Denning/Robinson

Seeking information on **John Ward Denning Jr** b. 8 Oct. 1853, Eufaula, AL, and **Maggie Robinson**, b. 11 Aug. 1855 in Texas, possibly Stockdale. John d. 23 May, 1836 in Riveria, Texas (Editor: could be Riviera, Texas or Refugio, pronounced "Ree-fear-ihuh;" inquirer notes it may be misspelled). Maggie d. 3 July, 1890 in Stockdale. Their first child, **Harold Albert Denning**, was b. 18 May, 1886 in Stockdale, Texas. John moved to Texas between 1869 and 1886. Any help would be greatly appreciated.

Walker/James

William Walker, a stonecutter, was my great-great-grandfather, and lived north of the Texas State Capitol between 1887 and 1890, when he d. at the home of his son-in-law, **Will James**, according to Austin directories. Will boarded with his father-in-law, Mr. Walker in 1889 and 1890. Will was an expressman. What were the names of his wife and children? **Jesse Walker** also boarded with Mr. Walker; he was a laborer, 1887-1890; was he married at this time? In 1891-1892, Jesse Walker, plumber, worked at Grooms Hardware, lived 3 miles south of Austin with a **D. Penington** (an evangelist who probably had a daughter named Nola), but boarded at the Capitol Hotel; is this the same Jesse Walker? **Thomas Walker** resided on the north side of W. 11th near the Missouri-Pacific Railroad 1887-88; is he related to the other above-named Walkers, and, if so, where was he born and what were the names of others in his household?

Smith/Ray/Clear

Sometime this year I intend to print a genealogy which includes **Elizabeth Clear Smith** so my time is running out to find more data about her and her descendants. **John M. Smith** m. Elizabeth Clear, Putnam County, Missouri, 25 March, 1864. Her parents were **Jacob Clear** and **Margaret Davis Clear** and she was b. 1843 in Allen County, Indiana (Jacob was originally **Jacob Hell**, which name originated in Pennsylvania, but changed to Clear sometime after 1840). John M. Smith was b. 1844 in Illinois and his family appears in the 1880 Federal Census for Blanco County, Texas, but probably d. after 1884, when the youngest child was b. The 9 children were: **Henry E.**, b. 1865, Missouri; **Jemima C.**, b. 1867? Missouri; **Nancy A.**, b. 1869? Missouri; **Thomas C. (or E.)**, b. 1873? Missouri; **Margaret E.**, b. 1875, Texas; **Martha E.**, b. 1876, Texas; **John N.**, b. 1878, Texas; **Colvin**, b. Feb. 1881, Texas; **Susie**, b. April 1884, Texas. Susie Smith m. **Dan Ray**, Travis Co., Texas 4 August 1901, with brother Henry as witness as she was 17 y/o. I have the original certificate, given to me by a Travis County Clerk, and I would like to give it to a proven Ray descendant; it is beautiful. Various of the other children lived in the general area of Austin, including Williamson County, but the John M. Smith family is not listed in census after 1890. The 1900 census lists an Elizabeth Smith living with son-in-law **Uria C. Radar** and wife Maggie near Taylor. Although the age and place of birth do not perfectly match, they are close. Could this Maggie be the Smith's daughter Margaret? They had two children, **Frank M.** and **Mattie E.**, b. 1897 and 1899 respectively. More information will be found in the vertical file at the Texas State Library.

The act to provide for the Registration of Births was implemented May 3, 1873, by the legislature and repealed August 21, 1876. It stated "that it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerks of the District Court of this State to make and keep in their offices a register of all persons born in their respective counties." These record books were found in 25 counties, Travis being one of those. As a bonus a family would often record the birth dates of their previous children at the same time. The color of the parents was not recorded as it was not consistently noted. Most of the maiden names came from separate research and not from the birth registrations.

History and Background

The Convict Record Ledgers and their indexes represent an important resource to researchers. Available for on-site, as well as remote use, these records are both tedious to search and rich with information.

The Texas Department of Criminal Justice and its predecessor agencies have maintained ledgers to record personal data and incarceration information about convicts entering the Texas prison system. The prison system included Huntsville Penitentiary, which opened in 1849, and Rusk Penitentiary, which operated from 1883 to 1891.

The Texas State Library and Archives Commission holds 29 ledgers covering the years 1849-1954, with 10 indexes for the period 1849-1970. The original documents are extremely fragile and access is restricted to high-quality microfilmed copies.

