Program: Preserving Your Family's Documents and Photographs **Presented by:** Claudia Wilson Anderson

In her talk, "Preserving Your Family's Documents and Photographs," Claudia Wilson ANDERSON will discuss the preservation of letters, certificates, and photos. She will describe the best environment for historical materials and will talk about appropriate archival housings and conservation methods. Claudia will

also provide information on vendors who sell products used in archives to help preserve valuable correspondence, pictures, and photographic negatives.



Claudia Wilson ANDERSON, Supervisory Archivist at the Lyndon Baines Johnson Library and Museum, joined the staff of the LBJ Library and Museum 43 years ago in March 1969, shortly after completing a B.A. in Government at the University of Texas at Aus-

tin. In June 2004, she became the Supervisory Archivist. During her years at the Johnson Library, she has worked with President Johnson's pre-presidential papers, White House papers dealing with domestic policy, and Mrs. Johnson's papers. Claudia has a particular in-

terest in collections dealing with the political tensions between Congress and the White House. She, together with Regina GREENWELL, served as co-leader of the team of archivists processing the recordings of President Johnson's telephone conversations.

Membership access will be available soon after this issue is resolved and after the Board has completed its review and comment.

AGS Member Survey

- 92% of respondents said their primary reason for doing genealogy is to preserve their family history
- 34% said they want to give back to the genealogy community through volunteering
