out in front. This was imported dried fish for the many Swedish residents of the town. Soaked in lime water for two or three weeks, rinsed thoroughly with water and cooked and served with a creamy sauce, it was lute fisk, a Christmas tradition from the old country.

About this time, my grandmother, Florra Awalt Cole, began to save eggs. During this time of year, hens did not lay as many, and grandmother began to store them away in one of her deep milk crocks.

The eggs were for fresh cocoanut cake, devil's food cake with marshmallow frosting, divinity candy and, of course, eggnog. My grandmother was a teetotaler of strong convictions the rest of the year, but at Christmas-time eggnog was positively sanctified.

In some years, Mama, Mayre Cole Hickman, made her fruitcake earlier in the month. It was a heavy, dark cake loaded with candied and dried fruits and three kinds of nuts. Chopping and mixing the ingredients was a ceremony Mama cherished.

This was during the Depression and money was scarce, but as you can tell, Christmas was a time of imtemperate feasting.

A short time before Christmas, we went out in the cedar breaks nearby and cut down a tree of the right shape and size. It was set up in the parlor of our old rock house. The big room was seldom used and was cold and damp in the winter.

The tree was decorated with old glass ornaments, ropes of tinsel and popcorn and candleholders with real candles, which were lit on Christmas Eve. A fire would be built in the fireplace for two or three days before Christmas to take dampness and chill away.

My brothers, Quinn and Chester, and I each had two or three dollars to spend for Christmas gifts for the family. We did our shopping at the Kress and Woolworth stores in Austin. The adults did their shopping there also. I never saw the inside of the lovely department stores in Austin until I was grown.

We had our Christmas tree on Christmas Eve when all of my great-grandmother's family gathered in our parlor to exchange gifts. Afterwards we went into the dining room, warmed by the kitchen stove, and had grape juice punch, nuts and Christmas ribbon and hard-filled candy.

The children hung up their stockings for Santa and received a special toy or two in or beneath the stocking.

Near Round Rock was the original Swedish settlement Palm Valley, with its beautiful, historic Lutheran church. In its tower was a great bell, cast in Europe, with a marvelous tone. When it was rung, the sound carried over the miles to our house, particularly in the winter.

On Christmas Eve, the special midnight service at the Lutheran church was held – Julota it was called – and the bell was rung. As we lay sleeping, we heard the sound dimly, and we knew that truly Christmas had come.

After breakfast and before the serious preparations for dinner had begun, we had eggnog.

Some of these years were during Prohibition, but bourbon was obtained. The family and one or two neighbors gathered. Brother Will Ross, a dear old Baptist preacher who was also a fine carpenter, always came for a cup. Grandmother's eggnog was just that: eggnog with no milk or cream.

The recipe was simple: Making it was not. For each egg, one tablespoon of bourbon and one tablespoon of sugar. Separate the egg whites and egg yolks. Beat the yolks until they are thick and lemon-colored. Add the bourbon drop by drop as you continue beating. Beat the egg whites until stiff and add the sugar gradually. Fold the whites into the yolk mixture. It will be very thick. Serve in punch cups with a sprinkle of nutmeg on top.

I know that grandmother would be horrified at such heresy, but I like eggnog much better with whipped cream in it – a tablespoon per egg, whipped and folded in after the egg whites.

Christmas dinner was southern traditional: homegrown tom turkey with cornbread dressing, giblet gravy, cranberry sauce, creamed potatoes, candied sweet potatoes, Waldorf salad, English peas in a cream sauce, cornbread and rolls. Fresh cocoanut ambrosia with sliced bananas and oranges was the featured dessert set out on the sideboard in a beautiful pressed glass bowl, flanked by the cocoanut and devil's food cakes on stands.

After dinner, if the weather permitted, the men would play baseball or toss a football around in the big pasture in front of our house.

That night, the family that was left sat around the dinning room table and feasted on leftovers, relaxed and casual. As I remember it, this was the happiest time of the day, with lots of stories and laughter.

Naturally, the days after Christmas were a big letdown. The weather usually became colder and the days were gray. Some toys were already broken and the adults were probably worried about post-holiday bills.

Now, looking back over the years, my memories are only partly happy. I remember all the holidays and the people who were a part of them and are no longer here. Our celebrations were simpler than now and our expectations were not as high. I realize how hard the adults worked to make sure that the children and Grandma – my great-grandmother Louisa Naoma Jane Mayfield Awalt – had a very merry Christmas.

We do that now. The whole Christmas mix of the story of the Christ Child, the carols, the bells and candles, the decorations, the reunions, the gifts, the feasting and the meaningful traditions that each family holds dear create emotions that at time seem too much to bear.

Viennese waltzes are my favorite music, but beneath the gaiety and lilting rhythm is a melancholy sweetness that is always there. Christmas is like that.

An 1899 Country Christmas

Excerpted from *Our Family History: Goodes and Other Ancestors with Memories of our Younger Years*, by James Emmett Goode

The Christmas of 1899, Round Rock had a community Christmas tree and program in a structure of considerable size, called an arbor, which was open at the sides in good weather but could be closed in colder weather. It had a shingle roof and at one end was a low platform, which

provided a stage as a place for a speaker to stand. The structure had been built as a place for church revival meetings.

When the night came for the program, our mother and father with us three boys (editor's note: James, Joe and Wynn) drove into town from our farm.


A large Christmas tree had been set up and decorated. Colored paper festoons hung on the tree, also some of the small presents. There were many candles, small ones, held by little tin holders that clamped to the branches of the tree. The larger presents and some boxes of fruits and nuts and candies sat under the tree and on the platform near it.

Some ladies on the platform sang several songs, someone led the audience in singing Christmas carols and someone made a short talk welcoming everybody. Then it was time for Santa Claus.