Microfilming of the Convict Record Ledgers and their indexes was made possible by a generous donation from the Friends of Libraries and Archives of Texas.

Types of Information

The record ledgers are excellent sources of individual convict descriptions and information regarding their incarceration. Ledgers dating from 1849 to 1891, may provide some or all of the following elements:

convict's number	Convict's name/aliases	age

Researchers may benefit from reviewing listings of the more common abbreviations used in the ledgers, as well as listings of occupations and offenses. These listings are provided at the end of this document.

Getting Started

Begin the process by determining the specific names and time periods you wish to search. Accessing the entry for an individual is a two-part process. First, check the Indexes to locate the convict's number. Then use that number to find the corresponding entry in the Convict Record Ledgers.

Using the Indexes

The entries in the indexes provide the convict's name, county of conviction, year of entry, and assigned convict number. Later indexes may provide information such as ethnicity or gender.

The indexes contain entries from 1849 to 1970. There is considerable overlap of dates and entries between the individual indexes, especially those that cover the years 1849-1915. When researching convicts in the system prior to 1882, it is necessary to check three separate indexes.

Entries in the indexes are arranged alphabetically by the first letter and first vowel of the last name, then in chronological order by year of entry. Separate pages are designated for each letter pair, for example,

Smith or Simmons	would be found on the S-I pages
Bryant or Blythe	would be found on B-Y pages
Edmonds or Eronson	would be found on the E-O pages

If the allotted space for a letter pair became full, the name list would be continued at the end of the pages for the preceding or following letter pairs. Listings for the J-O pages, for example, might be continued at the end of the J-I or J-O pages. This is usually noted at the bottom of the page.

Due to the use of aliases and nicknames, prisoners may not be listed under their real names. For instance, a prisoner whose given name was Joseph Fairchild may have gone exclusively by "Big Joe" and so would be indexed under that name. "Big Joe" might be listed in the B-I pages or as "Joe, Big" in the J-O pages. Because of this, it is important to thoroughly explore various forms of names.

The convict numbers are listed in the columns labeled "H" and "R" for Huntsville and Rusk. convicts may have had more than one number assigned to them and may have been held at both institutions, depending on the number of times they were incarcerated.

Once you have located the convict number and year of incarceration, you are ready to search the Ledgers for the corresponding entry.

Using the Ledgers

Entries in the record ledgers are arranged numerically by the convict number, which was assigned sequentially as the inmates were received. However, three different numbering sequences were used in the convict ledgers held by TSLAC. Care must be taken to determine which sequence was used in order to choose the correct ledger.

Rusk numbers range from 1 to 4,622. Although Rusk Penitentiary was open only from 1883 to 1891, there are some Rusk numbers that appear to date from 1870. These earlier numbers may represent convicts who were first incarcerated in Huntsville and later transferred to Rusk. Ledger 1998/038-148

contains information about prisoners incarcerated at Rusk. Any number larger than 4,622 will be a Huntsville number.

Two different numbering sequences were used at Huntsville: series A and B. The A series began in 1849 with convict number 1; it was discontinued in 1882 with number 10,012. The B series began in 1882 and re-numbered the A series convicts 10,001 through 10,012 as B series numbers 1 through 12. The year of incarceration, along with the convict number, will allow you to determine whether the number is from the A or B series.

The ledger volume and the corresponding microfilm reel number, can be determined using the table below:

Borrowing the Microfilm

Once you've determined which reels of microfilm contain the volumes you wish to view, contact your local library to arrange an interlibrary loan. When requesting film, provide your library with the specific

reel numbers you wish to borrow, as well as the OCLC number. This specialized number, OCLC #49380030, will help your library identify the microfilm series. Up to six reels may be borrowed at a time. Specific regulations for interlibrary loan vary by individual library, so please contact your local library for details.

In Austin, you may also view the microfilm in the Genealogy Collection of the Texas State Library and Archives Commission, located just east of the Capitol at 1201 Brazos Street. The Genealogy Collection is open Tuesday through Saturday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., but closed on Sundays, Mondays and federal holidays.

Legibility Issues

Entries in the ledgers and indexes are handwritten, in a variety of inks and styles, some of which may be difficult to read. Shadows and fading of ink, as well as the physical condition of the items, make some entries nearly illegible.

There is a great deal of duplication between the first three indexes, so if an entry is illegible, it may be possible to obtain the information by checking another of the earliest indexes.

