# Austin Genealogical Meeting Tuesday, October 22, 2013

The October speaker will be Caroline Frick. She is the founder and Executive Director of the Texas Archive of the Moving Image as well as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Radio-TV-Film at the University of Texas at Austin. She will be providing an overview of the organizational mission of TAMI, their library collection, and free digitization opportunities. TAMI's video library is available at: www.texasarchive.org

Prior to her work in Texas, Dr. Frick worked in film preservation at Warner Bros., the Library of Congress, and the National Archives in Washington, D.C.

Dr. Frick also programmed films for the American Movie Classics cable channel in New York and currently serves as the President of the Board for the Association of Moving Image Archivists. Her book, "Saving Cinema," was published in 2011 by Oxford University Press. She has published in a variety of journals including the International Journal of Heritage Studies, The Moving Image, The Historical Journal of Film, Radio and Television, and The Journal of Popular Film and Video.

Texas Archive of the Moving Image (TAMI) is an independent 501c3 organization dedicated to the preservation of Texas film heritage. Every year, home movies, television programs, and locally produced films are lost as these visual records of Texas rapidly decompose or are simply thrown away. TAMI works to discover these "orphan" films, to make them available in our online library at www.texasarchive.org, and to educate the public about moving image history and contemporary preservation practice.