While Santa Claus was reading names, someone reached up high in the tree to get a present and moved a branch against a lighted candle. Fire blazed to the top of the tree and looked as if it might set the roof on fire. Some men quickly turned the tree on its side and extinguished the fire. The tree was set up again without the lighted candles and the program continued.

I remember Joe and I got a little bag of mixed candies and some fruit and nuts, but some of the children who lived in town got large toys and there was even a tricycle.

Index to Naturalization Records to 1906 in Travis County, Texas

Recorded by Kay Boyd

This index was entered from a microfilm copy of the WPA Index at the Austin Public Library's Austin History Center. The microfilm is available at Austin History Center and through local LDS Family History Centers. Check the original documents for any discrepancies in the data here. The following statement is part of the microfilm record.

"Complete Index to Naturalization Records of Travis County, prepared by the State Wide Records Project of the WPA, sponsored by the Department of Justice through the Naturalization and Immigration division of the Federal Government. It took several months to compile this record by a staff of workers under the direction of Mr. E.C. Duke, District Supervisor (without cost to Travis County). This is a complete record of naturalization proceedings in the Probate, County and District Court of Travis County; at the time the County was organized, either of the three courts handled naturalization matters. Since 1906, all such matters have been handled by the U.S. District Court. The preparation of this record was in line with a general program over the entire Country, and the copy of the record was given the District Clerk's Office for the cooperation it gave the Staff that worked here on the project.

"Requests for information in regard to Naturalization Records have been numerous recently, due to Social Security Laws, Old Age Assistance Benefits and war conditions requiring the establishment of citizenship. Between 4,000 and 5,000 names are on the Index."



General Information

PURPOSE Austin Genealogical Society was organized in 1960 as a not-for-profit corporation chartered by the State of Texas. Its purposes are to collect and preserve genealogical and historical information about the people of Texas, particularly pertaining to the City of Austin and to Travis and surrounding counties; to instruct and assist members in genealogical research; and to publish public and private records of genealogical interest. In addition, the AGS supports the Genealogical Collection, Texas State Library by donations of books and other genealogical material. Gifts and bequests to AGS are tax-deductible to the full extent permitted by law.

MEMBERSHIP is open to all upon payment of annual dues. Classes: Individual: \$20; Family (two in the same household): \$30; Patron of AGS: \$100; Lifetime: \$500 (\$300 if over age 65). All classes entitle one copy of each issue of the Quarterly and the monthly Newsletter, as well as two pages apiece (a total of four pages for Family or higher whether one or two people submit listings) in the Ancestor Listing issue, the June Quarterly. **After July 1, dues are \$10 for the balance of the year**, but you will receive only the publications produced after the date you join. Membership includes a copy the annual Membership Handbook, which is published each spring.

DUES FOR EXISTING MEMBERS are payable on or before January 1 of each year for the ensuing year. If dues are not received by February 1, the name must be dropped from the mailing list. If membership is reinstated later, and Quarterlies and Newsletters have to be mailed individually, postage must be charged. (Back Quarterlies are supplied only if available – very few extras are printed). Send dues payments to **AGS Treasurer, P.O. Box 1507, Austin TX 78767-1507**.

MEETINGS of the general membership begin at 7:30 p.m. on the fourth Tuesday of each month except August and December. Members are encouraged to come as early as 6:30 to socialize with each other. Meeting Place: **Highland Park Baptist Church, 5206 Balcones Dr.** Take Northland (RR 2222) exit off Loop1 (Mopac). Go west one block to Balcones Dr., then left 1-½ blocks. The church and parking lot are on right. Visitors are always welcome. The Board of Directors meets at 6:15 in a separate room.

BOOK REVIEW POLICY Books on subjects of interest to genealogists will be reviewed, but cannot be reviewed in AGS Quarterly on the basis of advertising alone. Review copies received by the Quarterly Editor at 3310 Hancock Dr., Austin, Texas 78731, by the first of February, May, August or October will be reviewed in the next Quarterly, space permitting. Review books are donated to the Texas State Library's Genealogy Collection.

CHECK RETURN POLICY Members and other payees must pay AGS the cost of any returned check (currently \$5) over and above the charge their bank may impose.

AGS QUARTERLY is issued about the middle of March, June, September and November. Contributions are welcome, subject to editing for style and length. Contributor is completely responsible for accuracy and any copyright infringement. AGS assumes no responsibility for content of submitted material. See inside front cover for address.

ANCESTOR LISTING PAGES for the June issue of Quarterly must reach the Editor at 3310 Hancock Dr., Austin, Texas 78731, by **May 10**. They must be **BLACK** and **LEGIBLE**, whether typed, hand-written, computer-printed or in superior calligraphy. Months must be **SPELLED** or abbreviated, not in figures. **DATES SHOULD BE SHOWN** in accepted genealogical style, that is, **DAY, MONTH, COMPLETE YEAR**. Leave 1-inch margins at both sides and at top and bottom. Carefully check horizontal pages (reading in the 11-inch direction). Otherwise, the Editor has to position some pages upside down to prevent loss of data in the stapling-punching process. **NO 8½ x 14 sheets, please.** You may submit lineage or family group charts, ahnentafels, narratives, cemetery inscriptions, Bible records, census data, queries, or a combination of material, just so it is not under copyright. **BE SURE** to proofread your material for accuracy and clarity so we will not publish faulty or incorrect data. Put name and address of submitter **on each page** in legible form (not blind embossed). Consult a recent June Quarterly for suggestions. Remember that reproductions are dimmer than originals so try to provide good quality originals.

Remember, individual membership secures two facing pages, and family or higher membership allows you four pages.