If it is impossible to read an entry on the microfilm, please contact TSLAC for further assistance. It may be possible for Archives staff to read the entry from the original ledgers. You may e-mail your request, along with the reel and page number, to archinfo@tsl.state.tx.us or write to the Texas State Archives at PO Box 12927, Austin, Texas 78711-2927.

Additional Resources

TSLAC also has Conduct Registers for the period 1855 through about 1976. Although entries were not made for each convict, unique information found in the registers includes the prison unit where the individual is assigned (Huntsville, prison farm, railroad camp, etc.) and any notable punishments. Entries began in 1855 with convict number 207.

In Austin, you may view the 60 original Conduct Registers at the Texas State Archives, located just east of the Capitol at 1201 Brazos Street. The Archives is open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., but closed on Saturdays, Sundays, and most federal holidays. The conduct registers have not been microfilmed nor are they available for use in the Genealogy Collection.

You are also welcome to e-mail your request for a search of the conduct registers, along with the specific convict number and year of incarceration, to archinfo@tsl.state.tx.us or write to the Texas State Archives at PO Box 12927, Austin, Texas 78711-2927.

Genealogy Detective

Excerpted from *Dalton Gang Letter*, Oct. 30, 2002 issue

From Leslie Crunk:

- Try a totally off-the-wall spelling. I was looking for Scherer, finally found as Shar.
- Also, don't rely 100 percent on an index. I've found two families in two different census years by actually looking at the census even though the family was NOT listed in any index I could find for those years.
- Also, try state census records – not federal. Some states have some really odd years they took census just for their state. NY for instance has some in 1845, 1855, 1865, etc. Alabama has some for 1855 and 1866 and Florida has similar odd years they did. Check the state or county you are looking in to see if any odd years were done.
- I have this one line I am researching by the name of Alsobrook. This name is found spelled twenty different ways: Alsobrooks, Alsabrook/s, Alsibrook/s, Asabrook/s, Alseybrook/s, even Allsa Brooks (two separate words!!). Well, I couldn't find the guy I was looking for. I had found him in 1850, 1855, 1860, 1866, 1880, 1900 and 1910, but where, oh where was he in 1870???? So I ordered the 1870 CD for Alabama/Florida census. When I got it I did a search for any name "containing" the word "Brook" since most people at least spelled that part of the name correctly. And just how was it spelled when I found him? Osobrooks!!!

From Sandy Kiger:

- How about also checking tax records, school enumeration records, city directories, county histories, church records, military records, court documents, newspaper articles, etc., for that elusive ancestor?
- The dates are unclear as to what period of time Lady Liz's ancestor is missing, but I would probably start searching property and personal tax records. They are the only way that I was able to locate ancestors in early Virginia when most all census records were lost.

From Leigh Smith:

- As to finding the non-existent ancestor on the census: I had an 1850 county census which I had literally read and reread looking for a Jones ancestor. Sometime later I finally discovered them, in the same book under the name Johnson.
- My suggestion is to scan all entries on the census beginning with D looking for Dalton – any way the name could have possibly been misspelled.

From James F. Klumpp

- Indexing is flawed. The accelerated indexes are particularly error-prone. So, don't stop when you cannot find it in the index. I look ten years earlier or ten years later, find four or five names next door to my ancestor and look those names up in the indexes of the census I am targeting. Then I look within 2 or 3 pages of those names for my unindexed ancestor.
- Spelling was not standardized. Shall it be Dalton, Dolton, or Daulton? Even in the case where our ancestors were literate neither they nor the census taker particularly thought in terms of constant spelling. It was an oral culture. This problem is partially addressed by doing your own Soundex. Look in one of the censuses that use Soundex (1880, 1900-30) and note different spellings recorded there under D435 (if Dalton is your target). Then look those names up in the relevant index.
- Your ancestors talked with rocks in their mouths. Information was provided orally to census takers. Sometimes, with those accents, names came out sounding funny. Teeth were lost, remember? Although soundex was designed to catch these, even it didn't always work. For

example, how did Daltons get recorded as Dortons? We have found that many of them did. Only practice will find these. I don't think we would have started looking for Dortons until we stumbled on to the first ones.

- There's a reason your census taker never became county clerk. Handwriting was often horrible. Think of ways handwriting could have confused an indexer. For example, Daltons are often found under Datton or Dotton. I usually go to the neighborhood where I think the relative is, studying the handwriting there, and figure out where the errors might be. Common confusions are a,d; l,t,i; a,o; F,T; c,o; m,n,u,i,l; e,i,u; h,n; i,j; q,g,y; u,v,w; S,L; K,R,P; M,N; U,V,W. Someone can work on a "handex" that does the same work as the Soundex for handwriting rather than sound. But not me.
- Your ancestors hired out. Especially on the frontier, our ancestors tended to live in the homes of others in their teens and twenties. Sometimes it was relatives, sometimes they hired out as maids, hands, or whatever. In other cases, one family would live with another. Older parents lived with sons (same surname?) or daughters (normally different surname). My great-grandfather traveled from MO to IL to help out on a farm in his early 20s. Three families were living in the cabin of one of my ancestors during their first census on the Kansas frontier. Some indexes only index heads of households. Before 1850 the "other" families and individuals will be totally obscured.
- Your census taker was lazy. Arrgh! It is easy to see that some cared about accuracy more than others. One of my irritants is the ones that only use initials -- page after page of surname and initials. With birthplace as U.S. Since the missing is information never recorded, it cannot be recovered.
- Given names morphed. There are, of course, nicknames. Marys and Pollys; Elizabeths and Betsys and Bettys and Lizzes and Lizzies and Beths and Elizas et al; Bobs and Roberts; and so forth. Nicknames are sometimes hardly recognizable. Saranigh Pickeral is in at least one census as Raney, in other places as Sara, and in many indexes as Luvania. And younger children named after Dad may have started life as Buddy or Junior or some other denotation and changed their name when father had passed on. Given names were sometimes unusual too. My most beautifully named ancestor is Leovica. You would not believe some of the ways the name is spelled in censuses. Foreign naming patterns were also a problem. I had a German relative named Johann (his given name) who was recorded by the French as Jean and in English, of course, as John. And, of course, there is the problem of baptismal names. Whole families of Germans used Johann for every child with the middle name used to address them. These changes may have occurred from census to census.
- Your ancestors lied. I love those who age six years every 10. Don't you?
- Your ancestor didn't trust the gov'mint. It is clear that in some households they would tell the census taker everything to make their official family record as accurate as possible; and in other families they would respond only to questions asked. If a child was at a neighboring farm, they are not in the census. If the census taker guessed the age of child rather than asking, that was OK with them. And many didn't bother to track down a census taker that they may have missed because they were in town.

From the Texas State Gazette

Awful Tragedy – July 12, 1851

Never has it fallen on our lot as public journalist, to record so heart rendering a tragedy as occurred a mile from this city on yesterday, the 11th which resulted in the instant death of Mrs. Matilda Baker and the mortally wounding of her husband William Baker. The circumstances are these – a negro rode up to Mrs. Baker's about sunrise and inquired the way to a neighbor's house, and was invited by Mr. B. to alight until the family were done breakfast to which they were about to sit down and the negro did so.

About this time Col. E.S.C. Robertson rode up and upon examination found the negro was a runaway and he and Mr. Baker tied and place him in the house. Col. R. then left; soon after which Mr. Baker met the negro at the door, he having cut himself loose with a butcher knife which he held in his hand. On Mr. Baker's attempting to retie the negro the latter grappled with and commenced stabbing him. Mrs. Baker seeing her husband in this perilous situation, ran to his relief when the negro stabbed her, the knife entering just above the left nipple severing the arteries of the axillary producing hemorrhaging and almost instant death; and after stabbing Mr. Baker four times thrice in the back near the spine and once in the side the negro got on his horse and fled. No one was present during this horrid tragedy except five little children whose screams soon assembled some of the neighbors. Medical aid was soon summoned to Mr. Baker, but there is not the most distant hope of recovery. A large number of our citizens immediately armed themselves and went in pursuit of the murderer but at our last accounts from the scene of the murder he had not been arrested.

Mr. Baker since he has been among us has shown himself an industrious, worthy citizen and Mrs. B. was highly esteemed as an intelligent exemplary wife and mother and this tragic event makes orphans of six children, the eldest of whom is scarcely grown.

August 12, 1851

The runaway negro who murdered Mr. and Mrs. William Baker, in this vicinity on the 11th ult. was apprehended near the city on the morning of the 26th ult. He was tried on the same day by a jury of twelve slaveholders, and his guilt being apparent and unquestionable, he was executed in the presence of a large concourse of spectators.

Friendship Across the Years: The Story of a Fitzhugh Baptist Church Quilt

In early 2001, my mother, Jonnie Ross Moehring of Fort Worth, Texas, showed me a quilt given to her grandfather when she was a child. Each square of the quilt was decorated with a colorful airplane and an embroidered name. One square includes a date: Dec. 2, 1935.

"I know that one of the churches where Daddy Ross preached gave him this friendship quilt," Mother told me. "But I have no idea which church it was."

My mother and her cousin Charles Ross Roberts recall that in the 1930s the Rev. William H. Ross, a Round Rock resident, preached at a circuit of Baptist churches in Central Texas. They recall that he rotated among the Baptist churches at Blockhouse and New Hope in Williamson County, Dripping Springs in Hays County and Fitzhugh in far western Travis County.

A few days after I mailed letters to the churches listing the quilters' names and telling a few details about my great-grandfather's work as a circuit-riding preacher, I received a letter from the church secretary at Fitzhugh Baptist Church. Her great-aunt was the friendship quilt's only survivor – 84-year-old Mada Myers Prather.

"Brother Ross used to love to sit on our long front porch and study," Mada Myers Prather told me. Her uncle often met Rev. Ross in Austin and brought him to the Fitzhugh community to preach. She recalls that the church gave the quilt to him before her marriage in 1936.

Mrs. Prather and I met in May at the Dripping Springs senior center where she quilts every Wednesday. Rev. Ross' friendship quilt could have been a family tree for her friends and relatives at the senior center.

Lester Crumley, 77, who remembers Rev. Ross coming to his Hudson Bend church in the 1930s, said this about his relationship to Mada Myers Prather: "My grandma and her mother were sisters, so that makes us something." Both women helped make the quilt.

Lorinda Reimers Preslar, Mada's grand-niece, manages the Dripping Springs senior center. Two of Lorinda's great-grandmothers and one of her grandmothers also helped make the quilt.

A sister, a sister-in-law, an aunt by marriage, a mother – Mada Myers Prather's relatives are all over this friendship quilt. She touched one name on the quilt and talked quietly about a girlhood friend. "She's gone now," Mada said.

I left the quilt with Mada Myers Prather and drove to Fitzhugh Baptist Church on my way back to Austin. A walk through the old cemetery is like reading the friendship quilt – Crumley, Reimers, Myers, Puryear, Bonham, Roach. Mabel Lillie Crumley died in 1982, Lillie Crumley in 1981, Lillie Myers in 1972, Nellie Gibson in 1961, Ella Roach in 1981.

William H. Ross was born in West Virginia in 1865 and came to Texas with a wagon train in 1872 when he was 14.

Rev. Ross was 71 years old when 20-year-old Mada Myers and her friends and family from Fitzhugh Baptist Church near Austin gave him the friendship quilt in 1936. He died in 1943 at the age of 78 and is buried beside his wife, Ada Harris Ross, in the Old Round Rock Cemetery.

Central Christian Church, Austin, Texas

Beginning in 1847, Central Christian Church of Austin grew slowly for several decades. The congregation, after the Civil War, was meeting in a log house on Congress Avenue between Fourth and Fifth streets. In 1867 a frame building was erected at Eighth and Colorado Streets and was used as a meeting place for the next five years.

A two-story house with a basement for a Sunday school replaced the other building in 1872 as church membership increased. This facility was replaced by a two-story building in 1898 during the ministry of J.W. Lowber (1897-1908).

Elder W.H.D. Carrington preached each Sunday morning to approximately 100 worshippers. During Carrington's later ministry in the 1870s, the congregation divided into two "embittered factions." Carrington rebuked the two groups as having about as much love for each other as "the Jews had for the Samaritans in older times." Within a short time, church attendance declined to a very small number.

In 1879, W.E. Hall, a very capable and personable minister, began a five-year ministry. He constrained the people to live good, righteous lives, to refrain from drinking, gambling, dancing and theater attendance. His evening sermons had much appeal for the young people. Youth from other Austin churches were attracted to his popular and eloquently delivered sermons.

Although the minister was relatively progressive, he did remove a "divisive organ" from the church, which had been placed in the Sunday school while he was on vacation in 1882. Minister Hall did attend "Cinderella," a fund-raising social, for which he received criticism from some of the older, more conservative members of the church.

A few members complained that Hall's \$2,500 year salary was excessive. Addison Clark, while conducting a 12-day meeting in July 1883, was unable to reconcile Hall and dissatisfied members of the congregation, after which Hall left the Austin ministry.

Although membership declined during the next two or three years, a significant event took place in this church as delegates from across the state met and formed the Texas Christian Missionary Society. The formation of this society and introduction of the organ into church worship caused the separation of the church into two groups. One of the older women who objected to worshipping with instrumental music remarked: "Now that you have the organ, where are you going to get a monkey to dance to the music?" The group that withdrew eventually became the University Avenue Church of Christ, and the old church became Central Christian Church.

In 1929 Central Christian Church erected a new building at the intersection of 12th and Guadalupe streets. The building, an example of fourth century Italian architecture, was designed by Robert Leon White, chairman of the Department of Architecture at the University of Texas and also a member of the church. The chief designer on this project was Samuel Charles Phelps Vosper. The stones from the church at Eighth and Colorado were bought by St. Elias Eastern Orthodox Church for their new building on Eleventh Street two blocks east of the Texas State Capitol. The United States Federal Court House was built at the Eighth and Colorado site.

The church in 1980 had a membership of about 600. Earlier, before the University Christian Church was begun, the church had as many as 1,200 members.

Embre Warren Smith

Embre Warren Smith was born in Brunswick County Virginia, on Sept. 16, 1830. When he was just a young boy, he immigrated to Mississippi. Embre Warren Smith and Malinda Adela Harkins were united in holy matrimony on Dec. 18, 1851.

The union was blessed with four children. They were Ann Catherine Smith, born in October 1852, John William Smith, born March 4, 1855, Charles David Smith, born Jan. 8, 1858, and Margaret Adelia Smith, born Feb. 5, 1850. A cloud hung over the family when the baby girl Margaret died on June 5, 1860.

In 1860, on April 16, Adelia Smith died at the age of 24.

Then in April 1851, E.W. Smith met with fellow citizens at the Lafayette Courthouse to form a regiment. They decided to call this the McClung Riflement. The purpose was to render help to the Confederate states. In May 1861, E.W. Smith bid his children good-bye and left with his regiment for Virginia. He was given charge of keeping an account of the movements of the regiment and the supplies issued. In the first records, he was just an ensign. As early as July 4, 1861, he was a first sergeant. He was taken prisoner at the fall of Fort Anderson and was sent to Lookout Point Prison. Here he was kept in close confinement until the surrender.

E. W. Smith married Sarah L. Bowen, a widow, on Dec. 16, 1869. They settled near the present day community of Dessau, Texas. It is located about 12 miles north of Austin.

This union was blessed with three sons: Robert Lee Smith, Edgar Smith and Owen Smith.

Embre Warren Smith was elected to represent the rural people of Travis County in the 20th Texas Legislature. At the regular session beginning January 1887 and closing as a special session in May 1888, he is said to have been in regular attendance. At this time the Texas Legislature thought mainly of the good of the agricultural people.

Smith was a Democrat of the Jefferson school. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Round Rock. E.W. Smith was also a member of the Order of Patrons of Husbandry and president of the Merriltown Grange. He was elected to the Board of Directors of the Texas Co-operative Association in 1833. He was made president in 1884 and held this office until his death. He was also elected to the Executive Committee of the Texas Chapter of the Grange.

He led a full and wonderful life. Though many times touched by tragedy, it was blessing to all who came in contact with him. On Dec. 24, 1888, he died at his residence in Travis County.

Index to Naturalization Records to 1906 in Travis County, Texas

This index continues from the November 2002 issue, which ran names Juan Aballos through Alfred Boles. Between 4,000 and 5,000 names are on this index, which was entered from a microfilm copy of the WPA Index at the Austin Public Library's Austin History Center. The microfilm is available at Austin History Center and through local LDS Family History Centers. Check the original documents for any discrepancies in the data here. The following statement is part of the microfilm record.

"Complete Index to Naturalization Records of Travis County, prepared by the State Wide Records Project of the WPA, sponsored by the Department of Justice through the Naturalization and Immigration division of the Federal Government. It took several months to compile this record by a staff of workers under the direction of Mr. E.C. Duke, District Supervisor (without cost to Travis County). This is a complete record of naturalization proceedings in the Probate, County and District Court of Travis County; at the time the County was organized, either of the three courts handled naturalization matters. Since 1906, all such matters have been handled by the U.S. District Court. The preparation of this record was in line with a general program over the entire Country, and the copy of the record was given the District Clerk's Office for the cooperation it gave the Staff that worked here on the project.

"Requests for information in regard to Naturalization Records have been numerous recently, due to Social Security Laws, Old Age Assistance Benefits and war conditions requiring the establishment of citizenship."

The Austin Genealogical Society

General Information

PURPOSE Austin Genealogical Society was organized in 1960 as a not-for-profit corporation chartered by the State of Texas. Its purposes are to collect and preserve genealogical and historical information about the people of Texas, particularly pertaining to the City of Austin and to Travis and surrounding counties; to instruct and assist members in genealogical research; and to publish public and private records of genealogical interest. In addition, the AGS supports the Genealogical Collection, Texas State Library by donations of books and other genealogical material. Gifts and bequests to AGS are tax-deductible to the full extent permitted by law.

MEMBERSHIP is open to all upon payment of annual dues. Classes: Individual: \$20; Family (two in the same household): \$30; Patron of AGS: \$100; Lifetime: \$500 (\$300 if over age 65). All classes entitle one copy of each issue of the Quarterly and the monthly Newsletter, as well as two pages apiece (a total of four pages for Family or higher whether one or two people submit listings) in the Ancestor Listing issue, the June Quarterly. **After July 1, dues are \$10 for the balance of the year**, but you will receive only the publications produced after the date you join. Membership includes a copy the annual Membership Handbook, which is published each spring.

DUES FOR EXISTING MEMBERS are payable on or before January 1 of each year for the ensuing year. If dues are not received by February 1, the name must be dropped from the mailing list. If membership is reinstated later and Quarterlies and Newsletters have to be mailed individually, postage must be charged. (Back Quarterlies are supplied only if available – very few extras are printed). Send dues payments to **AGS Treasurer, P.O. Box 1507, Austin Texas 78767-1507**.

MEETINGS of the general membership begin at 7:30 p.m. on the fourth Tuesday of each month except August and December. Members are encouraged to come as early as 6:30 to socialize with each other. Meeting Place: **Highland Park Baptist Church, 5206 Balcones Dr.** Take Northland (RR 2222) exit off Loop1 (Mopac). Go west one block to Balcones Dr., then left 1½ blocks. The church and parking lot are on right. Visitors are always welcome. The Board of Directors meets at 6:15 in a separate room.

BOOK REVIEW POLICY Books on subjects of interest to genealogists will be reviewed, but cannot be reviewed in AGS Quarterly on the basis of advertising alone. Review copies received by the Quarterly Editor at 3310 Hancock Dr., Austin, Texas 78731, by the first of February, May, August or October will be reviewed in the next Quarterly, space permitting. Review books are donated to the Texas State Library's Genealogy Collection.

CHECK RETURN POLICY Members and other payees must pay AGS the cost of any returned check (currently \$5) over and above the charge their bank may impose.

AGS QUARTERLY is issued about the middle of March, June, September and November. Contributions are welcome, subject to editing for style and length. Contributor is completely responsible for accuracy and any copyright infringement. AGS assumes no responsibility for content of submitted material. See inside front cover for address.

ANCESTOR LISTING PAGES for the June issue of Quarterly must reach the Editor at 3310 Hancock Dr., Austin, Texas 78731, or alanasuzy@earthlink.net by **May 10**. They must be **BLACK** and **LEGIBLE**, whether typed, hand-written, computer-printed or in superior calligraphy. Months must be **SPELLED** or abbreviated, not in figures. **DATES SHOULD BE SHOWN** in accepted genealogical style, that is, **DAY, MONTH, COMPLETE YEAR**. Leave 1-inch margins at both sides and at top and bottom. Carefully check horizontal pages (reading in the 11-inch direction). Otherwise, the Editor has to position some pages upside down to prevent loss of data in the stapling-punching process. **NO 8½ x 14 sheets**, please. You may submit lineage or family group charts, ahnentafels, narratives, cemetery inscriptions, Bible records, census data, queries, or a combination of material, just so it is not under copyright. **BE SURE** to proofread your material for accuracy and clarity so we will not publish faulty or incorrect data. Consult a recent June AGS Quarterly for suggestions. Remember that reproductions are dimmer than originals so try to provide good quality originals.

Remember, individual membership secures two facing pages, and family or higher membership allows you four pages.
